

The Knight pictured is not supposed to be me (except for the rabbit), but rather an ancestor who has always fascinated me. Tudor Trevor (or Trefor, d. 948 AD) is who, according to legend, all Tudors are descended from. Not much known about him, but he was a real knight in armor...and King of Wales, Earl of Whittington, and Lord of



the March. His grandfather, Lluddocca ap Caradoc Vreichfras, (don't ask me to

pronounce it) the Earl of Hereford, was a member of King Arthur's Round Table. (ref. Thomas Pennant, The Fifteen Tribes of Northern Wales, 1798.)
