AIM AND PURPOSE

SJRA IS A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION COMMITTED TO PROVIDING A FAMILY ENVIRONMENT IN WHICH CHILDREN MAY OBTAIN AND DEVELOP THE BASIC SKILLS OF RODEO. OUR COMMITMENT IS TO PREPARE OUR CONTESTANTS TO EXCEL IN BOTH JUNIOR HIGH AND HIGH SCHOOL RODEO. WE WILL RECOGNIZE SPORTSMANSHIP LIKE CONDUCT AND HONOR PERSONAL GROWTH. SKILL, DISCIPLINE, RESPECT AND A COMPETITIVE SPIRIT ARE THE ATTRIBUTES IN WHICH WE SUPPORT.

1. TO MAINTAIN ORDER AND STANDARDS SETUP UP BY THE SIERRA JUNIOR RODEO ASSOCIATION AMONG ITS

MEMBERS AT THEIR FUNCTIONS, SJRA HAS BEEN ORGANIZED EXCLUSIVELY FOR CHARITABLE AND EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE.

2. TO PROMOTE THE HIGHEST TYPE OF CONDUCT AND SPORTSMANSHIP AT THEIR VARIOUS RODEOS.
3. TO KEEP THE WESTERN HERITAGE AND THE SPORT OF RODEO ALIVE IN AMERICA.
4. TO PROMOTE CLOSER RELATIONSHIPS AMONG THE PEOPLE INTERESTED IN THE SPORT OF RODEO AND THE ORGANIZATIONS THEY REPRESENT.
5. TO ENSURE HUMANE TREATMENT OF ANIMALS.

6. NO PART OF THE NET EARNINGS OF THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO ITS MEMBERS, TRUSTEES, OFFICERS OR OTHER PERSONS FOR PERSONAL GAIN, WITH THE EXCEPTION MADE THAT THE ASSOCIATION SHALL BE AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED TO PAY REASONABLE COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES RENDERED AND TO MAKE PAYMENTS AND DISTRIBUTIONS IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PURPOSE SET FORTH.

STOCK CONTRACTORS AND HOST COMMITTEES WILL ABIDE BY BOTH ARENA DIRECTOR, ROUGH STOCK DIRECTORS' DECISIONS.

ALL SPECTATORS AND PARENTS MUST EXIT THE ARENA DURING COMPETITION, WITH EXCEPTION TO THE PEE WEE EVENTS.

MEMBERSHIP

1. ANNUAL DUES FOR THE 2026 SJRA SEASON WILL BE \$75.00 PER MEMBER
2. MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE FOR ONE (1) SEASON AS DETERMINED BY SCHEDULE.
3. A COPY OF APPLICANTS' BIRTH CERTIFICATE AND PROOF OF HEALTH INSURANCE MAY BE REQUESTED IF DECIDED BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS, IF MEMBER OR APPLICANT DOESN'T PROVIDE UPON REQUEST, APPLICANT/MEMBER MAY BE REJECTED AND/OR NOT ALLOWED TO RODEO.
4. MEMBERSHIP FEES MUST BE PAID TO ACCUMULATE POINTS TOWARDS YEAREND AWARDS.
5. CONTESTANT MEMBERSHIP MONEY IS DUE BY SUNDAY OF THE FIRST RODEO WEEKEND.
6. MEMBERS SHALL BE NO OLDER THAN 20 YEARS OLD ON JANUARY 1ST OF THE CURRENT RODEO SEASON, AND MAY ENTER IN THE FOLLOWING EVENTS:
 - PEE-WEE (6YRS & UNDER) — ALL EVENTS BOYS & GIRLS - STICK HORSE BARREL RACE, STICK HORSE RACE, GOAT UNDECORATING, DUMMY ROPING, MUTTON BUSTING. (PEE-WEE HORSE EVENTS POINTS WILL NOT BE INCLUDED IN CALCULATION FOR PEE-WEE ALLAROUND)
 - LITTLE BRITCHES (7YRS — 10YRS) — ALL

EVENTS BOYS & GIRLS – BARREL RACING, POLE BENDING, GOAT TYING, DUMMY ROPING, BREAK-AWAY ROPING, CALF RIDING.

- JUNIORS (11 YRS – 14 YRS) – BOYS & GIRLS EVENTS: TEAM ROPING, AND STEER RIDING. BREAK-AWAY ROPING AND STEER STOPPING. GIRLS' EVENTS- BARREL RACING, POLE BENDING, GOAT TYING. BOYS' EVENTS – CALF TYING, GOAT TYING (ONLY CALF OR GOAT TYING NOT BOTH), CHUTE DOGGING, JR. BULL RIDING.
- SENIORS (15 YRS – 20 YRS) – BOYS & GIRLS EVENTS: TEAM ROPING, BREAK-AWAY ROPING AND STEER STOPPING. GIRLS' EVENTS- BARREL RACING, POLE BENDING, GOAT TYING. BOYS' EVENTS – CALF ROPING, CHUTE DOGGING, BULL RIDING.

7. EACH CONTESTANT IS REQUIRED TO BRING A \$50 SPONSORSHIP AND SELL 20-GUN RAFFLE TICKETS FOR YEAR-END AWARDS AND SADDLES.

8. ALL CONTESTANTS ARE REQUIRED TO SIGN UP FOR HELP – A POINTS PENALTY MAY BE DECIDED BY BOARD IF THE CONTESTANT DOES NOT SHOW UP FOR THEIR ASSIGNED DUTIES. THE PENALTY SHALL BE AT SOLE DISCRETION OF THE BOARD.

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP MAY BE GIVEN TO THOSE WHO HAVE DONE SOMETHING EXTRAORDINARY, ABOVE AND BEYOND, FOR SJRA.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR HONORARY MEMBERSHIP MUST BE MADE IN WRITING BY A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDINGS AND MUST BE SET FORTH IN DETAIL WHAT THE RECOMMENDED PERSON HAS DONE FOR THE ASSOCIATION. HONORARY MEMBERSHIP MAY BE AWARDED ONLY BY ACTION OF THE ASSOCIATION'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS AT A REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING.

ENTRIES AND FEES

1. ENTRY IN AN SJRA RODEO MUST BE MADE ON A STANDARD ENTRY FORM PROVIDED BY THE ASSOCIATION OR ON THE SJRA OFFICIAL WEBSITE. WWW.SIERRAJRRODEO.COM, OR BY ONLINE APPLICATION.
2. ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY 14 DAYS PRIOR TO RODEO DATE, OR AS NOTED ON AN OFFICIAL SJRA CALENDAR.
 - A. ENTRY FEES IN THE CORRECT AMOUNT MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY FORMS.
 - B. MAIL IN ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY DUE DATE.
3. NO CONTESTANT MAY RODEO BEFORE PAYING THEIR ENTRY FEES
 - A. NON-MEMBERS MUST PAY A DAY PERMIT FEE OF \$15.00.
4. NO CONTESTANT MAY COMPETE WITHOUT MEDICAL INFORMATION AND THE RELEASE AGREEMENT ON FILE WITH THE SIGNATURE OF AT LEAST ONE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF THE

CONTESTANT.

5. CONTESTANTS CANNOT BE FULL CARD HOLDERS OF THE PRCA, WPRA, PBR, AND IPRA.
6. NO-SHOW CONTESTANTS WILL FORFEIT THEIR ENTRY FEES, UNLESS REASONS ARE APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY.
 - A. ALL DRAW OUTS MUST BE DONE 72 HOURS PRIOR TO THE DAY OF THE RODEO.
 - B. NO-SHOW CONTESTANTS WHO DO NOT DRAW OUT 72 HOURS BEFORE THE RODEO WILL BE CHARGED A STOCK FEE. THIS FEE MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO THE NEXT RODEO.
 - C. FORFEITED MONIES REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND TO BE USED TOWARDS YEAR-END AWARDS.
 - D. ONLY ENTRIES FOR THE CONTESTANTS WHO COMPETE WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE PURSE.
7. A CONTESTANT MAY DROP OUT OF ANY EVENT DUE TO INJURY TO THEMSELVES OR THEIR HORSE
 - A WRITTEN EXCUSE BY A MD OR DMV MUST BE PRESENTED TO THE RODEO SECRETARY TO RELEASE THE CONTESTANT TO HAVE MONIES REFUNDED FOR THAT EVENT AND/OR ANY FURTHER EVENTS ENTERED THAT DAY.
 - ANY CONTESTANT THAT HAS BEEN INJURED AND HAS RECEIVED MEDICAL CARE AT A HOSPITAL OR URGENT CARE MUST HAVE A DOCTOR'S RELEASE BEFORE CONTESTANT IS

ALLOWED TO RESUME COMPETITION.

- IF A CONTESTANT HAS PRESENTED A DOCTOR'S RELEASE TO DRAW OUT OF A RODEO, THEY MUST PRESENT A RELEASE TO RESUME COMPLETION.

8. A CONTESTANT WITH A VISIBLE INJURY OR ILLNESS TO THEMSELVES OR THEIR HORSE MAY TURN OUT OF A RODEO EVENT WITHOUT A DOCTOR'S WRITTEN EXCUSE PROVIDED NOTIFICATION OF SUCH TURNOUT IS AUTHORIZED BY A JUDGE OR DIRECTOR AT THAT GIVEN RODEO.
9. ROUGH STOCK EXHIBITIONS WILL BE CONTINGENT ON STOCK AVAILABILITY AS DETERMINED BETWEEN THE STOCK CONTRACTOR AND THE ROUGH STOCK DIRECTOR. TIMED EVENT EXHIBITIONS WILL BE CONTINGENT ON TIME CONSTRAINTS AND AT THE DISCRETIONS ON THE TIMED EVENT DIRECTORS.
10. CONTESTANTS WHO WISH TO RIDE STRICTLY AS AN EXHIBITION WILL BE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE AN ENTRY FORM AND PAY ANY STOCK FEES ASSOCIATED WITH THE SPECIFIC EVENT. MEDICAL INFORMATION AND THE RELEASE AGREEMENT MUST BE ON FILE WITH THE SIGNATURE OF AT LEAST ONE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF THE CONTESTANT. POINTS WILL NOT BE AWARDED, NOR SHALL ANY MONIES FROM THE EVENT PURSE.
11. CONTESTANTS MAY ONLY EXHIBIT ONCE PER RODEO SEASON.

12. NO SETUPS ALLOWED.

PAY – OUTS AND POINTS

1. THE PAY-OUTS WILL BE PAID IN THE FORM OF SJRA CHECK AND IS NEGOTIABLE AT ANY BANK.
2. CHECKS ISSUED WILL BECOME VOID AFTER 90 DAYS FROM DATE ISSUED.
3. CHECKS NOT CASHED WITH IN 90 DAYS WILL BE VOID AND REVERT BACK TO THE GENERAL FUND.
4. THER IS A STOCK FEE IN ALL EVENTS INVOLVING STOCK THAT IS NOT PART OF THE PURSE
5. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF PEEWEE EVENTS, THE PURSE WILL BE \$10 PER ENTRY COLLECTED PER EVENT, INCLUDING MUTTON BUSTING AND PEEWEE HORSE EVENTS.
6. THE PURSE WILL BE DIVIDED ACCORDING TO THE NUMBER OF CONTESTANTS ENTERED IN SAID EVENT, BUT NOT TO EXCEED FIVE (5) PLACES. PAYBACK FOR ALL EVENTS WILL BE PAID TO \$10 MINIMUM EARNINGS BUT NO MORE THAN FIVE (5) PLACES.
7. IF THERE ARE ANY TIES, THE PURSE FOR THOSE PLACES WILL BE ADDED TOGETHER AND SPLIT EVENLY BETWEEN THE PLACING CONTESTANTS.
8. IF AFTER THE LAST RODEO THERE HAVE BEEN THERE NO QUALIFIED TIMES OR SCORES THE PURSE SHALL BE USED TOWARDS YEAR END AWARDS.
9. A YEAR END EVENT BUCKLE WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE CONTESTANT, IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AGE

GROUP, COMPILING THE GREATEST NUMBER OF POINTS IN EACH EVENT.

