From the Pastor's Desk

These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon of Judah sent to Babylon to King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon.

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, says the Lord, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile. ~Jeremiah 29:1, 11-14

The world is a terrible mess. According to globalcitizen.org, there are currently 27 ongoing armed conflicts worldwide. Nearly 59,000 wildfires burned across the world in 2021. Ten percent of the world's population go to bed hungry every night, with many facing starvation and death.

Not to mention disease, poverty, inflation, drought and flooding exacerbated by global warming, political and social unrest; it seems the list is endless. What is there to do? How do we begin to address any of it, let alone all of it? And where is God in all this mess?

These words from Jeremiah provide promise and hope; a road map to the future. God's message through the prophet was not for a quick fix; the omitted verses mention that if anyone comes with messages of immediate salvation, reject the message; it is not from the Lord. Instead, thye exiles were told, they should build houses and grow gardens, marry, have children, see their children

married and their grandchildren born. They are to live for the time being where God has sent them. Verse 7 is poetic and prophetic in what the exiles are to do now: "But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare."

This is where we are, I think. Perhaps we feel exiled from the lives we dreamed as situations seemingly out of our control continue to arise. This is not the world we envisioned, and yet it is the world we currently inhabit.

So, what do we do? How do we move forward?

Where is God?

God's words spoken through Jeremiah are brilliant. The people are informed about what is happening, and about how to deal with it. It is a long time that they can expect to be exiles, and they are to make lives for themselves while also looking forward to the day when their exile will end. God gives great hope and promise of that day, and instructions on how to live good lives in the meantime.

Following Jeremiah's stirring words, we seek the welfare of the city, of the nation, of the world. We pray on behalf of the planet and all its inhabitants. And we work toward mutual welfare. Don't try to do everything; identify something you are passionate about and focus your energies there, both for your welfare and the welfare those most closely impacted.

And we thankfully look to a better future, where our efforts and God's promises come together to make a future that is full of blessing.

Remember always, and remind God often that we are held in the palm of God's hand, and God will not let us go. Not in the current mess, not in the past, not in the future. God's got us!



Fall Outreach Project - Calvary Rescue Mission

Calvary Rescue Mission is a non-profit, independent, faithbased shelter for homeless men in Memphis, TN. They serve two full meals a day, offer clothing to the homeless, have a 2,500 volume library, and provide nightly chapel services, counseling, a discipleship program, and lodging.



Calvary has volunteer opportunities to help with the evening meals. The staff is served at 5 pm and the clients are served at 5:30 pm. Meals can be prepared in the Calvary kitchen or prepared elsewhere and brought to the mission. We may also partner with Living Word Lutheran Church for this outreach project.
