- Our sub-committee met the 2nd Wednesday of June 12, 2019 @ 7:00 PM, 1st Presbyterian Church, 142 Stage Road, Monroe NY (Clean & Crazy location). Our next meeting is scheduled for July 17, 2019 at "CoLAB Goshen" 45 St. John Street Goshen, NY at 7pm. We will now be meeting the 3rd Wednesday of every month at this new location.
- b. Presentations: We had an information booth at the Great American Weekend in Goshen, NY, on July 6th and 7th. Four members of the subcommittee attended and staffed the booth for the 2 days. It was a very successful event. Members of the committee gave information about Narcotics Anonymous to members of the public including health professionals, family members, friends, and potential N.A. members. Pamphlets and meeting lists were distributed by the dozen and our presence was welcomed and appreciated by many members of the public. The location we purchased this year proved to be a worthy investment to aid in increasing the awareness of N.A. as a resource in the community as well as connecting potential members to their first N.A. meeting.
- c. We will have a staffed information booth at the "Break the Stigma" event in Warwick on Sunday, July 28, 2019. The booth will be at Stanley Demming Park, Warwick, NY. from 12-5. We will have a brief presentation on stage to read the Public Relations statement and direct people to the booth for more information.
- d. Advertisements: I wanted to address some concerns that members have had with regard to our public relations policy and running advertisements. The 11th tradition states our policy is based on "attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and film." Public relations work done properly is not promotion. If prospective members do not know Narcotics Anonymous exists, especially with in their community, then they cannot be attracted. "Narcotics Anonymous is not a secret society; tradition eleven indicates personal anonymity, not fellowship anonymity. " It Works: How and Why. In keeping with the 11th concept, the committee's advertisement work will be focused on reaching the highest amount of people with every dollar invested by the groups. Facebook ad was run from July 2 to July 7 as per the committee's strategy to advertise during holiday weekends. The advertisement was very successful in reaching 3094 people with 14 link clicks and 7 shares. The committee is in the process of planning events and advertisements to more effectively and efficiently serve the groups in public relations. Goals moving forward will be to maximize advertising through social media, YouTube, radio ads, posters, and billboards. We plan to offer presentations by hosting invitational events to specific audiences, such as health professionals, law enforcement, and school administrators. With this strategy we can reach more people with the resources (members of the committee) we have available. If interested in these goals please join us on the 3rd Wednesday in Goshen.

- f. What is the difference between Public Relations and Public Information? When the name changed it was because we wanted to focus on creating on-going relationships with officials who might be involved in recovery and helping addicts, where just being about information wasn't. We're not just trying to inform the public, we want to have relationships with them. A lot of regions and areas have changed their names to show we are trying to address a bigger picture.

We will be writing checks for the balance of the money due for the boat ride \$2,560.00 and \$1,750.00 due for DBA MYSTIC FLAVOR CATERERS. We are also in the process of purchasing merchandise. There is currently no money connected with merchandise anywhere but the bank since we have no merchandise chair.
