3. Risk Assessments demystified: a brief overview.

There are two types of risk assessments that churches, projects, and Circuits need to do; one for buildings, one for activities. There is a third type of risk assessment, to do with people. These are not carried out locally. Contact Carolyn if you have questions about this type.



Buildings

Building Risk Assessments need to be done for all Methodist Church premises out by the Church Safeguarding Officer and the property steward annually. There is a <u>template</u> on the Methodist Church website which you can adapt.


Activities

Activity Risk Assessments should be done for all church, project, and circuit activities. These should be shared with those involved in the activity, and reviewed regularly. There is a <u>template</u> on the Methodist Church website which you can adapt.
