Address:

Today is the feast of Christ the King. It is a timely reminder that we all belong to the Kingdom of God with Jesus as our leader and our guide The gospel story is of the Crucifixion. It shows the pains Jesus endured for all our sakes. As Jesus is on the cross there were those who mocked him as the King of the Jews, asking him why he couldn't save himself. Jesus asks forgiveness for those who have put him on the cross. His death brings love and unity to our troubled world. As we approach the beginning of Advent and onwards to Christmas, we are reminded of the truth of these special times. They exist to remind us of who Jesus is. The Cross also defined Jesus as a King.