10. ALL CONTESTANTS MUST HAVE COMPETED IN 50% PLUS 1 SJRA RODEOS TO QUALIFY FOR AWARDS.
11. AN ALL-AROUND AWARD WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE ALL-AROUND COWBOY AND COWGIRL, IN THE RESPECTIVE AGE GROUPS, COMPILING THE GREATEST NUMBER OF POINTS THROUGHOUT THE SEASON.
12. AN ALL-AROUND WINNER MUST COMPETE IN TWO (2) OR MORE EVENTS, AS WELL AS COMPETED IN 50% PLUS 1 SJRA RODEOS IN THE SAME SEASON.
13. POINTS SHALL BE ACCUMULATED FOR PLACING IN EVENTS ENTERED TO DETERMINE THE ALL-AROUND COWBOY AND COWGIRL AND THE EVENT CHAMPIONS IN THE FOLLOWING WAY:
 - 1ST PLACE... 10 POINTS
 - 2ND PLACE... 9 POINTS
 - 3RD PLACE... 8 POINTS
 - 4TH PLACE... 7 POINTS
 - 5TH PLACE ... 6 POINTS
 - 6TH PLACE... 5 POINTS
 - 7TH PLACE ... 4 POINTS
 - 8TH PLACE ... 3 POINTS
 - 9TH PLACE... 2 POINTS
 - 10TH PLACE... 1 POINT

- ONE (1) PARTICIPATION POINT WILL BE GIVEN AFTER 10TH PLACE IN THE PEEWEE DIVISION PER EVENT.

14. IN ORDER FOR SJRA TO AWARD A SADDLE FOR THE YEAREND ALL-AROUND CONTESTANT THERE MUST BE A MINIMUM OF THREE CONTESTANTS COMPETING. IF THERE IS NOT THREE CONTESTANTS SJRA WILL PROVIDE A DIFFERENT AWARD OR THE CONTESTANT MAY COME UP WITH A SPONSOR FOR THE SADDLE.
15. CONTESTANTS WHO ARE COMPETING IN AN EVENT NOT OFFERED IN THEIR AGE GROUP WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO COUNT POINTS EARNED IN THAT EVENT TOWARDS ANY ALL-AROUND POINTS IN THEIR AGE GROUP.
16. TEAM ROPERS ENTERING THE TEAM ROPING TWICE (WEATHER SWITCHING ENDS OR ROPING IN THE SAME POSITION), WILL ONLY BE AWARDED ONE SET OF POINTS, FOR THEIR HIGHEST PLACING, BUT WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR BOTH MONIES.
17. A CONTESTANT MAY ELECT TO “AGE UP” INTO AN AGE GROUP FOR ANY REASON BUT WILL ONLY BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE IN ONE AGE GROUP DURING THE YEAR.
18. A YEAR END EVENT BUCKLE WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE CONTESTANT WITH THE MOST TEAM ROPING POINTS, POINTS WILL NOT BE SEPARATED BY HEADER AND HEELER.

FINALS RODEO

1. THERE SHALL BE A FINALS RODEO AT THE END OF EACH SJRA RODEO SEASON.
2. EACH CONTESTANT INVITED TO COMPETE IN THE SJRA RODEO FINALS SHALL MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:
 - MEMBER MUST PARTICIPATE IN AT LEAST 50% + 1 RODEOS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR YEAREND AWARDS
 - MUST HAVE PAID \$75 MEMBERSHIP
 - MUST HAVE BROUGHT IN A MINIMUM \$50 SPONSORSHIP
 - MUST HAVE SOLD 20-GUN RAFFLE TICKETS.
3. SHOULD ANY CONTESTANT WHO QUALIFIES FOR THE FINALS FAIL TO COMPETE IN ANY EVENTS QUALIFIED IN, THEY WILL FORFEIT ANY YEAREND MONIES, POINTS AND AWARDS EARNED FROM THAT EVENT, UNLESS THERE IS A JUSTIFIABLE REASON FOR NOT APPEARING, THIS APPLIES TO THE ALL-AROUND AWARDS AS WELL. IF A CONTESTANT HAS A JUSTIFIABLE REASON FOR NOT APPEARING, THEY MUST SUBMIT A LETTER FOR APPROVAL TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS BEFORE CLOSING OF FINALS RODEO ENTRIES FOR CONSIDERATION.
4. IN THE EVENT THERE IS A TIE, FOR ANY YEAR END AWARDS (INCLUDING ALL AROUND), THE WINNER SHALL BE DETERMINED BY TAKING:
 - FASTEST TIME IN THAT EVENT AT THE FINALS RODEO

- IF A TIE STILL EXISTS, THE SECOND TIE BREAKER IS THE CONTESTANT COMING INTO THE FINALS RODEO WITH THE MOST POINTS WILL BE SET ABOVE THE OTHER IN THE YEAR END STANDINGS IN THAT EVENT.
- IF A TIE STILL EXISTS AFTER THE OTHER TWO TIE BREAKERS HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED, THE THIRD TIE BREAKER WILL BE A COIN FLIP.

CONTESTANT DISQUALIFICATIONS

1. CONTESTANT CAN BE DISQUALIFIED BY JUDGES, EVENT FLAGGER, BOARD OF DIRECTORS, OR THE ARENA DIRECTOR, FOR ANY OFFENCES LISTED UNDER THIS SECTION, OR THE REFUSAL TO ADHERE TO SJRA POLICIES AND SECTIONS A THRU D IN THE RULE BOOK LISTED BELOW
2. IT SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTESTANT TO MAINTAIN HIS/HER AND HIS/HER HELPERS, FAMILY AND FRIENDS TO COMPLY WITH ALL SJRA POLICIES AND SECTIONS A THRU D IN THE RULE BOOK.
3. THE PERSON OR PERSONS DISQUALIFYING CONTESTANT SHALL NOTIFY CONTESTANT AND RODEO AND RODEO TIMER WITH BASIS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE
4. ANY CONTESTANT, OR GUEST, DISQUALIFIED FOR ANY OFFENCE, MAY BE DISQUALIFIED FROM ALL REMAINING EVENTS AT THE RODEO.
5. ANY CONTESTANT, OR GUEST, DISQUALIFIED FOR ANY OFFENCE, MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE RODEO GROUNDS.

6. RODEO FEES MAY OR MAY NOT BE REFUNDED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
7. CONTESTANTS SHALL SIGN UP FOR WORK CREW UPON ENTERING MEMBERSHIP OR RODEO. IT IS THE CONTESTANT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE SURE THEY EITHER HELP DURING THAT EVENT OR FILL THE POSITION ON THE WORK CREW.

SECTION A - ATTIRE

1. CONTESTANT MUST WEAR WESTERN ATTIRE DURING A PERFORMANCE WHILE IN THE FOLLOWING:
 - ARENA
 - BUCKING CHUTE AREAS
 - STOCK PEN AREAS
2. SHIRTS MUST BE LONG SLEEVE, COLLARED, WESTERN STYLE, WITH BUTTON OR SNAP CLOSURE.
3. SHIRT SLEEVES MUST BE ROLLED DOWN WHILE COMPETING:
 - ROUGH STOCK CONTESTANTS MAY ROLL UP SLEEVE, NOT TO EXCEED ABOVE THE ELBOW ON THE RIDING ARM ONLY, IN ROUGH STOCK EVENTS ONLY.
4. SHORT SLEEVE ATTIRE MAY BE ALLOWED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE SJRA BOARDS OF DIRECTORS
 - ANY CHANGE TO SLEEVE LENGTH WILL BE ANNOUNCED AND POSTED PRIOR TO THE

START OF EACH RODEO.

- SHORT SLEEVE SHIRT MUST BE COLLARED, POLO SHIRTS ARE ACCEPTABLE, SLEEVELESS SHIRTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED
 - ROUGH STOCK CONTESTANTS MAY NOT WEAR SHORT SLEEVES DURING COMPETITIONS.
5. SHIRT TAILS MUST BE TUCKED INTO PANTS AT THE START OF EACH EVENT WHILE COMPETING AND ASSISTING DURING RODEO.
 6. CONTESTANTS MUST WEAR NUMBERS (WHEN ASSIGNED) ON THEIR BACKS AND THEIR NUMBER MUST BE VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES.
 7. CONTESTANTS MUST WEAR WESTERN STYLE BOOTS.
 8. CONTESTANTS MUST WEAR A WESTERN STYLE "COWBOY HAT" AT LEAST A 2" BRIM; THE CROWN OF THE HAT MUST BE ENCLOSED, OR CONTESTANTS CAN WEAR A PROTECTIVE HELMET WHILE COMPETING.
 9. CONTESTANTS MUST ENTER ARENA WITH COWBOY HAT ON OR HELMET.
 10. DRESS TO IMPRESS WITH YOUR BEST WESTERN ATTIRE. DRESSES AND DRESS JACKETS ARE ACCEPTABLE.

SECTION B - RODEO

1. NOT BEING READY TO COMPETE WHEN CALLED UPON. CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE THREE CALLS TO COMPETE AT 20 SECOND INTERVALS. SHOULD THE CONTESTANT FAIL TO ENTER THE

ARENA WITH 10 SECONDS FOLLOWING THE 3RD CALL, THE CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE A NO TIME.

- HORSES' REFUSAL MAY ALSO BE CONSIDERED A TIME-OUT CALL

2. REFUSAL TO COMPETE DURING A PERFORMANCE ON AN ANIMAL DRAWN FOR THEM.

SECTION C - CONDUCT

1. ANY PARENT OR CONTESTANT HAVING ANY ASSOCIATION WITH NARCOTICS, OR OTHER NON-MEDICINAL DRUGS WHILE IN ATTENDANCE OF ANY SJRA RODEO OR ANY SJRA FUNCTION
2. ROWDINESS, QUARRELING OR FIGHTING IN OR DURING SJRA RODEO OR ANY SJRA FUNCTION.
3. INAPPROPRIATE CONDUCT OR FOUL LANGUAGE OF ANY KIND.
4. VANDALISM OF ANY MANNER OF ANY MANNER OF ANY ITEM, OR PLACE AT ANY TIME.
5. ANY CONTESTANT OR PARENT(S) ATTEMPTING TO FIX, THREATEN, BRIBE, INFLUENCE, HARASS OR COERCE ANY RODEO OFFICIAL AT ANY TIME BETWEEN OPENING AND CLOSING OF RODEO.
6. ANY CONTESTANT, FAMILY MEMBER OR ASSOCIATE MAKING SLANDEROUS REMARKS ABOUT SJRA RODEO EVENTS AND/OR SJRA BOARD MEMBERS OR CONTESTANTS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO VIA SOCIAL MEDIA, EMAIL, ETC. WILL FACE THE POSSIBILITY OF TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP WITH NO MONIES

REFUNDED.

7. THE SJRA BOARD MAY INVOKE THEIR RIGHT TO REFUSE THE MEMBERSHIP OR ATTENDANCE OF THE MEMBER AND/OR FAMILY MEMBER TO AN SJRA EVENT.
8. ANY PARENT HAVING ALCOHOL IN ARENA, CHUTES OR STAGING AREA DURING SJRA RODEO OR SJRA FUNCTION
9. THERE WILL BE ZERO TOLERANCE FOR ANY CONTESTANT USE OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO OR CANNABIS AT A SJRA RODEO WEEKEND OR EVENT.

SECTION D - STOCK

1. CONTESTANT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FOR BEING IN A PEN WITH THE LIVESTOCK AT ANY TIME EXCEPT WHEN ACCOMPANIED BY STOCK CONTRACTOR, JUDGE, OR WHEN ASSIGNED TO WORK IN THOSE PENS.
2. CONTESTANTS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FOR ANY MISTREATMENT OF ANY LIVESTOCK.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

ALL PROTESTS SHALL BE MADE IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONTESTANT'S PERFORMANCE IS COMPLETED AND DIRECTED TO THE ATTENTION OF THE OFFICIALS IN CHARGE OF THE EVENT (JUNIOR EVENT DIRECTOR, EVENT DIRECTOR, ARENA DIRECTOR, FLAGGER OR JUDGE). AT NO TIME SHALL ANYONE BE PERMITTED TO ENTER THE ARENA DURING A PERFORMANCE. AFTER NOTIFICATION A

WRITTEN PROTEST, ON AN OFFICIAL GRIEVANCE FORM, AVAILABLE FROM THE RODEO SECRETARY, MUST BE FILED ALONG WITH A \$50 PROTEST FEE. THE OFFICIAL WILL THEN NOTIFY THE SJRA GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE DIRECTORS. THE PROTEST SHALL BE DISCUSSED FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF THAT EVENT; PROTESTERS SHALL PRESENT THEIR GRIEVANCE TO THE GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE: UPON HEARING THE GRIEVANCE, THE GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE WILL MAKE A RULING; THE GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE DIRECTOR'S DECISION WILL BE FINAL. IF THE PROTEST IS WON THE \$50 WILL BE RETURNED, IF LOST THE \$50 WILL BE RETAINED BY THE SJRA AND USED FOR YEAREND AWARDS.

RODEO OFFICIAL STANDARDS

RODEO DIRECTORS

ANNUAL ELECTIONS WILL BE ORGANIZED AND HELD AT THE LAST RODEO OF THE SEASON. YOUTH DIRECTORS SHALL BE NOMINATED AT THE FIRST RODEO. ADULT DIRECTORS WILL BE NOMINATED AND VOTED IN USING A CLOSED BALLOT ELECTION. EACH ASSOCIATION MEMBER WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO NOMINATE AND VOTE IN BOARD MEMBERS. BOARD MEMBERS WILL ELECT TO A 1-YEAR TERM FOR THE FOLLOWING POSITIONS: PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, BOARD SECRETARY, TREASURER, POINTS SECRETARY, ENTRY SECRETARY, OFFICIAL TIMER, ARENA DIRECTOR, GIRLS TIMED EVENT DIRECTOR, BOY'S TIMED EVENTS DIRECTOR, ROUGH STOCK DIRECTOR, PEEWEE DIRECTOR.

- THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL ESTABLISH MAJOR POLICIES GOVERNING THE AFFAIRS OF THE SJRA AND DEVISE MEASURES FOR CONTINUED GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT.
- IT SHALL BE THE DUTY AND RESPONSIBILITY OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO CONDUCT AND MANAGE THE BUSINESS, PROPERTY, AND AFFAIRS OF THE SJRA.
- THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY TAKE ANY ACTION WHICH IT CONSIDERS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE SJRA AND MAY ENTER INTO ANY CONTRACT OR OBLIGATION IN THE FURTHERANCE THEREOF.
- THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY AUTHORIZE ANY OFFICERS; AGENTS OF THE ASSOCIATION, IN ADDITION TO THE OFFICERS SO AUTHORIZED BY THESE BY-LAWS, TO ENTER INTO ANY CONTRACT OR EXECUTE AND DELIVER ANY INSTRUMENT IN THE NAME OF AND ON THE BEHALF OF THE SJRA, SUCH AUTHORITY MAY BE IN GENERAL OR MAY BE CONFINED TO A SPECIFIC INSTANCE.
- A SIMPLE MAJORITY OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM AT ANY MEETING.
- THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO FILL ANY VACANCIES ON THE BOARD.

DUTIES OF THE VARIOUS OFFICES ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

PRESIDENT

PRESIDENT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. THE PRESIDENT SHALL SERVE AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE SJRA AND SHALL PRESIDE AT ALL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OR GENERAL MEMBERSHIP.
2. THE PRESIDENT SHALL ENFORCE THE BY-LAWS AND RULES OF THE SJRA AND SHALL PERFORM ALL OTHER DUTIES THAT MAY BE PRESCRIBED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
3. SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY BE CALLED BY THE PRESIDENT AT HIS/HER DISCRETION.
4. THE SJRA PRESIDENT AND OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY APPOINT VARIOUS SPECIAL COMMITTEES IN FURTHERANCE OF SJRA BUSINESS OR FUNCTIONS.
5. THE PRESIDENT SHALL VOTE ONLY IN CASE OF A TIE AND IS KNOWN AS A NON-VOTING MEMBER.
6. THE PRESIDENT WILL BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN CHECKS. SJRA FUNDS SHALL BE DISBURSED ONLY UPON ITEMIZED DEMANDS OR AS DIRECTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

VICE PRESIDENT

VICE PRESIDENT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. THE VICE-PRESIDENT SHALL SERVE AS ASSISTANT TO PRESIDENT AND SHALL PERFORM

OTHER DUTIES PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

2. IN THE ABSENCE OF THE PRESIDENT, THE VICE-PRESIDENT SHALL HAVE THE POWERS AND SHALL PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT.
3. THE VICE-PRESIDENT WILL HAVE A VOTE ON ALL SJRA BUSINESS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF WHEN ACTING AS PRESIDENT. HE/SHE SHALL BE A NONVOTING MEMBER.
4. THE VICE-PRESIDENT WILL BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN CHECKS. SJRA FUNDS SHALL BE DISBURSED ONLY UPON ITEMIZED DEMANDS OR AS DIRECTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

BOARD SECRETARY

BOARD SECRETARY WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. THE BOARD SECRETARY SHALL BE KEPT AND PROVIDE IN DETAIL THE MINUTES OF ALL MEMBERSHIP AND DIRECTOR MEETINGS.
2. THE BOARD SECRETARY SHALL BE THE CUSTODIAN FOR SAFE KEEPING OF ALL DOCUMENTS AND RECORDS OF THE SJRA.
3. THE BOARD SECRETARY SHALL MAINTAIN ALL CORRESPONDENCES OF THE SJRA.

TREASURER

TREASURER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. THE TREASURER SHALL BRING TOGETHER ALL MONEY COLLECTED BY THE ENTRY SECRETARY

FROM EACH RODEO AND ANY ADDITIONAL MONIES DUE THE SJRA AND SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR DEPOSIT OF SAME MONIES IN THE SJRA ACCOUNT HELD WITH AN ACCREDITED BANK.

2. THE TREASURER SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR FUNDS DISBURSED AND SHALL MAINTAIN SUCH FUNDS ARE DISBURSED ONLY UPON ITEMIZED DEMANDS OR AS DIRECTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
3. THE TREASURER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR ALL MONIES BY ITEMIZED STATEMENTS IN DETAIL TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND GENERAL MEMBERSHIP UPON REQUEST OF THE BOARD.

POINT SECRETARY

POINT SECRETARY WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. THE POINT SECRETARY WILL AUDIT THE BOOKS FROM EACH RODEO TO DETERMINE THE CORRECT AWARDING OF POINTS.
2. THE POINT SECRETARY SHALL PUBLISH CURRENT STANDING TO MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING.
3. THE POINT SECRETARY SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE THE CURRENT STANDING FOR WEBSITE POSTING.

RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY

RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND ABLE TO CARRY OUT

SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

2. ONLY THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY AND OFFICIAL ASSISTANTS SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR RODEO ENTRIES.
3. THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY WILL DRAW POSITIONS FOR RODEO ROTATION. POSITIONS WILL BE DRAWN IN ALL EVENTS FOR RODEO.
4. POSITIONS WILL BE DRAWN RANDOMLY, 72 HOURS PRIOR TO THE START OF EACH RODEO OR BY WAY OF RODEO APP. OR COMPUTER.
5. THERE WILL BE NO TRADING OR POSITIONS BY CONTESTANTS IN ANY EVENT WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY.
6. THE DRAW AT ALL RODEOS SHALL BE POSTED WHERE THE CONTESTANTS CAN EXAMINE IT BEFORE THAT START OF THE EVENT.
7. JUDGES' SCORE SHEETS WILL BE INITIALED AND TURNED INTO THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY.
8. RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY WILL VERIFY AND POST SCORES AFTER EACH PERFORMANCE
9. MASTER SCORE SHEETS WILL NOT LEAVE THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY'S POSSESSION.
10. CONTESTANT IS PRIVILEGED TO SEE THE RECORDS OF ALL CONTESTANTS IN ANY EVENTS IN WHICH HE/SHE TAKES PART IN AT THE END OF EACH GO-RODEO, AFTER A REASONABLE TIME SO THAT THE SECRETARY AND JUDGE MAY COMPLETE VERIFYING OF THE TIMES, SCORES AND PLACING.
11. RODEO RESULTS MUST BE AUDITED 3 DAYS

AFTER RODEO TO CHECK FOR ERRORS.

12. NO SCORES, POSITIONS, OR PRIZES WILL BE CHANGED AFTER 7 DAYS FROM RODEO END.

OFFICIAL TIMER

TIMERS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND ABLE TO CARRY OUT SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
2. TIMERS MUST HAVE PRIOR EXPERIENCE WITH ELECTRIC TIMERS AND STOPWATCHES
3. BOARD MUST PROVIDE A PLACE FOR TIMERS AND ANNOUNCER TO WORK WITHOUT OBSTRUCTIONS OR INTERFERENCE THAT WILL FACILITATE FOR GOOD COMMUNICATIONS WITH ARENA DIRECTOR AND JUDGES.
4. TIMERS MUST WORK FROM THE SAME POSITION IN ALL PERFORMANCES OF RODEO.
5. OFFICIAL TIMERS' SCORE SHEETS WILL BE INITIALED AND TURNED INTO THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY
6. A COPY OF THE OFFICIAL TIME SHEETS WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE POINT SECRETARY FOR POINT CALCULATION AND RODEO AUDIT.
7. TIMERS MAY NOT BE CHANGED DURING A PERFORMANCE, EXCEPT FOR ILLNESS OR INJURY OR BY THE REQUEST OF AN OFFICIAL BECAUSE OF INCOMPETENCE, AND ONLY THEN BY THE REQUEST OF AN ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR IN AGREEMENT WITH THE SJRA BOARD.

ARENA DIRECTOR

1. PURPOSE OF THE ARENA DIRECTOR IS TO ASSURE THAT THE RODEO IS CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SJRA RULES.
2. ARENA DIRECTOR IS TO KEEP THE RODEO RUNNING IN A TIMELY MANNER AND BE AVAILABLE TO THE CONTESTANTS AND PARENTS SHOULD QUESTIONS ARISE.
3. ARENA DIRECTOR WILL BE VERSED AND KNOWLEDGEABLE OF THE SJRA AS WELL AS THE NHSRA RULE BOOK.
4. IT SHALL BE THE ARENA DIRECTORS RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT A CONTESTANT COMPETES ON THE STOCK DRAWN FOR THEM.
 - IN THE EVENT OF A MISTAKE, STOCK DRAWN FOR MUST BE RUN DURING THAT PERFORMANCE AND ONLY THAT TIME OR SCORE SHALL BE RECORDED.

ROUGH STOCK DIRECTOR

ROUGH STOCK DIRECTOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND ABLE TO CARRY OUT SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
2. INSPECTION OF TIMED EVENT/ROUGH STOCK UPON ARRIVAL TO THE RODEO AND PRIOR TO THE DRAW.
 - NO SORE, LAME, SICK OR INJURED ANIMALS OR ANIMALS WITH DEFECTIVE EYESIGHT SHALL BE PERMITTED IN THE DRAW AT ANY TIME.

3. THE ROUGH STOCK DIRECTOR SHALL DETERMINE ANY UNDESIRABLE CONDITIONS, AND HAS THE RIGHT TO DECLARE ANY STOCK UNSATISFACTORY, UPON NOTIFICATION, EITHER WRITTEN OR VERBAL, STOCK CONTRACTOR SHALL FIX UNDESIRABLE CONDITION OR ELIMINATE ANIMAL FROM RODEO DRAW.
4. ALL HORNED BULLS MUST HAVE HORNS TIPPED TO AT LEAST THE SIZE OF A HALF-DOLLAR, AND OR CUT BACK OR THEY WILL BE KEPT OUT OF THE DRAW.
5. SHOULD AN ANIMAL BECOME SICK OR INJURED BETWEEN THE TIME IT IS DRAWN AND TIME IT IS SCHEDULED TO BE USED IN THE RODEO, THAT ANIMAL SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED AND ANOTHER WILL BE DRAWN FOR THE CONTESTANT. AT ANY TIME.

GIRLS TIMED EVENT DIRECTOR

GIRLS TIMED EVENT DIRECTOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT THE SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
2. ASSIST IN MANAGEMENT OF GIRL EVENTS BEFORE AND DURING THE RODEO.
3. SHALL HELP OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FROM PERSONS TO ASSIST IN THE RUNNING OF GIRL'S EVENTS, INCLUDING SECONDARY TIMING OFFICIALS, FLAGGERS, JUDGES AND EVENT HELPERS.
4. SHALL MEET WITH JUDGES BEFORE THE RODEO

AND DISCUSS THEIR EVENTS AND JUDGING PROCEDURES.

BOYS TIMED EVENT DIRECTOR

BOYS TIMED EVENT DIRECTOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT THE SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
2. ASSIST IN MANAGEMENT OF BOY EVENTS BEFORE AND DURING THE RODEO.
3. SHALL HELP OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FROM PERSONS TO ASSIST IN THE RUNNING OF BOYS' EVENTS, INCLUDING SECONDARY TIMING OFFICIALS, FLAGGERS, JUDGES AND EVENT HELPERS.
4. SHALL MEET WITH JUDGES BEFORE THE RODEO AND DISCUSS THEIR EVENTS AND JUDGING PROCEDURES.

PEE-WEE EVENT DIRECTOR

PEE-WEE EVENT DIRECTOR WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT THE SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
2. ASSIST IN MANAGEMENT OF PEE-WEE EVENTS BEFORE AND DURING THE RODEO.
3. SHALL HELP OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FROM PERSONS TO ASSIST IN THE RUNNING OF PEE-WEE EVENTS, INCLUDING SECONDARY TIMING OFFICIALS, FLAGGERS, JUDGES AND EVENT HELPERS.

