Stewardship Moment

As treasurer, I wanted to give an update on how things stand. Tithing is exactly on budget. Thank you for keeping up. Expenses are below budget. We are treading water as we have done the last couple of years. We are not cash strapped. If you have heard that, it isn't true. In fact, the council gave permission to invest in CDs with higher interest rate than our current account. Overall, we are doing fine but we do have some concerns going forward.



First of all, the mortgage on the land is an adjustable-rate mortgage (ARM) and is due to change in January. Obviously, the rate will go up from when we got it 5 or so years ago. We are very close to signing an agreement to sell the land. There is a 6-month due diligence period so we will have to pay the higher interest rate for a number of months assuming it takes the whole duration. If you want to hear more about that we can talk during Fellowship time.

Another item is that Candy and Wally will be leaving us in the next couple of months. They have been significant contributors both financially and as volunteers. The rest of us need to pick up their slack. Next week Dan will be talking about ways you can give in a tax advantage sort of way so maybe you can give a little more. Social Security, which a number of you are receiving, will go up 3.2% next year. Over the last 3 years, Social Security has gone up about 18%. If you have been giving a flat amount over the last couple of years, prayerfully consider increasing that because our expenses have gone up with inflation.

Then around volunteering. Wally is part of council so that will leave an open position. Prayerfully consider being part of council. He's part of the tech team. It's not that difficult. There are easy instructions to follow. If you'd like to take this spot starting next year, we'd greatly appreciate it. If you have any follow up questions, I'll be happy to share additional details.

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?" —Psalm 22:1

Dear church,

As Lutherans, we are accustomed to holding tension between two truths. Thus the ELCA denounces the egregious acts of Hamas, acts that have led to unspeakable loss of life and hope. At the same time the ELCA denounces the indiscriminate retaliation of Israel against the Palestinian people, both Christian and Muslim.

For the past week we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel and Hamas. We also watch a growing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel blocks food, water, fuel and medical supplies and as airstrikes continue to cause unbearable civilian casualties ahead of a just-announced ground assault. We see Israelis and families around the world in the agonizing wait for word about the fate of loved ones killed or taken hostage by Hamas. We are in anguish, grieving and praying for all people who are living in trauma, fear and uncertainty.

Among us are Palestinian Lutherans who are fearful for their families, their communities and their homeland. In our communities we have Jewish and Muslim neighbors, who are also facing the horrors of this crisis and its impact on their loved ones.

It is difficult to find words that suffice in the complexity of this moment, and in the web of relationships that bind us together, as church, with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our interreligious partners. Yet God has called us to be a people who stand with others amid suffering.

We must also call a thing a thing. The power exerted against all Palestinian people — through the occupation, the expansion of settlements and the escalating violence — must be called out as a root cause of what we are witnessing. We are committed to our long-standing accompaniment of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

The God who liberates us calls us to be a liberating witness. May it be so.



Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church

If You Are Over 72


As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.
