The following is part of the Memorial Day service held at Living Word on Monday. I find this account from 1 Kings so powerful; Elijah is having a crises of faith. He bested the prophets of Ba'al in a sacrificial "cook off" and has been pursued by the army of Ahab and Jezebel. Jeremiah flees into the wilderness and seems to fall into a deep depression. Angels minister to him, encouraging him to eat and rest—good advice for all of us when things get difficult—and God tells the prophet to rest and get strong, as God is about to make Godself manifest to lead Elijah into new things.

Our congregation is being led into new things; is God speaking to us through Elijah's story to help show us the way?

#### 1 Kings 19:11-13

He [God] said, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by." Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind, and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake, and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire, and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?"

What are we doing here? We've witnessed the winds, devastating destructive winds of war, winds of hatred, fierce winds of violence, winds where God is not found.

GOD IS FOUND NOT IN THE WIND NOR IN THE EARTHQUAKE NOR IN THE STITE ... but in a still, small voice.

What are we doing here?
We yearn for holy presence,
to make sense of life.
To give purpose.
Life is out of control, like
an earthquake, upsetting foundations
we hoped were sturdy and steady.
But God was not in the earthquake.

What are we doing in this place, this broken, windswept, unsteady place? We looked for God in the fire, yearning to burn with holy passion and holy purpose. But the fire only wrought destruction and death, and God was not there. What are we doing here? We are faced with silence, deep, penetrating, all encompassing stillness. No words. Presence, holy presence beyond words, beyond worlds.

God was there, in the silene.

Speaking soul to soul,
heart to heart.

Calling us by name.

Asking us what we are doing,
here, now. What are you doing here?

A conversation begins,
silent and holy. A conversation
that leads to the choices we make,
the road we walk, the service we
engage in. Service to the nation,
service to the planet, service to the those
caught by the wind, the earthquake, the fire.
Service to all whom we meet on the way.

What are you doing here? Let your answer be service. Amen.



#### **Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church**

#### If You Are Over 72

As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

#### At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.

#### Senior Adult Programs at the Linda Kerley Center

The Linda Kerley Center (LKC) opened in 2017 providing services and activities specifically designed for those who are 50 years of age and older. The facility consists of two open areas, gym, kitchen, and billiard room. Programs at the Center include: exercise classes, line dancing, chair yoga, pickleball (even lessons!), bingo, arts and crafts classes, movies and so much more! There is something for everyone. Some classes have a small fee for which you can purchase a punch card.
