From the Pastor's Desk

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary *Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. 2 And suddenly* there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. 3 His appearance was like lightning and his clothing white as snow. 4 For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. 5 But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. 6 He is not here, for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. 7 Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." 8 So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy and ran to tell his disciples. 9 Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. 10 Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers and sisters to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

~Matthew 28:1-10

As I write this, Easter is still over a week away. We are currently deep in Lent, not yet into Holy Week. But Easter is coming, and it is disconcerting to be in the place of experiencing what we know is our future; to imagine what the Gospel tells us, to really enter into the story of Christ's passion. To find ourselves there, waving palms, participating in the shouts of "Hosanna!" while Jesus enters the city and of "Crucify him!" a few short days later.

To imagine ourselves sharing a last meal with Jesus, to feel him tenderly wash our feet, to share a first holy meal of bread and wine that are his body and blood. To follow him into the garden and run away after the authorities come and arrest him. To follow the events of the trial. To see him carry his own cross. To witness him stumble.

To watch him put on the cross, hear him groan, hear him forgive.

To be powerless to do something—anything—that might make a difference. We cannot help this man who has helped others. *(cont. next page)*

To mourn. We are there, confused, broken, unmoored from all we knew and hoped for.

This is the story we enter every Lent and Holy Week. And on Easter morning, we enter the rest of the story; we go, carrying our sorrow and our spices to the tomb, to finish death's duty. We go and we find things so changed; life rises from where death fell.

Our fear doesn't end, but our joy begins. And now, at last, we are given something to do, a holy mission. Go and tell. Bring the message to others. Let the news ring out throughout all time and all places.

At this unsettling time between Lent, the Passion, and the Resurrection, we do well to enter the story as we are able, to imagine ourselves as being fully present in the fellowship, danger, betrayal, confusion, sorrow, and the new life. To be resurrected and given holy work to do.

To be changed.

Civil Rights Pilgrimage

Join the Southeastern Synod as we take a Civil Rights Pilgrimage, including stops in Atlanta, Montgomery, Selma, and Birmingham.

We will begin our Pilgrimage at 9 am at St John's Lutheran Church in Atlanta and take a bus to the National Center for Civil and Human Rights. We will hop back on the bus, stop briefly at the MLK National Historical Park, then eat lunch while driving to the

Legacy Museum in Montgomery, Alabama. After spending time at the Legacy Museum and Memorial, we will board the bus to Selma, AL, to cross the Edmund Pettus Bridge. We will then head to Birmingham for a late dinner and an overnight stay. We will worship with and have lunch with Shades Valley Lutheran Church on Sunday. Before returning to Atlanta, we will stop at the 16th Street Baptist Church and Kelly Ingram Park. We anticipate returning to St. John's in Atlanta around 4 pm. <u>Click here for more information</u>.

"Start Over" Boxes Needed in Wake of Tornadoes in Selma, AL!

"Starting over" boxes are needed for families moving into housing after the tornadoes in Selma!

For Kitchen box: Pots and Pans, Dishes, Utensils, Glasses, Cups, Dish towels, Dish Soap, Small kitchen appliances, brooms, mops, and buckets.

For bathroom box: Shower Curtain, towels, washcloths, waste basket. For Bedroom box: Inflatable mattress Queen-size, Pillows, Clothes hangers, Linen, and blanket.
