## 16 Days of Activism against Gender-based Violence 25th November to 10th December

### **DARLINGTON DISTRICT MWIB**

This is a campaign that seeks to eliminate violence against women and calls upon us to unite, take action and raise our voices for a future free from violence against women and girls. Wouldn't it be good if, as members of the Darlington District MWiB we could use these 16 days to learn more about the subject and pray about the situation and for organisations that campaign and offer aid.

Information has been taken from a Women of the North report: 'Inequality, health and work' and the National Police Chiefs report 23/24.

**7th December:** At church or in your MWiB meeting why not consider organising a candlelight vigil for a moment of solidarity and remembrance.

**8th December**: The Police and Crime Commissioner for each area is required to publish a Police and Crime Plan, find out how your commissioner intends to deal with domestic violence and abuse in their areas. Joy Allen is the PCC for County Durham and Darlington, and Matt Story is the PCC for Teesside.

**9th December:** Be a part of the MWiB support of the global 'Thursdays in Black' campaign, a movement that encourages people worldwide to wear black on Thursdays as a symbol of solidarity and protest against gender-based violence, including rape, abuse and injustice. The campaigns goals are to challenge the attitudes that cause violence and to advocate for a world where everyone is safe and free from fear.

**10th December:** The 16 days of activism ends today. Perhaps you can reflect on some thing that you have learned in the last 15 days and make a commitment to find out more and act. Interestingly today is the International Human Rights Day.

Message: Too busy getting ready for Christmas? Is that a problem for us too? It seems to me the Christian festival of Advent is fairly low-key these days. Maybe it is rightly a time for contemplation, but we don't quite seem to get the excitement or adventure there should be in this period, nothing like the anticipation we build up more solemnly during Lent in the lead-up to a joyful Easter. Are we too busy buying presents, preparing food, arranging visits – or to be visited – to think very much about Christmas until the day itself arrives? We should not disregard the irony within that statement of being too busy getting ready for Christmas. Without Advent, there would have been no Jesus, no resurrection, no Christian Church! How might it have been if back in history, other people had been too busy? How inconvenient it must have seemed to a busy carpenter in Nazareth to have to close his business and embark on a trek to Bethlehem just because the Roman occupiers wanted to take a census. How arduous was that particular journey for his heavily pregnant fiancee? The harassed innkeeper in Bethlehem was probably not cursing the Romans quite as much, after all, business was booming. But he could easily have claimed to have been too busy to bother finding a couple of strangers some space in his stable. What would have happened to those sheep out in the field if their shepherds had been too busy to look after them properly? Could those wise men from the east have found better things to do than follow a star? Advent is all about the coming of Jesus. If there have been times when we failed to recognise Him coming into our own lives maybe it is because we thought we were too busy. It would be a tragedy if we were still too busy? Too busy getting ready for Christmas so that we miss out on the real thrill, the excitement, and the suspense contained within the season of Advent!

We are approaching the time for us to carry out the next phase of the development work.

We are going to enlarge the entrance foyer into the worship space by installing a glass screen with 3 sets of double glass doors across the worship space with a roof and forming 3 large openings through the wall to the crush hall and replace the vinyl flooring etc. including the vinyl flooring to the worship space. This space will have its own heating and lighting and can be used for various events and booked for separate activities to the main worship space.

Work is planned to start on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2026 and will take 8-10 weeks, basically up to the Easter 2 weeks holidays. During that period there will be no access to the worship space and Janice is contacting all groups affected to make alternative arrangements. Everything will be moved from the crush hall and worship space before work commences and replaced on completion. Exact arrangements to be finalized but any help will be gratefully accepted.

We are also going to install blinds to the upper windows in the worship space in advance of the work on 17-19<sup>th</sup> December 2025.

Drawings will be put up in the worship space and main hall indicating the proposed works.
