

DESCRIPTION OF A MENTEE

WHAT DOES A MENTEE DO?

Mentees are willing to accept guidance and support from a mentor and are willing to participate, commit to attending all scheduled meetings and work with their mentor through the duration of the program. Mentees take responsibility for their own growth and development by creating personal goals with their mentors. Mentees are open to coaching and feedback from their mentors. If a mentee is under 18 years of age, they must have the support and commitment of their parents or legal guardian.

WHO CAN APPLY TO BE A MENTEE?

Anyone can apply to be a mentee if they are 18 years or older. You must have a desire to learn from others and create a network of positive role models. These mentees are individuals who want to better themselves, and learn more about the path God wants for them to walk.

POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OR BARRIERS TO PARTICIPATION

Applying for acceptance into the program is strongly discouraged if transportation, employment in or outside the home, and/or extracurricular activities will prevent the mentee from meeting participation requirements. Mentees are **expected** to meet all scheduled commitments with their mentor or notify their mentor in advance to reschedule.
