Psalm 137:1-6 Lament over the Destruction of Jerusalem

¹ *By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion.*

² *On the willows^[a] there we hung up our harps.*

³ *For there our captors asked us for songs, and our tormentors asked for mirth, saying, “Sing us one of the songs of Zion!”*

⁴ *How could we sing the Lord’s song in a foreign land?*

⁵ *If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my right hand wither!*


⁶ *Let my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth, if I do not remember you, if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy.*

I know we voted 31-3 to sell all or part of the property. I am in prayer for the 3 who voted “no,” and are disappointed, and I am in prayer for those whose “yes” vote was a less than full-throated, hearty “yes.” This was not an easy decision for Epiphany to make and we need to be gentle and compassionate toward one another. I hope we can believe that God has something wonderful in store for Epiphany’s future even though we don’t yet know what that is. As I thought about the outcome and about the likely future loss of our land, I thought of Psalm 137.

In this passage from Psalms the people of Judah are lamenting that Jerusalem and King Solomon’s Temple have been destroyed and that they have been defeated by King Nebuchadnezzar II. The brightest and best of their society have been taken away from their land in Judah and carried off into captivity in Babylon. Some of the less noble, less wealthy, and less educated Jews have been left behind as undesirable by Babylon. How insulting that must that have been felt by that group. I hope and pray we have no one who feels left behind or outcast due to this vote.

I think in voting to sell all or part of the land some of you feel like sitting down and crying by the rivers of Babylon or maybe the Wolf River. You want to hang up your harps for the song in your heart has been lost. You wonder how you will ever sing the Lord’s song in a new and strange land. And yet, like the people of Judah you are still struggling to remember Jerusalem and your faith and how it is your highest joy.

The good news for this Psalm and in the books of Ezra and Nehemiah, is that at the end of the story after 70 years in captivity the prophets convince the new Babylonian king, King Cyrus, to let 40,000 Jews return to Judah. In my cliff notes version of this story, Ezra and Nehemiah are provided with the materials to rebuild the Temple and the city walls by Babylon. While this happened the Jews faced many obstacles including warring enemies who stopped the work time and time again. Yet both the temple and the walls were soon finished.

Now the Jews had a city, a temple, and a home, but their spirits were feint and their faith practices had been lost over the 70 years in Babylon without a Temple or Torah. Consequently, Ezra has them all sit down. He reads the Jewish Pentateuch, the first 5 books of the Bible, to them. They are thrilled to hear the stirring words of God and weep in joy as they reclaim their spiritual heritage, laws, and temple practices. The people celebrate both the Passover for the first time in 70 years and the Feast of Tabernacles.

I, too, feel that if we keep our faith practices, read our scripture, pray diligently, and hold together, God will bless us, and we like the people of Judah will have a settled worship home and a garden. I think that God is going to bless Epiphany again with some sort of Home Place. I think God has plans for us. You are a faithful group who God will bless. You too will again celebrate as the people of Judah did.




Reopening Committee Update



Epiphany Financial Update

The Epiphany Council wants to keep everyone informed about our financial situation. This month we will take a look at the numbers from July 2020. Epiphany applied for and received a SBA PPP loan of \$12,500 at the end of May. This money will be used for salaries and rent during the pandemic. The PPP loan is included in our revenue.

The July numbers beat the projected July budget deficit by \$1,846.63.

The YTD numbers are less than the projected 2020 budget deficit by \$18,549.55. (This number includes the SBA PPP loan of \$12,500.)

- Figure out ideas help the "door to nowhere" be less obtrusive


We do need volunteers to bring equipment (please let Lois Ketcham know what you can bring):