4. SHALL MEET WITH JUDGES BEFORE THE RODEO AND DISCUSS THEIR EVENTS AND JUDGING PROCEDURES.

JUDGES

1. JUDGES AND FLAGMEN FOR THE SJRA RODEOS SHALL BE CHOSEN WITH REGARDS TO THEIR INTEGRITY, ABILITY AND AVAILABILITY
2. JUDGES MUST READ AND BE KNOWLEDGEABLE OF THE SJRA RULEBOOK BEFORE JUDGES' MEETING WITH ARENA DIRECTORS AND OFFICIALS.
3. ALL JUDGES WILL MEET WITH EVENT DIRECTORS BEFORE THE RODEO AND DISCUSS THEIR RESPECTIVE EVENTS AND JUDGING PROCEDURES
4. ANY PROBLEMS OR INFRACTIONS NOT COVERED BY SJRA RULEBOOK WILL BE REFERRED TO THE CURRENT NHSRA, AND IF NOT COVERED THEN REFERRED TO PRCA ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION, BY-LAWS AND RULES, PROVIDED THEIR RULES COVER THE EVENT IN QUESTION.
5. NEITHER BARRIER JUDGE, FIELD FLAG JUDGE, NOR EVENT JUDGE MAY BE CHANGED DURING THE COURSE OF A RODEO, EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF SICKNESS OR INCOMPETENCE AND ONLY THEN BY THE REQUEST OF AN ASSOCIATION OFFICIAL IN AGREEMENT WITH THE SJRA BOARD.
6. JUDGES MUST INSPECT ALL EQUIPMENT PRIOR TO EACH RODEO.

7. JUDGES MUST BE PRESENT AND SUPERVISE THE DRAWING OF STOCK.
8. THE DECISION OF ANY JUDGE, FLAGMEN OR TIMER WILL BE FINAL, AND NO PROTEST BY CONTESTANT WILL BE PERMITTED, EXCEPT FIRST THROUGH THE JUNIOR EVENT DIRECTOR, WHO THEN WILL REPORT TO THE EVENT DIRECTOR, WHO WILL TAKE THE PROTEST TO THE ARENA DIRECTOR. SUCH PROTEST MUST BE MADE BEFORE THE END OF THE PERFORMANCE IN WHICH THE QUESTION AROSE. IF THE EVENT DIRECTOR DETERMINES THAT THE PROTEST IS BASED UPON A POSSIBLE MISINTERPRETATION OF AN EVENT RULE, THE EVENT DIRECTOR, AT THE FIRST CONVENIENT OPPORTUNITY, WILL DESCRIBE THE PROTEST AND THE INTERPRETATION OF THE RULE UPON WHICH IT IS BASED TO THE JUDGE. IF THE JUDGE AGREES THAT AN ERRONEOUS RULING WAS MADE AND THAT THE ERROR IS CORRECTABLE, THEN THE JUDGE SHALL MODIFY THE RULING ACCORDINGLY. OTHERWISE, THE DECISION WILL STAND.
9. JUDGES SHALL CONDUCT THEMSELVES IN A MANNER FITTING AND PROPER TO ONE AFFORDED THE HONOR OF OFFICIATING AT ANY SJRA RODEO.
10. ANY MISCONDUCT ON THE PART OF A JUDGE AT ANY SJRA RODEO, SUCH AS DRINKING IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO OR DURING THE RODEO, OR THE USE OF ABUSIVE LANGUAGE, SHOWING OBVIOUS FAVORITISM TO, OR DISCRIMINATION

AGAINST, EITHER AN INDIVIDUAL OR A HORSE PERFORMING IN THE CONTEST, OR ANY MISCONDUCT UNBECOMING TO ONE IN THEIR POSITION, WILL MAKE THEM SUBJECT TO A COMPLETE AND IMPARTIAL HEARING OF CAUSE OF THE COMPLAINT BEFORE THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

SCORING

1. JUDGES OR EVENT DIRECTORS OR BOARD ENTRY SECRETARY ARE REQUIRED TO KEEP SCORE SHEETS AND MARK ALL PENALTIES, INCLUDING NO TIME AND ANY CHANGE OF WORKING ORDER OF CONTESTANTS IN ALL EVENTS THEY ARE JUDGING.

 - C. ILLEGAL LOOPS, CROSSFIRE'S
 - D. KNOCKED DOWN BARRELS
 - E. KNOCKED DOWN POLES

 - H. ROPE PENALTY IN GOAT
2. AFTER EACH EVENT, SCORE SHEETS SHALL BE INITIALED AND TURNED IN TO THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY.
3. MARKINGS MUST BE TOTALED BY THE JUDGES AND CHECKED BY THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY.
 - SCORES WILL NOT BE CHANGED ONCE THEY

ARE TURNED IN, EXCEPT FOR OBVIOUS MATHEMATICAL ERRORS, THE JUDGES WILL MAKE AND INITIAL ANY CHANGES.

4. A CONTESTANT THAT IS BEING ASSISTED/ HELPED (WITH EXCEPTION OF PEE-WEES, SEE RULES UNDER DUMMY ROPING) CANNOT RECEIVE POINTS ABOVE OR PLACE ABOVE ANOTHER CONTESTANT COMPETING ON THEIR OWN, WHO RECEIVES A MARKING, "WITH HELP" SHALL BE NOTED ON THE SCORE SHEET.

ROPING OFFICIALS

ROPING OFFICIALS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CARRYING OUT THE DUTIES STATED HEREIN

1. KNOWLEDGEABLE OF AND ABLE TO CARRY OUT SJRA RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES
2. THERE SHALL BE TWO (2) OR MORE TIMERS, A FIELD FLAGGER, AND A BARRIER JUDGE.
3. A THIRD OFFICIAL MAY BE USED TO DETERMINE LEGAL CATCHES OR ANY INFRACTIONS OF THE RULES. THIS OFFICIAL NEED NOT BE MOUNTED.
4. THE FLAG JUDGE WILL HAVE THE FINAL DECISION.
5. ANY QUESTIONS AS TO CATCHES WILL BE DECIDED BY THE EVENT JUDGES.
6. THE FIELD FLAG JUDGE MUST ASK CONTESTANT IF THEY WANT A SECOND LOOP, IF ALLOWED IN EVENT. ONCE A CONTESTANT HAS BEEN FLAGGED OUT, THEY WILL NOT RECEIVE ANY STOCK BACK.
7. BARRIER JUDGE IS RESPONSIBLE TO CHANGE

BARRIER STRING WHENEVER IT MAY HAVE BECOME WEAKENED, OR AT THE REQUEST OF THE CONTESTANT.

8. BARRIER JUDGE SHALL KEEP A RECORD OF THE LENGTH OF THE BARRIER TRIP ROPE FOR EACH PERFORMANCE TO ASSURE THE SAME START FOREACH CONTESTANT.
9. BARRIER EQUIPMENT MUST BE INSPECTED BY THE JUDGE BEFORE EACH TIMED EVENT. IF EQUIPMENT IS FAULTY, IT MUST BE REPLACED
10. BARRIER JUDGE SHALL ENSURE THAT NOBODY CAN STAND CLOSE ENOUGH TO BARRIER OR BARRIER EQUIPMENT TO TAMPER WITH IT.
11. HEIGHT OF BARRIER IN TIMED EVENTS SHALL BE FROM 32" TO 36" MEASURED AT THE CENTER OF THE BOX.

GENERAL TIMING RULES

1. EVENTS WITH A 1-MINUTE TIME LIMIT MAY HAVE PENALTIES THAT EXCEED
1 MINUTE.
2. THE FINALS RODEO MAY HAVE REDUCED TIME LIMITS.
3. LAP & TAP — NO BARRIER IS USED; FLAGGER IS TO START TIME WHEN
THE ANIMALS NOSE CLEARS THE GATE.
4. ALL ROUGH STOCK EVENT TIMING IS TO START WHEN ANIMALS INSIDE
FRONT SHOULDER PASSES THE PLANE OF THE CHUTE.

5. IN THE SENIOR DIVISION, ALL ROPING EVENTS AND CHUTE DOGGING

WILL BE CONDUCTED WITH A CLOSED CATCH PEN.

6. DURING INSTANCES OF EQUIPMENT FAILURE, TIME WILL BE TAKEN

USING THE AVERAGE TIME OF THE BACK-UP TIMERS.

7. IN ALL TIMED EVENTS THE CONTESTANT IS RESPONSIBLE TO MAKE SURE

THE FLAG JUDGE, WHO STARTS THE TIME, IS READY BEFORE THEY BEGIN

THEIR RUN.

- A CONTESTANT CAN BE DISQUALIFIED AND NOT RECEIVE A NEW RUN SHOULD THEY PROCEED BEFORE THE FLAG JUDGE IS READY.

RODEO LIVESTOCK BIDS

1. STOCK BIDS MAY BE TAKEN AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH RODEO SEASON.

2. ALL BIDS WILL BE CONSIDERED FOR HIRE.

3. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL REVIEW ALL BIDS.

4. THE DECISION OF THE DIRECTORS TO ACCEPT ANY LIVESTOCK BIDS SHALL BE IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE SJRA.

STOCK CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS

1. STOCK CONTRACTOR SHALL BE REQUIRED TO SUPPLY ENOUGH STOCK FOR EACH EVENT AT EACH RODEO.

2. STOCK REQUIREMENTS WILL BE BASED ON THE NUMBER OF CONTESTANTS ENTERED.
3. RODEO SECRETARY WILL NOTIFY STOCK CONTRACTOR TO THE NUMBER OF CONTESTANTS NO

LATER THAN TWO DAYS BEFORE EACH RODEO.

4. THE STOCK CONTRACTOR WILL BE REQUIRED TO BRING $\frac{1}{2}$ AS MUCH STOCK AS CONTESTANTS.
5. ALL BUCKING STOCK MUST BE CHUTE BROKE.
6. ANIMALS USED FOR ANY EVENT SHALL BE INSPECTED AND OBJECTIONABLE ONES ELIMINATED.
7. IF AFTER ONE GO-AROUND HAS BEEN COMPLETED, AND A FRESH CALF HAS TO BE USED, THE

NEW CALF MUST BE ROPED AND TIED BEFORE THE DRAW, IF EXTRA CALVES HAVE BEEN TIED AT THE RODEO, THEY WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FRESH.

8. PRE-TYING OF GOATS WILL BE HELD ON SATURDAYS AT 7:00 AM. (IF REQUESTED BY STOCK CONTRACTOR)

9. TIME CONSTRAINTS WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE EVENT DIRECTOR.

10. DURING THE PERFORMANCE IF AN ANIMAL ESCAPES THE CHUTES OR PENS BEFORE IT IS CALLED FOR BY THE CONTESTANT OR IF AN

AUTOMATIC BARRIER FAILS TO WORK AND THE STOCK IS BROUGHT BACK, THAT ANIMAL WILL BE RETURNED BY THE EVENT DIRECTOR AND THE LABOR CREW DURING OR AT THE END OF THAT PERFORMANCE IN THE SAME MANNER IT WAS ORIGINALLY WORKED OR BROUGHT TO THE PENS. AT LEAST THREE (3) HEAD OF ANIMALS WILL BE BROUGHT BACK TOGETHER. NO ANIMAL MAY BE RE-PENNED BY ITSELF. THE ARENA DIRECTOR WILL MAKE DECISIONS ABOUT WHEN STOCK IS RE-PENNED.

NUMBERING OF STOCK

1. ALL ROUGH STOCK, ROPING AND CHUTE DOGGING LIVESTOCK MUST BE NUMBERED.
2. IF NUMBERS ARE BLURRED, THEY MUST BE REDONE SO THEY ARE READABLE.
3. TIMED EVENT CATTLE MAY BE NUMBERED WITH PLASTIC EAR TAGS.
4. EVENT DIRECTOR MAY SELECT CHUTE DRAW AT ANY EVENT, IF NO EVENT DIRECTOR, THEN ARENA DIRECTOR CAN MAKE CALL.

WRAPPED

1. STEERS MUST BE UNIFORM IN SIZE AND WEIGHT
UP TO 650LBS
2. IF HORNED CATTLE ARE NOT AVAILABLE PLASTIC
HORNS MAY BE USED
3. ALL STEERS SHALL HAVE HORNS PROPERLY
WRAPPED

CHUTE DOGGING

1. STEERS MUST BE UNIFORM IN WEIGHT (JR.
250-350LBS) (SR. 350-550LBS)
2. SHARP HORNS SHALL BE TIPPED

3. IF HORNED CATTLE ARE NOT AVAILABLE PLASTIC HORNS MAY BE USED

CALF AND STEER RIDING

1. SHARP HORNS SHALL BE TIPPED OR TAPED
2. SEX OF ANIMAL DOES NOT APPLY
3. CALVES SHALL BE UNIFORM WEIGHT
275-350LBS.

BULL RIDING

1. ALL HORNED BULLS MUST HAVE HORNS TIPPED TO AT LEAST THE SIZE OF A HALF-DOLLAR, OR CUT BACK.

DRAWING ROUGH STOCK

1. ALL STOCK IS TO BE NUMBERED AND DRAWN FOR BY NUMBER.
2. ALL STOCK MUST BE DRAWN BY NUMBER, AND DRAWN BY A JUDGE (USE OF COMPUTER OR APP IS ACCEPTABLE).
3. THERE MUST BE FOUR COPIES OF THE DRAW MADE, ONE TO BE POSTED, ONE FOR EACH JUDGE, AND ONE FOR THE RODEO SECRETARY'S RECORDS.
4. A RECEPTACLE CONTAINING NUMBERS SHALL BE SHOOK BETWEEN EACH NUMBER DRAWN.
5. DRAW SHALL BE CONDUCTED SO THE ENTRY SECRETARY, AND EVENT DIRECTOR MAY WITNESS DRAW.
6. STOCK IN THE DRAW THAT BECOMES INJURED, CRIPPLED, OR SICK WILL BE REPLACED WITH THE RE-RIDE ANIMALS.

