From the Pastor's Desk

Psalm 67 The Message

God, mark us with grace and blessing! Smile! The whole country will see how you work, all the godless nations see how you save. God! Let people thank and enjoy you. Let all people thank and enjoy you. Let all far-flung people become happy and shout their happiness because You judge them fair and square, you tend the far-flung peoples. God! Let people thank and enjoy you. Let all people thank and enjoy you. Earth, display your exuberance! You mark us with blessing, O God, our God. You mark us with blessing, O God. Earth's four corners—honor him! ~Psalm 67:1-7

What a jubilant text! And how good to let it guide our days, to choose it as the place to ground our faith, to live our lives.

We might think of Lent as a time to put away such expressions of joy, to live our lives only acknowledging sorrow, to be long in face and mournful in manner. It is most appropriate to realize the lack in our lives if God wasn't here, to know deep within us that we would be cast adrift on turbulent seas without God to anchor and guide us.

So it is with great joy that we can join the psalmist in recognizing God's character, God's love, God's movement in our lives and in our world. To thank and enjoy God. (cont. next page)

Even in our most difficult times, our times of greatest need, our times when we find ourselves in the depths, the best way to pray is to start with thanks. Thanks for God's love and care, or for the life of the loved one we have lost, or for the good seasons of our lives that seem gone now, or for guidance in the past that we might not feel extends to the future, or whatever the circumstance we are facing is. By starting out with thanks and praise for who God is, we remind ourselves not to treat God as a celestial vending machine or genie in a bottle who will fulfill our every desire. We recognize the otherness of God, who loves us with a parent's deep love, who cares for us.

Praising and thanking God is a wonderful way to begin to pray. And to live.

On Saturday, March 11, Epiphany will hold a Lenten Study led by Pastor LaVonne and lunch beginning at 10 am. The topic will be on experiencing spiritual practices, including walking a labyrinth, the practice of lectio divina, the meaning of mandalas, and a variety of other topics including prayer practice, tithing, fasting, pilgramages and more. The purpose of spiritual practice is to allow "head" knowledge to become "heart" knowledge, and to thereby become ways of reaching back out into the world. It is designed to strengthen our knowledge of ourselves and of God, that we might become stronger in both our faith and our witness.


Please RSVP no later than March 9, 2023 so we can plan for lunch!

Epiphany Financial Update

In January, tithing was 12% below budget. We will need to watch this carefully over the first quarter. Meanwhile, expenses were 9% under budget which to a large extent offset the tithing shortfall. However, we cannot assume this will continue throughout the year.

Civil Rights Pilgrimage

Join the Southeastern Synod as we take a Civil Rights Pilgrimage, including stops in Atlanta, Montgomery, Selma, and Birmingham.

We will begin our Pilgrimage at 9 am at St John's Lutheran Church in Atlanta and take a bus to the National Center for Civil and Human Rights. We will hop back on the bus, stop briefly at the MLK National Historical Park, then eat lunch while driving to the Lega-

cy Museum in Montgomery, Alabama. After spending time at the Legacy Museum and Memorial, we will board the bus to Selma, AL, to cross the Edmund Pettus Bridge. We will then head to Birmingham for a late dinner and an overnight stay. We will worship with and have lunch with Shades Valley Lutheran Church on Sunday. Before returning to Atlanta, we will stop at the 16th Street Baptist Church and Kelly Ingram Park. We anticipate returning to St. John's in Atlanta around 4 pm. Click here for more information.
