From the Pastor's Desk

Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. ~Isaiah 43:18-19

New things springing forth. Don't you feel it? God's own words, a divine promise.

We might take issue with the thought to forget past things, after all, the past is the foundation of the present and the future. In the context of the prophet Isaiah, writing to the people who are in Babylonian captivity, it is advice to not regard that captivity as a permanent status, but to inspire hope for a future of freedom and the ability to return to their homes in Israel.

But God always calls from the future. As we look to the way God is calling us, not in the wilderness but in western Tennessee, to do new things. To bring the message of God's love and comfort to people in our neighborhood.

John Garner and I have visited administration personnel at two area senior living facilities to talk about a team of folks from Epiphany coming to offer communion services on a monthly basis. Each facility has a memory care unit in addition to its regular unit, so we would do two services at each. The response we have gotten is very positive; there is a need and desire for services, open communion, and conversation.

Schilling Gardens told us that they have had no one offering spiritual care in their facility since before the pandemic began. The other facility is The Langford of Collierville and both are close to the church.

The plan is to hold a training session for lay communion ministers and to go to the facilities to hold initial services later in May. Already there are a couple folks signed up and it would be wonderful to have more. It is a ministry to others and a great opportunity for us to share God's love. It is truly exciting to see the new things God is doing. Doing through our hands, our efforts, our willingness to serve!




Diversity and Justice

Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church

If You Are Over 72

As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.