7. STOCK WILL BE DRAWN FOR CONTESTANT UNTIL HE/SHE HAS ACTUALLY BEEN DISQUALIFIED.

DRAWING STOCK RE-RIDES:

1. STOCK FOR RE-RIDES MUST BE DRAWN BEFORE RODEO AND MUST BE POSTED.
2. NO CONTESTANT WILL RIDE TWO (2) HEAD IN THE SAME EVENT, IN THE SAME DAY EXCEPT FOR RE-RIDES.
3. ANY STOCK IN ORIGINAL DRAW THAT IS TURNED OUT MAY BE USED AS A RE-RIDE.
4. AN ANIMAL CAN BE DRAWN AS A RE-RIDE ONLY ONE TIME IN A RODEO.

DRAWING POSITIONS

POSITIONS MUST BE DRAWN IN ALL EVENTS. NO EXCEPTIONS.

1. ALL POSITIONS WILL BE DRAWN BY THE RODEO ENTRY SECRETARY THREE DAYS BEFORE THE RODEO TO ALLOW TIME FOR PROGRAM TO BE PREPARED.
2. POSITION LIST IS TO BE IN RANDOM ORDER OR MAY BE DRAWN BY COMPUTER.
3. THERE WILL BE NO TRADING OF POSITIONS WITHOUT THE ENTRY SECRETARIES PERMISSION.

DRAWING OUT & ENTRY FEE REFUND

1. THERE WILL BE NO DRAWING OUT AFTER POSITIONS OR STOCK IS DRAWN UNLESS CONTESTANT HAS A RELEASE FROM A DOCTOR

PRIOR TO THEIR PERFORMANCE.

2. ALL NO-SHOWS WITHOUT MEDICAL OR NOTICE OF FAMILY EMERGENCY WILL BE CHARGED AN ENTRY/STOCK FEE.
3. IF CONTESTANT MUST DRAW OUT OF THE ROTATION BECAUSE OF SICKNESS OR INJURY, THEIR ENTRY FEES MAY BE REFUNDED.
4. REFUNDS CAN ONLY BE MADE IF ENTRY FEES WERE NOT INCLUDED IN AWARDS PAID OUT IN SAID EVENTS.
5. IF A TEAM ROPER DRAWS OUT IN ACCORDANCE TO THE RULES, OR DOES NOT APPEAR BEFORE THE

PERFORMANCE IN WHICH THEY ARE TO COMPETE, THE PERSON ENTERED WITH THEM MAY ALSO DRAW OUT WITHOUT PENALTY, OR THEY MAY ASK FOR ANOTHER PARTNER FROM THE CONTESTANTS ALREADY ENTERED. ROPERS ALREADY ENTERED THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF TIMES MAY NOT BE UTILIZED.

6. A NO-SHOW ROPER WILL BE FINED THE AMOUNT OF THE ENTRY FEES WHICH MUST BE PAID BEFORE CONTESTANT IS ALLOWED TO COMPETE IN ANY OTHER EVENTS OR ANOTHER SJRA RODEO.
7. NO RODEO THAT COMPLETES ITS CONTRACT SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE RETURNING OF A

CONTESTANT'S ENTRY FEES IF THEY HAVE PARTICIPATED IN AN EVENT ONCE DURING THE RODEO.

8. IF A CONTESTANT IS INJURED WHILE COMPETING AND HAS NOT RECEIVED A MARKING IN THEIR REMAINING EVENTS, THEIR ENTRY FEES MAY BE REFUNDED, OR ROLLED TO A FUTURE RODEO.

TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

1. THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY TERMINATE A MEMBERSHIP, OR DENY RENEWAL OF MEMBERSHIP FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - A. USE OF ALCOHOL AND OR DRUGS
 - B. FIGHTING
 - C. HARASSING OFFICIALS
 - D. NON-PAYMENT OF ENTRY FEES
 - E. RETURNED/NSF CHECKS.
2. THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL SEND NOTICE OF THE SJRA'S INTENTIONS TO TERMINATE THE MEMBERSHIP AND THE GROUNDS THEREFORE, TO THE MEMBER AND THE PARENTS/GUARDIANS OF SAME MEMBER IN WRITING BY ORDINARY MAIL, ADDRESSED TO THE RESIDENCE AS IT APPEARS UPON THE BOOKS OF THE SJRA OR BY EMAIL.
3. IF NO REPLY IS RECEIVED BY THE SJRA SECRETARY WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER MAILING OF SUCH NOTICE, A SECOND AND FINAL NOTICE OF TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE SENT
4. IF A REPLY TO THE NOTICE OF INTENTION TO TERMINATE MEMBERSHIP IS RECEIVED BY THE SJRA, CONTESTING THE TERMINATION, OR PUTTING ANY OF THE MATTERS IN THE NOTICE AT ISSUE, THE SJRA BOARD SHALL SET A PLACE

AND TIME FOR HEARING OF SUCH CONTESTED ISSUES.

- A. SAID HEARING SHALL BE NOT LESS THAN 10 OR MORE THAN 30 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF CONTESTING REPLY.
 - B. SUCH HEARING WILL BE HELD BEFORE THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
5. IF THE CHARGES ARE SUSTAINED, THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL NOTIFY THE CONTESTANT OF THEIR TERMINATION.
- A. EARNED POINTS AND AWARDS FOR THE CURRENT RODEO SEASON, AND ELIGIBILITY FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR, IF REASONS WARRANT SUCH, SHALL BE FORFEITED UPON SAID TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP.
6. IF CHARGES ARE NOT SUSTAINED, THE MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE REINSTATED AND MEMBER SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR ALL EARNED AWARDS AND PRIZES.

TERMINATION OF ASSOCIATION DIRECTOR

1. THE SJRA MEMBERS MAY TERMINATE AN ASSOCIATION DIRECTOR OR DENY RENEWAL OF OFFICE OF ANY DIRECTOR FOR THE ENSUING YEAR UPON THE FOLLOWING GROUNDS:
- A. USE OF ALCOHOL AND OR
DRUGS
 - B. FIGHTING
 - C. HARASSING MEMBERS OR
OTHER OFFICIALS

D. RETURNED/NSF CHECKS

2. THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND/OR ASSOCIATION MEMBERS SHALL CAUSE NOTICE OF THE SJRA'S INTENTIONS TO TERMINATE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE DIRECTOR AND THE GROUNDS THEREFORE.
3. NOTICE SHALL BE ADDRESSED TO THE DIRECTOR IN WRITING BY ORDINARY MAIL, TO THEIR RESIDENCE AS IT APPEARS UPON THE BOOKS OF THE SJRA
4. IF NO REPLY IS RECEIVED BY THE SJRA SECRETARY WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER MAILING OF SUCH NOTICE, A SECOND AND FINAL NOTICE OF TERMINATION OF DUTIES SHALL BE SENT.
5. IF A REPLY TO THE NOTICE OF INTENTION TO TERMINATE DUTIES OF SAID DIRECTOR IS RECEIVED BY THE SJRA, CONTESTING THE TERMINATION, OR PUTTING ANY OF THE MATTERS IN THE NOTICE AT ISSUE, THE SJRA BOARD SHALL SET A PLACE AND TIME FOR HEARING OF SUCH CONTESTED ISSUES
 - A. SAID HEARING SHALL BE NOT LESS THAN 10 OR MORE THAN 30 DAYS OF RECEIPT OF CONTESTING REPLY.
 - B. SUCH HEARING WILL BE HELD BEFORE THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS
6. IF THE CHARGES ARE SUSTAINED, THE SJRA BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL NOTIFY THE DIRECTOR OF THE TERMINATION OF DUTIES.
7. IF CHARGES ARE NOT SUSTAINED, THE DUTIES OF SAID DIRECTOR SHALL BE REINSTATED.

ANIMAL WELFARE

1. NO STIMULANTS OR HYPNOTICS ARE TO BE GIVEN TO ANY ANIMAL USED FOR CONTEST PURPOSES.
2. NO LOCKED ROWELS OR SHARPENED SPURS MAY BE USED IN ANY ROUGH STOCK EVENTS. ROWELS MUST HAVE 5 OR MORE POINTS.
3. NO SMALL ANIMALS OR PETS ALLOWED IN THE ARENA, AT ANY TIME.
4. ALL TIE-DOWNS, NOSEBANDS AND BOSSALS MUST HAVE ANY CHAIN, METAL OR WIRE COMPLETELY COVERED WHERE IT COMES IN CONTACT WITH HORSES' SKIN.
5. NO SHARP OR CUTTING OBJECTS IN CINCH, SADDLE GIRTH, OR FLANK STRAPS SHALL BE PERMITTED. ONLY SHEEP SKINNED LINED FLANK STRAPS SHALL BE USED ON BUCKING HORSES, AND SHALL BE OF THE QUICK RELEASE TYPE. SHEEP SKIN LINED FLANK STRAPS SHALL BE PLACED ON THE ANIMAL SO THE SHEEPSKIN PORTION IS OVER BOTH FLANKS, AND THE BELLY OF THE ANIMAL. NO BULL TAILS WILL BE ALLOWED UNDER FLANK STRAPS.
6. ALL BAREBACK HORSES WILL BE HALTERED DURING COMPETITION.
 - A. NO "LOOSE ROPES" ALLOWED IN THE BAREBACK RIDING.
7. THE PLACING OF FINGERS IN THE EYES, LIPS, OR NOSE OF STEERS WHILE CHUTE DOGGING IS FORBIDDEN.
8. NO ANIMAL SHALL BE BEATEN, MUTILATED, OR

CRUELLY PRODDED.

9. STANDARD CATTLE PRODS SHALL BE USED AS LITTLE AS POSSIBLE WITH THE ROUGH STOCK EVENTS.
10. NO CATTLE PRODS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE CHUTES WITH EXCEPTION TO A BAREBACK OR SADDLE BRONC HORSE THAT STALLS AND ONLY WITH THE AGREEMENT OF THE CONTESTANT, STOCK CONTRACTOR, AND JUDGE.
 - A. CATTLE PROD WILL ONLY BE USED ON THE HIP OR SHOULDER AREAS AND ONLY WHEN HORSE TURNS ITS HEAD OUT OF THE CHUTE.
 - B. PRODS WILL NOT BE USED ON BULLS ONCE THEY ARE IN THE CHUTE.
11. LIVESTOCK TO BE REMOVED FROM THE ARENA AFTER COMPLETION OF ENTRY IN CONTEST.
12. CLOWNS ARE NOT TO ABUSE STOCK IN ANY FASHION.

EVENT RULES

MUTTON BUSTING/ CALF RIDING/ STEER RIDING/ JR. BULLS/ SR. BULLS TIME LIMITS TIME TO START WHEN THE ANIMALS INSIDE FRONT SHOULDER PASSES THE PLANE OF THE CHUTE. MUTTON BUSTING –

- CONTESTANTS WILL BE 6 YEARS AND UNDER (PEE WEE)
- SHEEP WILL BE RIDDEN FOR 6 SECONDS.
- CONTESTANTS WILL WEIGH A MAXIMUM OF 60

POUNDS.

- CONTESTANTS WILL BE WEIGHED IN AT THE FIRST RODEO
- IF WEIGHT LIMIT IS EXCEEDED CONTESTANT WILL HAVE THE OPTION TO RIDE A CALF THE SAME WAY THEY WOULD RIDE A SHEEP.

CALF RIDING —

• CONTESTANTS WILL BE AGES 7 — 10 (LITTLE BRITCHES). • CALF MUST BE RIDDEN 6 SECONDS.

STEER RIDING —

• CONTESTANTS WILL BE AGES 11 — 12 (JR. DIV) •

STEERS MUST BE RIDDEN 8 SECONDS.

JUNIOR BULL RIDING —

• CONTESTANTS WILL BE AGE'S 13 — 14 (JR. DIV) BOYS ONLY. •

JR. BULLS MUST BE RIDDEN FOR 8 SECONDS.

SENIOR BULL RIDING —

• CONTESTANTS WILL BE AGE'S 15 — 20 (SR. DIV) BOYS ONLY. •

SR. BULLS MUST BE RIDDEN FOR 8 SECONDS.

