

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. God is in the midst of the city; it shall not be moved; God will help it when the morning dawns. The nations are in an uproar, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth. He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.

"Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth."

The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Psalm 46

October begins; I am looking forward to the cooler weather, apple and pumpkin treats, walks through crispy leaves that will start turning color late in the month. And the start of commemorations and holidays, both secular and sacred. A strange mash up of those is on the 31st, which is both Halloween and Reformation Day. I enjoy both of those events, but I must say that



the Reformation is something I reflect on often. Martin Luther and his comrades in that world-changing event have had deep impacts on theology, philosophy, education and literacy, the arts and music, the structure of society, the role of women—nearly every aspect of life was somehow influenced by the Protestant Reformation through the five centuries since Martin Luther hammered the 95 Theses to the Wittenburg church door.

There are so many things to consider about Martin Luther, both his strengths and his failures, but I'm considering his music just now. He wrote some 36 hymns, with the most well known being A Mighty Fortress is Our God, which has been translated into more than 200 languages. The hymn was inspired by Psalm 46. I cannot read the lyrics without hearing the tune, Ein Feste Burg, also written by Luther; do you hear it as well?

A MIGHTY FORTRESS IS OUR GOD

- A mighty fortress is our God,
 a sword and shield victorious;
 he breaks the cruel oppressor's rod
 and wins salvation glorious.
 The old satanic foe
 has sworn to work us woe!
 With craft and dreadful might
 he arms himself to fight.
 On earth he has no equal.
- No strength of ours can match his might! We would be lost, rejected. But now a champion comes to fight, whom God himself elected. You ask who this may be? The Lord of hosts is he! Christ Jesus, mighty Lord, God's only Son, adored. He holds the field victorious.
- Though hordes of devils fill the land all threat'ning to devour us, we tremble not, unmoved we stand; they cannot overpow'r us.

 Let this world's tyrant rage; in battle we'll engage!

 His might is doomed to fail;

 God's judgment must prevail!

 One little word subdues him.
- God's Word forever shall abide, no thanks to foes, who fear it; for God himself fights by our side with weapons of the Spirit.

 Were they to take our house, goods, honor, child, or spouse, though life be wrenched away, they cannot win the day.

 The kingdom's ours forever!






October Stewardship Month

Hands-On Al: Creativity with Artificial Intelligence In-Person

Investing in Epiphany Lutheran Church

If You Are Over 72


As many of you know, if you have an IRA investment account and you are over 72 you are required to take a minimum distribution from that account each year. What you might not be aware of is that you can make contributions to any charitable organization from this distribution and those contributions are tax exempt. It is excellent way to make a contribution to Epiphany. You should check with your investment advisor and find out how you can take advantage of this benefit.

At Any Age

If you have an investment portfolio with significant gains, ask your financial advisor about setting up a charitable donor-advised fund. You can transfer stock, mutual funds, etc. directly to it without paying capital gains and that transfer counts as a charitable contribution for your itemized deductions. Many investment companies sponsor donor-advised charitable funds (e.g., Fidelity, Schwab, Vanguard); some banks (such as Bank of America) offer them as well. You can then manage this donor-advised fund to donate to charities (including Epiphany) whenever you want.
