#### From the Pastor's Desk

Advent begins. It can so easily become a frantic season of getting ready for Christmas: shopping, decorating, partying. Or, conversely, some folks are alone, perhaps mourning a loss or depressed or ill.

And then we look at the world around us—if we dare. Wars. Weather events. Poverty. Racism. Climate change. Political brokenness. Things are in a mess, and, if we are honest with ourselves, we are haunted by the question: Where is God?



The biblical texts during the season of Advent offer us insights, and yes, gifts, on how to live during this season. In particular, the readings for the first Sunday of Advent have much to ponder. The readings do not shy from asking the question of where is God, but rather face it head on, both naming and lamenting God's hiddenness. "O that you would tear open the heavens and come down," cries Isaiah." Restore us, O Lord of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved," pleads the Psalmist. "The sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken," says Jesus in Mark's Gospel, describing a state of godless catastrophe

We enter this first season of the church year— if we dare enter it at all — in lamentation. " Our world is not okay," is what these Advent readings declare in stark terms. God's apparent absence is not okay— it hurts. It hurts so much we can barely breathe from the agony of it.

The first gift of Advent is the permission to tell the truth, even if that truth is laced with sorrow. We are called to speak the whole truth: we need God. We need God to show up. We need God to stay. We need God to love, hold, deliver, and restore us.

The second gift of the season is less a gift than a discipline. It is the discipline of waiting. During Advent, we live with quiet anticipation in the "not yet." We stop rushing, and decide to call sacred what is yet in-process and unformed.

Thirdly, Advent prepares us for the God who is coming — a God who will turn out to be very different from the one we expect and maybe even hope to find.

So. Here we are, wrestling with the brokenness of the world and the hiddenness of our God. Here we are, voicing our laments and registering our yearnings. Here we are, waiting. Here we are, preparing ourselves for the God who is coming.

"Oh, that you would tear the heavens and come down." This is an honest prayer, and we need not



fear it. It's okay to pray into the silence, the hiddenness, and the absence. It's okay to struggle with Advent and its complicated gifts.

So pray and wait. Wait and pray. As much as you can, be patient. Be still. Hope fiercely. Deep in the gathering dark, something tender is forming. Something beautiful — something for the world's saving — waits to be born.






# God is with us!

According to Pastora Karen Castillo, President of the ILAG, 289 families have lost their crops in the storm and are looking at experiencing food deprivation without needed corn and seed to replant their crops again. #### **Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church**

#### If You Are Over 72

As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

#### At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.
