Ordinary Time

As we enter the summer and fall months, we leave the white of Trinity Sunday and our paraments on the altar turn to green for *Ordinary Time*. I think green is a good color for the summer months as everything has leafed out and is flowering. Ordinary Time is a time when we look at the teaching, miracles, and actions of Jesus. It is called Ordinary Time not because it is unexceptional, but because it is numbered weeks that were named after the Latin word from which we get the English word ordinals. Here we are, in the season after Pentecost that we sometimes refer to simply as "ordinary time." It's a long season, welcomed by the long days of summer. We might have preferred to settle into this liturgical season with a more relaxed approach, but the Gospel readings include stories like Jesus interrupting a funeral procession to raise the dead.

Everyone is understandably shocked.

Jesus has dinner and dishes out forgiveness to an uninvited woman who knew all too well of her sinfulness. The other dinner guests are left with more questions than before her interruption. After being turned away from a Samaritan village, the disciples suggest what sounds like divine genocide. Unsurprisingly, Jesus rejects that idea, and instead he reminds his followers of the interrupting cost of discipleship.

Whatever is "ordinary" about this season is surely overshadowed by narratives of interruption, by the sudden plot turns and by the incredible character conversions along the way. We may call it ordinary time because of its regular numbering within the liturgical calendar, but these stories invite us to wonder about our lives of faith between the ordinary and the extraordinary, between what we expect of Jesus and his ministry of interruptions.

As we settle into summer and into this long season after Pentecost, perhaps we should take stock of our expectations, of what it is we consider the "ordinary" work of the church. After all, Jesus may very well have something else in mind.

God of the (extra) ordinary, send now your interrupting Spirit upon our ordinary lives, our ordinary stories and our ordinary churches. Raise us from the dead. Forgive us. Convert us and invite us again into costly discipleship.


Epiphany Financial Update








June 2021 Social Ministries/Outreach Project - Hispanic Ministry Food Boxes

What's Happening at Home Place

The garden is growing and producing already! Lots of weeding and bed prepping accomplished in May, and we planted eggplants, cherry tomatoes, tomato varieties, zucchini, and more!

We're keeping our lawn equipment in good working order thanks to our mechanically minded volunteers. We are especially thankful for our new Judge's Club volunteers, who are a tremendous help in the garden, and for all the community members who have generously donated plants and other materials to grow our garden.

We also had members of Praharsh Lankapalli's Scout troop visit with us for several hours on May 22nd! During the first hour, we gave them presentations about the history of the garden, what we grow, how we're structured, where we donate, building healthy soil, garden rules, and Dick Wieland's excellent instruction on tools (name, what they're for, how to use) and the basics in using gas engine machines (tillers, mowers, weed eaters). For the second hour, the boys(& dads) spread compost & mulch on various beds in D. Thanks for your help!

AND we've already harvested over 75 pounds of veggies (turnip greens, collard greens, onions and turnips) which were donated to the Collierville Food Pantry!