GENERAL RULES

1. CONTESTANT MAY NOT USE SHARP SPURS. NO PART OF THE SPUR MAY HAVE SHARP EDGES

INCLUDING ROWELS AND WIRE LOCKS.

2. NO CONTESTANT WILL RIDE 2 HEAD IN THE SAME EVENT DURING A RODEO, EXCEPT FOR RE-RIDES.
3. CONTESTANTS MAY PULL ROPE FROM EITHER SIDE.
4. CONTESTANTS MUST COMPETE ON STOCK DRAWN FOR THEM.
5. ALL ROUGH-STOCK CONTESTANTS, 15 YRS. AND UNDER, ARE REQUIRED, TO USE A PROTECTIVE MOUTHPIECE, HELMET, AND A PROTECTIVE VEST. FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION, NO EXCEPTIONS.
6. THE SJRA RECOMMENDS THE USE OF A SAFETY RELEASE DEVICE.

EVENT RULES

1. BELL MUST BE UNDER THE BELLY OF ANIMAL
2. RIDING IS TO BE DONE WITH ONE HAND AND A LOOSE ROPE, WITH OR WITHOUT HANDHOLD. SHEEP AND CALF RIDERS MAY USE 2 HANDS
3. NO FINGER WRAPS, KNOTS OR HITCHES TO KEEP ROPE FROM FALLING OFF AFTER RIDE
4. NO MORE THAN TWO ASSISTANTS MAY BE ON THE CHUTE TO PULL CONTESTANT'S ROPE.
5. THE JUDGE ON THE LATCH SIDE OF THE CHUTE GATE SHALL SERVE AS A BACK-UP TIMER IN THE ROUGH-STOCK EVENTS. THE JUDGE'S STOPWATCH READING SHALL BE USED AS A MEANS OF VERIFICATION WHEN THE LENGTH OF A QUALIFIED RIDE IS IN QUESTION. THE JUDGES

WILL STOP HIS WATCH WHEN, IN HIS OPINION THE CONTESTANT HAS BEEN DISQUALIFIED FOR ANY REASON, OR WHEN HE HEARS THE HORN SOUND, WHICHEVER COMES FIRST. IN EITHER INSTANCE, THE JUDGE WILL REFER TO HIS WATCH FOR TIME VERIFICATION ON EACH RIDE. IN ANY INSTANCE WHERE THE TIME IS EIGHT (8) SECONDS OR MORE ON THE JUDGES WATCH, THE CONTESTANT WILL BE ENTITLED TO A MARKING WITHOUT PENALTY. IN THE INSTANCE THE HORN IS SOUNDED BEFORE THE EIGHT (8) SECONDS, THE JUDGE MUST GO WITH THE HORN.

SCORING AND PENALTIES

1. FIGURES USED IN MARKING THE RIDING EVENTS SHALL RANGE FROM 1-25 ON BOTH THE STOCK AND THE RIDER, BASED ON HOW WELL BOTH PERFORM.
2. RIDE AND ANIMAL TO BE MARKED SEPARATELY
3. NO BELL - NO MARKING
4. IF CONTESTANT MAKES A QUALIFIED RIDE WITH ANY PART OF HIS ROPE IN RIDING HAND, THEY SHALL RECEIVE A MARK.
5. CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE NO SCORE FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OFFENSES:
 - A. TOUCHING ANIMAL, OR EQUIPMENT WITH FREE HAND.
 - B. USING SHARP SPURS (ROWELS)
 - C. PLACING SPURS OR CHAPS UNDER THE ROPE WHEN ROPE IS BEING TIGHTENED.

- D. BEING BUCKED OFF BEFORE 6 OR 8
SECOND HORN.
6. JUDGES MAY DISQUALIFY A CONTESTANT WHO
HAS BEEN ADVISED HE IS NEXT TO GO IF THEY
ARE NOT ABOVE THE ANIMAL WITH GLOVE ON
WHEN PREVIOUS ANIMAL LEAVES THE ARENA.

RE-RIDES

1. THE JUDGES WILL DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT A
RE-RIDE IS GIVEN.
2. CONTESTANTS SHALL NOT INFLUENCE THE
JUDGES BY ASKING FOR A RE-RIDE
3. IF RE-RIDE IS GIVEN, JUDGE SHALL INFORM THE
RIDER IMMEDIATELY OF HIS MARK AND AN
OPTION OF A RE-RIDE
4. THE CONTESTANT MAY REFUSE A RE-RIDE AND
TAKE THEIR MARKING.
5. THE CONTESTANT MUST MAKE HIS DECISION
IMMEDIATELY
6. NO RE-RIDE WILL BE GIVEN DUE TO FAULTY OR
BROKEN EQUIPMENT OF THE RIDERS.
7. IF RE-RIDE ANIMAL IS ALREADY DRAWN FOR
ANOTHER RIDER IN THE SAME RODEO, THE RIDER
WITH THE ANIMAL DRAWN WILL TAKE HIM
BEFORE THE RE-RIDE RIDER.
8. RE-RIDES MAY BE GIVEN ONLY WHEN STOCK
FAILS TO PERFORM, STOPS, OR FOULS THE
RIDER.
9. IF IN THE OPINION OF THE JUDGE, A RIDER
MAKES THREE HONEST EFFORTS TO GET OUT ON
A CHUTE FIGHTING ANIMAL AND IS UNABLE TO

DO SO, THEY MAY GET A RE-RIDE

10. RIDERS WHO ARE FOULED AT THE CHUTE AND DECLARE WILL BE ENTITLED TO A RE-RIDE AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION
11. IF ANIMAL FALLS DOWN OUT OF THE CHUTE, A RE-RIDE MAY BE GIVEN AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION
12. IF ANIMAL LOSES FLANK, FAILS TO PERFORM, STOPS, OR FOULS THE RIDER, RIDER MAY TAKE THE SAME ANIMAL BACK PROVIDING CONTRACTOR IS WILLING, OR THEY MAY HAVE A RE-RIDE DRAWN, IF SAME ANIMAL IS TAKEN, AND ANIMAL DOESN'T PERFORM AGAIN NO RE-RIDE WILL BE GIVEN AGAIN
13. RIDER MAY BE GIVEN A RE-RIDE IF FLANK COMES OFF OR BREAKS, PROVIDING THE RIDER HAS MADE A QUALIFIED RIDE.
14. IF PICKUP MAN, THEIR HORSE, OR CLOWNS, COME IN CONTACT WITH, OR SHOULD INTERFERE WITH THE RIDE BEFORE A QUALIFIED RIDE HAS BEEN COMPLETED, RE-RIDE WILL BE GIVEN ON THE SAME ANIMAL.

BAREBACK BRONC/SADDLE BRONC

TIME LIMIT

1. TIME WILL START WHEN ANIMAL'S INSIDE FRONT SHOULDER PASSES THE PLANE OF THE CHUTE.
2. HORSE MUST BE RIDDEN FOR EIGHT (8) SECONDS.

GENERAL RULES

1. EVENT IS FOR BOYS AGES 15-20 (SENIOR

DIVISION) BOYS ONLY

2. CONTESTANT MAY NOT USE SHARP SPURS. NO PART OF THE SPUR MAY HAVE SHARP EDGES INCLUDING ROWELS AND WIRE LOCKS.
3. CONTESTANTS MAY PULL RIGGINGS FROM EITHER SIDE
4. STOCK CONTRACTOR MAY CALL ON JUDGE TO PASS ON WHETHER RIGGING IS BEING SET OR CINCHED IN A MANNER THAT MIGHT HURT THE HORSE.
5. JUDGES MAY REQUIRE CONTESTANT TO TAKE HIS HAND OUT OF RIGGING AFTER A HORSE IS CINCHED. IF HANDHOLD IS TOO TIGHT, RIGGING WILL BE DECLARED ILLEGAL.
6. CONTESTANTS MUST COMPETE ON STOCK DRAWN FOR THEM
7. IN THE EVENT OF A MISTAKE, STOCK DRAWN FOR MUST BE RUN DURING THAT PERFORMANCE AND ONLY THAT SCORE TAKEN
8. NO CONTESTANT WILL RIDE 2 HEAD IN THE SAME EVENT DURING A RODEO, EXCEPT FOR RE-RIDES.
9. FALL - IF ANY PART OF RIDER CONTACTS GROUND IT WILL BE THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION IF THE ANIMAL HAS FALLEN.

EVENT RULES

1. TO QUALIFY, THE RIDER MUST HAVE SPURS OVER THE BREAK OF THE SHOULDERS AND TOUCHING HORSE WHEN HORSE'S FRONT FEET HIT THE GROUND ON ITS INITIAL MOVE OUT OF THE

CHUTE

2. ONE ARM MUST BE FREE DURING THE RIDE.
3. THE JUDGE ON THE LATCH SIDE OF THE CHUTE GATE SHALL SERVE AS A BACK-UP TIMER IN THE ROUGH-STOCK EVENTS. THE JUDGE'S STOPWATCH READING SHALL BE USED AS A MEANS OF VERIFICATION WHEN THE LENGTH OF A QUALIFIED RIDE IS IN QUESTION. THE JUDGE WILL STOP HIS WATCH WHEN, IN HIS OPINION THE CONTESTANT HAS BEEN DISQUALIFIED FOR ANY REASON, OR WHEN HE HEARS THE HORN SOUND, WHICHEVER COMES FIRST. IN EITHER INSTANCE, THE JUDGE WILL REFER TO HIS JUDGES WATCH, THE CONTESTANT WILL BE ENTITLED TO A MARKING WITHOUT PENALTY. IN THE INSTANCE THE HORN IS SOUNDED BEFORE THE EIGHT (8) SECONDS, THE JUDGE MUST GO WITH THE HORN.

BAREBACK BRONC

- RIGGIN MUST LIE FLAT ON THE HORSES BACK WHILE RIGGING IS BEING CINCHED

SADDLE BRONC

- RIDING REIN AND HAND MUST BE ON THE SAME SIDE
- HORSE'S MUST BE SADDLED IN THE CHUTE
- SADDLES SHALL NOT BE SET TOO FAR AHEAD ON HORSE'S WITHERS.
- MIDDLE FLANK BELONGS TO THE RIDER, BUT CONTRACTOR MAY HAVE RIDER PUT BACK CINCH BEHIND THE CURVE OF THE BELLY OF

THE HORSE.

SCORING AND PENALTIES

1. FIGURES USED IN MARKING THE RIDING EVENTS SHALL RANGE FROM 1-25 ON BOTH THE STOCK AND THE RIDER, BASED ON HOW WELL BOTH PERFORM.
2. RIDE AND ANIMAL TO BE MARKED SEPARATELY
3. THE RIDER SHALL BE MARKED ACCORDINGLY TO HOW MUCH HE SPURS THE HORSE.
4. IF A HORSE STALL COMING OUT OF THE CHUTE, EITHER JUDGE, MAY TELL THE RIDER TO TAKE HIS FEET OUT OF THE HORSE'S NECK AND THE SPUR OUT RULE WILL BE WAIVED.
5. CONTESTANT SHALL RECEIVE A NO SCORE FOR NOT FOLLOWING JUDGES' INSTRUCTIONS TO TAKE HIS FEET OUT OF THE HORSE'S NECK, WHICH IS STALLED IN THE CHUTE.
6. IF CONTESTANT MAKES A QUALIFIED RIDE WITH ANY PART OF HIS ROPE IN RIDING HAND, HE SHALL RECEIVE A MARK.
7. JUDGES MAY DISQUALIFY A CONTESTANT WHO HAS BEEN ADVISED HE IS NEXT TO GO IF THEY ARE NOT ABOVE THE ANIMAL WITH GLOVE ON WHEN PREVIOUS ANIMAL LEAVES THE ARENA

BAREBACK BRONC-

CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE NO SCORE FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OFFENSE:

- TOUCHING ANIMAL OR EQUIPMENT WITH FREE HAND

- TAKING ANY KIND OF FINGER TUCK OR WRAP
- RIDING WITH LOCKED, OR SHARP ROWELS, OR ROWELS THAT WILL LOCK ON SPURS
- RIGGING COMING OFF HORSE
- PLACING SPURS OR CHAPS UNDER THE ROPE WHEN ROPE IS BEING TIGHTENED
- BEING BUCKED OFF BEFORE THE 8 SECOND HORN

SADDLE BRONC-

ANYONE USING ANY FOREIGN SUBSTANCE OTHER THAN DRY ROSIN ON CHAPS AND SADDLE SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED, THE JUDGES WILL EXAMINE CLOTHING, SADDLE, REIN AND SPURS.

CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE NO SCORE FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

- TOUCHING ANIMAL OR EQUIPMENT WITH FREE HAND
- CHANGING HANDS ON THE REIN
- WRAPPING REIN AROUND HAND
- PULLING LEATHER
- LOSING A STIRRUP
- RIDING WITH LOCKED, OR SHARP ROWELS, OR ROWELS THAT WILL LOCK ON SPURS.
- SADDLE COMES OFF THE HORSE
- BEING BUCKED OFF BEFORE THE 8 SECOND HORN.

RE-RIDES

1. THE JUDGES WILL DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT A RE-RIDE IS GIVEN.
2. CONTESTANTS SHALL NOT INFLUENCE THE JUDGES BY ASKING FOR A RE-RIDE
3. IF RE-RIDE IS GIVEN, JUDGE SHALL INFORM THE RIDER IMMEDIATELY OF HIS MARK AND AN OPTION OF A RE-RIDE
4. THE CONTESTANT MAY REFUSE A RE-RIDE AND TAKE THEIR MARKING.
5. THE CONTESTANT MUST MAKE HIS DECISION IMMEDIATELY
6. NO RE-RIDE WILL BE GIVEN DUE TO FAULTY OR BROKEN EQUIPMENT OF THE RIDERS.
7. IF RE-RIDE ANIMAL IS ALREADY DRAWN FOR ANOTHER RIDER IN THE SAME RODEO, THE RIDER WITH THE ANIMAL DRAWN WILL TAKE HIM BEFORE THE RE-RIDE RIDER.
8. RE-RIDES MAY BE GIVEN ONLY WHEN STOCK FAILS TO PERFORM, STOPS, OR FOULS THE RIDER.
9. IF IN THE OPINION OF THE JUDGE, A RIDER MAKES THREE HONEST EFFORTS TO GET OUT ON A CHUTE FIGHTING ANIMAL AND IS UNABLE TO DO SO, THEY MAY GET A RE-RIDE
10. RIDERS WHO ARE FOULED AT THE CHUTE AND DECLARE WILL BE ENTITLED TO A RE-RIDE AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION
11. IF ANIMAL FALLS DOWN OUT OF THE CHUTE, A RE-RIDE MAY BE GIVEN AT THE JUDGE'S

DISCRETION

12. IF ANIMAL LOSES FLANK, FAILS TO PERFORM, STOPS, OR FOULS THE RIDER, RIDER MAY TAKE THE SAME ANIMAL BACK PROVIDING CONTRACTOR IS WILLING, OR THEY MAY HAVE A RE-RIDE DRAWN, IF SAME ANIMAL IS TAKEN, AND ANIMAL DOESN'T PERFORM AGAIN NO RE-RIDE WILL BE GIVEN AGAIN
13. RIDER MAY BE GIVEN A RE-RIDE IF FLANK COMES OFF OR BREAKS, PROVIDING THE RIDER HAS MADE A QUALIFIED RIDE.
14. IF PICKUP MAN, THEIR HORSE, OR CLOWNS, COME IN CONTACT WITH, OR SHOULD INTERFERE WITH THE RIDE BEFORE A QUALIFIED RIDE HAS BEEN COMPLETED, RE-RIDE WILL BE GIVEN ON THE SAME ANIMAL.

CHUTE DOGGING

TIME LIMIT

GENERAL RULES:

1. CHUTE SHALL BE PART OF THE ARENA DURING DOGGING EVENTS.
2. ONCE SCORE LINE (GYPSUM LINE) HAS BEEN SET IT WILL NOT BE CHANGED IN THAT GO.
3. SCORE LINE WILL BE PARALLEL TO CHUTE. IT WILL BE SET AT TEN (10) FEET IN FRONT OF CHUTE OR TEN (10) FEET IN FRONT OF STRAIGHTAWAY CHUTE. THE

MEASUREMENT WILL BE MADE WITH CHUTE GATE IN THE CLOSED POSITION.

4. THE LINE (BARRIER) JUDGE WILL FLAG THE

START WHEN THE ANIMALS' NOSE
CROSSES THE SCORE LINE.

5. STEER BELONGS TO CONTESTANT WHEN HE
CALLS FOR IT, REGARDLESS OF WHAT HAPPENS,
WITH THE FOLLOWING EXCEPTIONS:

A. IN ANY TIMED EVENT, IF ANIMAL ESCAPES
FROM THE ARENA, FIELD JUDGE WILL DROP
FLAG AND ALL WATCHES WILL BE STOPPED.
CONTESTANT WILL

RECEIVE ORIGINAL ANIMAL BACK WITH A LAP AND
TAP START. TIME

ALREADY ACCUMULATED WILL BE ADDED TO TIME
USED TO COMPLETE THE
QUALIFYING RUN.

B. IN CASES OF MECHANICAL FAILURE.

C. IF IN THE OPINION OF THE LINE JUDGE
CONTESTANT IS FOULED BY CHUTE,
CONTESTANT SHALL GET HIS STEER BACK,
PROVIDING CONTESTANT DECLARES
HIMSELF BY PULLING UP.

6. TIME SHALL BE TAKEN BETWEEN TWO FLAGS.

7. IT SHALL BE THE JUDGE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO
SEE THAT CONTESTANTS COMPETE ON THE
STOCK DRAWN FOR THEM. IN THE EVENT OF A
MISTAKE, STOCK DRAWN FOR MUST BE RUN
DURING THAT PERFORMANCE AND ONLY THAT
TIME OR SCORE TAKEN.

8. THIS EVENT SHALL NOT BE CONDUCTED WITH
AN OPEN CATCH PEN GATE AT ANY RODEO.

9. ALL STEERS SHALL BE TURNED OUT IN THE

SAME DIRECTION AND THE SAME CHUTE WILL BE USED. TIME LIMIT:

THERE WILL BE (1) MINUTE TIME LIMIT

EVENT RULES:

1. THIS EVENT IS OPEN TO BOYS ONLY.
2. AT ALL JUNIOR HIGH RODEOS, A STRAIGHTAWAY CHUTE MAY BE USED IN LIEU OF A BUCKING CHUTE. THE CHUTE MUST HAVE A GATE WITH AT LEAST THIRTY-SIX-INCH (36") CLEARANCE. IT SHOULD BE AT LEAST SIX FOOT IN LENGTH (6'). IDEALLY IT WILL ALSO HAVE A SIDE ENTRANCE GATE FOR DOGGER TO ENTER.
3. WITH STEER LOADED IN CHUTE, DOGGER GETS BESIDE STEER WITH HAND AND ARM IN FRONT OF SHOULDER OF STEER, OR BEHIND SHOULDER IF DOGGER DESIRES, AND CAN WRAP UNDER NECK. WHEN DOGGER CALLS FOR STEER THE CHUTE GATE WILL BE OPENED. DOGGER MUST MAINTAIN HIS ARM AND HAND POSITION WITHOUT IMPENDING FORWARD PROGRESS OF STEER. IF FORWARD PROGRESS IS IMPEDED BY CHOKING OR ANY OTHER MEANS, DOGGER WILL RECEIVE A NO-TIME. SHOULD DOGGER GRAB HORN OR EAR, A 10- SECOND PENALTY WILL BE ASSESSED. STEER MUST CROSS SCORE LINE BEFORE BEING THROWN OR STARTING TO SLOW THE STEER'S FORWARD PROGRESS TO START THROWING PROCESS. IF STEER IS THROWN BEFORE CROSSING LINE, IT WILL RESULT IN A DISQUALIFICATION SINCE TIME HAS NOT STARTED. DOGGER CANNOT DO ANYTHING TO START THROWING

PROCESS UNTIL TIME HAS STARTED IN THE FIELD.

4. IT IS THE CONTESTANT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO CHECK FOR BROKEN HORNS.

5. THERE WILL BE A DESIGNATED HELPER ASSIGNED BY THE ARENA DIRECTOR. THE HELPER CANNOT PASS THE PLANE OF THE CHUTE GATE.

6. CONTESTANT IS CONSIDERED WORKING THE STEER WHEN THE STEER LEAVES THE CHUTE.

7. IF STEER GETS LOOSE, DOGGER MAY TAKE NO MORE THAN ONE STEP TO CATCH STEER.

8. AFTER CROSSING THE START LINE, WRESTLER MUST BRING IT TO A STOP OR CHANGE ITS DIRECTION AND TWIST IT DOWN.

9. IF STEER IS ACCIDENTALLY KNOCKED DOWN OR THROWN BEFORE BEING BROUGHT TO A STOP OR IS THROWN BY WRESTLER PUTTING ANIMAL'S HORNS INTO THE GROUND, IT MUST BE LET UP TO ALL FOUR FEET AND THEN THROWN.

10. STEER WILL BE CONSIDERED THROWN DOWN ONLY WHEN IT IS LYING FLAT ON ITS SIDE, OR ON ITS BACK WITH ALL FOUR FEET AND HEAD STRAIGHT.

11. WRESTLER MUST HAVE HAND ON STEER WHEN FLAGGED.

12. CONTESTANT IS REQUIRED TO TURN STEER'S HEAD SO THAT HE CAN GET UP.

13. A STEER FALLING IN THE OPPOSITE DIRECTION THE STEER WRESTLER IS ATTEMPTING TO

THROW HIM (DOG FALL) THE CONTESTANT MAY CHOOSE TO TURN THE STEER'S HEAD TO CORRESPOND WITH THE LEG POSITION TO MAKE THIS A LEGAL FALL.

SCORING AND PENALTIES:

1. IN ORDER FOR TIME TO BE CONSIDERED OFFICIAL, BARRIER FLAG MUST OPERATE.
2. TIMED EVENT JUDGE WILL NOT FLAG CONTESTANT OUT UNTIL TIME IS RECORDED.
3. JUDGE IS TO FLAG TIME, THEN FLAG CONTESTANT OUT IF RUN IS NOT LEGAL.
4. CONTESTANT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FOR ANY ABUSIVE TREATMENT OF STEER.
5. CONTESTANT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF HE ATTEMPTS IN ANY WAY TO TAMPER WITH STEERS OR CHUTE.
6. TIME SHOULD BE TAKEN WITH THE AVERAGE OF TWO (2) TIMES AT ALL RODEOS.
7. DOGGER WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF ANIMAL IS THROWN BEFORE START LINE.
8. IF STEER FALLS ON ITS OWN BEFORE NOSE CROSSES LINE, STEER MUST BE LET UP AND NOT THROWN UNTIL STEER'S NOSE CROSSES LINE.
9. THERE WILL BE A 10 SECOND PENALTY ADDED IF DOGGER MOVES RIGHT ARM TO THE RIGHT HORN (THROWING POSITION) BEFORE START LINE. THIS WILL BE REFERRED TO AS BREAKING THE BARRIER.

RERUNS:

REFER TO STEER WRESTLING SECTION OF NHSRA

RULEBOOK WITH THE FOLLOWING CHANGE:

1. A STEER MUST BE RERUN BEFORE IT IS USED BY ANOTHER CONTESTANT. FRESH STEERS MAY BE ADDED TO THE HERD AFTER THEY HAVE BEEN RELEASED FROM THE CHUTE AND THROWN DOWN. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STEER WRESTLERS TO THROW THE CATTLE, AT A TIME MUTUALLY AGREED UPON WITH THE STOCK CONTRACTOR. OPTIONAL RULES:

1. A WHISTLE MAY BE USED TO SIGNAL WHEN THE STEER HAS CROSSED THE START LINE.
2. THE SAME JUDGE CAN BE USED TO FLAG THE START AND THE FINISH.

EQUIPMENT:

E. CHUTE DOGGING: REFER TO NHSRA STEER WRESTLING RULEBOOK WITH THE FOLLOWING EXCEPTIONS:

1. CHUTE WILL BE USED TO RELEASE STEERS
 2. GYPSUM, BABY POWDER, CHALK, ETC. WILL BE USED TO MARK START LINE IN FRONT OF CHUTE.
- LIVESTOCK REQUIREMENT:

1. REFER TO THE NHSRA STEER WRESTLING RULEBOOK WITH THE FOLLOWING

EXCEPTION:

A. FRESH STEERS ADDED TO BUNCH THAT HAVE NOT BEEN USED MUST BE BULL-DOGGED FROM THE CHUTE AND THROWN DOWN. IT IS THE

RESPONSIBILITY OF STEER WRESTLERS TO THROW THE CATTLE AT A TIME MUTUALLY AGREED UPON

WITH THE STOCK CONTRACTOR.

B. CHUTE DOGGING CATTLE WEIGHT
RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. A MINIMUM WEIGHT OF 350 LBS.

B. A MAXIMUM WEIGHT OF 475 LBS.

OFFICIALS:

1. THERE SHALL BE TWO OR MORE TIMERS, A FIELD FLAG JUDGE, AND A BARRIER JUDGE.
2. THE FAIRNESS OF THE CATCH AND THROW WILL BE LEFT TO THE JUDGES, AND THEIR DECISION WILL BE FINAL.
3. FIELD FLAGGER IS REQUIRED TO WATCH CONTESTANT AND STEER UNTIL ANIMAL IS TURNED LOOSE.
4. BARRIER JUDGE WILL STAND ON THE START LINE ON RIGHT SIDE OF THE STEER AND FLAG WHEN THE ANIMAL'S NOSE CROSSES THE LINE INDICATING THE START OF THE RUN.

 - WHEN STARTING ON THE LEFT BARREL THERE WILL BE 1 LEFT & 2 RIGHT TURNS ON

AROUND THE BARRELS

3. TOUCHING THE BARREL IS PERMITTED BY THE HORSE OR THE CONTESTANT
4. THE BARRELS MUST BE 20 FEET OR MORE FROM THE ARENA FENCE
5. DURING THE EVENT, THE ARENA WILL BE DRUG AT REGULAR INTERVALS TO BE DETERMINED BY THE EVENT DIRECTOR OR OFFICIALS
6. THE ARENA GATE MUST BE CLOSED IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONTESTANT ENTERS AND KEPT CLOSED UNTIL THE PATTERN IS COMPLETED AND THE HORSE IS UNDER CONTROL

SCORING AND PENALTIES

POLE BENDING

 4. DURING THE EVENT, THE ARENA WILL BE DRUG AT REGULAR INTERVALS TO BE DETERMINED BY THE EVENT DIRECTOR OR OFFICIALS

EVENT RULES

GENERAL RULES

1. CONTESTANTS WILL BE:
 - AGES 11 -14 (JR. DIVISION)
 - AGES 15 - 20 (SR. DIVISION)
2. ROPING BOX IS CONSIDERED PART OF THE ARENA DURING TEAM ROPING
3. ONCE SCORE LINE HAS BEEN SET IN TIMED EVENTS, IT WILL NOT BE CHANGED IN THAT RUN, NOR LENGTH OF BOX CHANGED.
4. LAP & TAP - NO BARRIER TO BE USED. FLAGGER IS TO FLAG TIME WHEN THE STEERS' NOSE CLEARS THE CHUTE.
5. IT IS ALWAYS THE DECISION OF THE BARRIER JUDGE WHETHER THE BARRIER IS BROKEN
6. SHOULD THE BARRIER BREAK AT ANY POINT IN OTHER THAN THE DESIGNATED BREAKING POINT, THE DECISION IS UP TO THE BARRIER JUDGE. IF CONTESTANT OBVIOUSLY BEATS THE BARRIER, BUT THE STAPLES ARE PULLED OR BARRIER ROPE IS BROKEN AND STRING UNBROKEN, BARRIER JUDGE MAY ASSESS 10 SECOND PENALTY. OTHERWISE THIS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED A BROKEN BARRIER

7. IF AUTOMATIC BARRIER FAILS TO WORK, BUT TIME IS RECORDED, CONTESTANT WILL GET A TIME, AND THERE WILL BE NO PENALTY FOR A BROKEN BARRIER
8. IF AUTOMATIC BARRIER FAILS TO WORK AND OFFICIAL TIME HAS NOT STARTED, CONTESTANT WILL GET STOCK BACK IF STOCK IS QUALIFIED ON IN THE FIELD, THEREFORE ENTITLING CONTESTANT TO A RERUN WITHOUT PENALTIES
9. IF AUTOMATIC BARRIER FAILS TO WORK, AND STOCK IS BROUGHT BACK, CONTESTANT MUST TAKE THAT ANIMAL OVER AT THE END OF THAT GO.
10. IF BARRIER EQUIPMENT HANGS ON ANIMAL AND CONTESTANT ATTEMPTS ON THE ANIMAL, THEY ACCEPT THE ANIMAL. IF CONTESTANT PULLS UP, THEY RECEIVE SAME ANIMAL BACK,
11. STEER BELONGS TO THE CONTESTANT WHEN THEY CALL FOR IT, REGARDLESS OF WHAT HAPPENS, WITH THE FOLLOWING EXCEPTS:
 - IN ANY TIMED EVENTS IF AN ANIMAL ESCAPES FROM THE ARENA, THE FIELD JUDGE WILL STOP THE FLAG AND ALL WATCHES WILL BE STOPPED. CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE ANIMAL BACK WITH LAP & TAP START. TIME ALREADY ACCUMULATED WILL BE ADDED TO THE TIME TO COMPLETE THE QUALIFIED RUN. IF TIME IS NOT RECORDED, THE CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE A 10 SECOND PENALTY FOR ANY LOOP USED.
 - IN CASE OF MECHANICAL FAILURE, IF IN THE

OPINION OF THE LINE JUDGE, CONTESTANT IS FOULED BY THE BARRIER, CONTESTANT SHALL GET THE STEER BACK, PROVIDING CONTESTANT DECLARES THEMSELVES BY PULLING UP, THEN TO THE LINE JUDGE. NO LOOPS MAY BE THROWN.

12. IN TEAM ROPING, HORSE MUST CLEAR THE BOX BEFORE LOOP IS THROWN.
13. TIME IS TO BE TAKEN BETWEEN TWO (2) FLAGS
14. IT SHALL THE ARENA DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT THE CONTESTANT'S COMPETES ON THE STOCK THAT IS DRAWN FOR THEM
15. JR. DIVISION, WILL HAVE A CLOSED CATCH PEN. SR. DIVISION WILL BE CLOSED
16. IF THERE IS NOT ENOUGH PARTICIPATES IN A DIVISION IT IS THE DECISION OF THE SJRA BOARD TO COMBINE THE DIVISIONS AND IT WILL THEN BE A CLOSED CATCH PEN.

EVENT RULES

1. AFTER STOCK IS LOADED, ROPERS MUST ROPE IN ORDER LISTED
2. EACH ROPER WILL BE ALLOWED TO CARRY ONE (1) ROPE.
3. EACH TEAM WILL BE ALLOWED THREE (3) LOOPS

6. ROPER MUST DALLY TO STOP STEER OR CHANGE DIRECTION
 - DALLY MEANS ONE (1) COMPLETE TURNAROUND THE SADDLE HORN
 7. NO TIED-ON ROPES WILL BE ALLOWED
 8. ROPER MUST BE MOUNTED WHEN TIME IS TAKEN
 9. STEERS MUST BE STANDING UP WHEN ROPED BY HEAD OR HEELS
 10. IF STEER IS ROPED BY ONE HORN, ROPER IS NOT ALLOWED TO RIDE UP AND PUT ROPE OVER HORN OR HEAD WITH THEIR HANDS.
 11. NO ILLEGAL CATCHES MAY BE REMOVED BY HAND
 12. NEITHER ROPER MAY REMOVE TO FRONT FOOT OR FEET BY HAND
 13. ANY HEEL CATCH BEHIND THE SHOULDER IS LEGAL IF ROPE GOES UP THE HEELS
 14. IF HEELER ROPES A FRONT FOOT IN THE HEEL LOOP, THIS WILL BE CONSIDERED A FOUL CATCH. HOWEVER, SHOULD THE FRONT FOOT OR FEET COME OUT OF THE HEEL LOOP BY THE TIME THE FIELD FLAGGER DROPS HIS FLAG, A TIME WILL BE GIVEN.
 15. IN CASE THE FIELD FLAG JUDGE FLAGS OUT A TEAM THAT STILL LEGALLY HAS ONE OR MORE LOOPS COMING, THE JUDGE MAY GIVE SAME STEER BACK LAP & TAP, PLUS ANY TIME ALREADY LAPSED AND ANY BARRIER PENALTY
 16. IF TEAM ROPERS CHOOSE TO ENTER WITH THE

SAME PARTNER TWICE, THEY MUST SWITCH ENDS.

9. ONE HIND FOOT RECEIVES A FIVE (5) SECOND PENALTY
10. STEERS MUST NOT BE HANDLED ROUGHLY AT ANY TIME, AND ROPERS MAY BE DISQUALIFIED IF IN THE OPINION OF THE FIELD JUDGE, THEY HAVE INTENTIONALLY DONE SO
11. IN THE EVENT A TEAM ROPER IS DISQUALIFIED OR INJURED, THAT TEAM WILL BE ELIMINATED FROM THE EVENT.
12. IF HEADER ACCIDENTALLY JERKS STEER OFF HIS FEET OR STEER TRIPS OR FALLS, HEADER MUST NOT DRAG STEER OVER 88 FEET BEFORE STEER REGAINS HIS FEET OR THE TEAM WILL RECEIVE NO SCORE.
13. IF ANY PART OF THE PUSHER BREAKS THE PLANE OF THE CHUTE GATE BEFORE THE STEER RELEASES THE BARRIER, THE TEAM RECEIVES A NO TIME
14. A BROKEN ROPE OR DROPPED ROPE WILL BE CONSIDERED A NO TIME
15. THE TIME SHALL BE TAKEN WITH TWO (2) TIMERS AT ALL RODEOS.

13. IN BREAKAWAY, THE HORSE MUST CLEAR THE BOX BEFORE A LOOP IS THROWN
14. TIME IS TO BE TAKEN BETWEEN TWO (2) FLAGS.

4. CONTESTANT IS ALLOWED TO USE APPROPRIATE PERSONAL EQUIPMENT OR CAN USE EQUIPMENT PROVIDED BY THE SJRA.

EVENT RULES

5. TOUCHING THE BARREL IS PERMITTED BY THE "HORSE" OR CONTESTANT.
6. THE FRONT TWO BARRELS SHALL BE 15 FEET FROM THE STARTING LINE.

7. THE MAXIMUM DISTANCE BETWEEN THE TWO FRONT BARRELS SHALL BE 15 FEET, ARENA CONDITIONS PERMITTING.
8. THE MAXIMUM DISTANCE BETWEEN THE TWO FRONT BARRELS AND THE BACK BARREL SHALL BE 15 FEET, ARENA CONDITIONS PERMITTING.
9. CONTESTANT MUST KEEP STICK HORSE BETWEEN LEGS OR RECEIVE A 5 SECOND PENALTY

SCORING AND PENALTIES

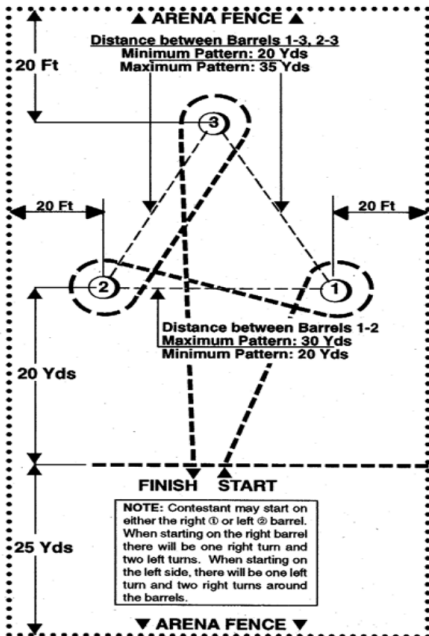

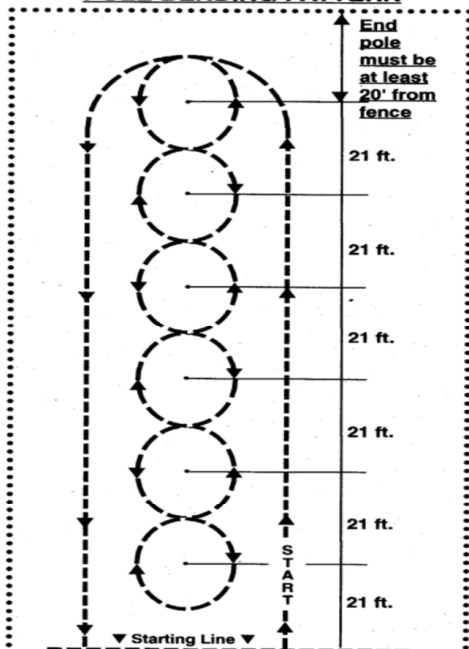
AMENDMENTS

BARREL RACING PATTERN



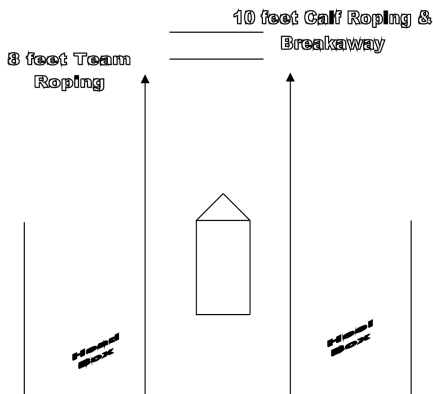
POLE BENDING PATTERN

ARTICLE I – PURPOSE

- CALIFORNIA 501(C)(3) NONPROFIT
- DEVELOP YOUTH RODEO ATHLETES

- PROVIDE SAFE, FAMILY-ORIENTED ENVIRONMENT
