Star making opportunities will also pop up in all kinds of places across the circuit.

Think of it like every star made is an act of prayer for the person receiving it.

Make as many stars as you can using your creativity – any size, any material!

STAR MAKING IDEAS:


- Knit or crochet a star
- Wooden stars (cut or craft)
- Collage or paper stars
- Fabric stars (sewn or no-sew)
- Painted stars on cardboard
- Beaded or wire stars
- Felt stars
- Clay stars
- · Origami stars
- Stars made from recycled materials

HOW TO START

Use the template overleaf to cut out stars or trace onto your chosen material.

Aim for a size roughly fitting in the palm of your hand.

Leave a **small hole in one of the spikes** to add a string or ribbon for hanging.



KNITTING PATTERN FOR A SIMPLE STAR

- 1. Cast on **5 stitches**.
- 2. Row 1: Knit all stitches.
- 3. Row 2: Increase 1 stitch at the start of every row until you have 10 stitches.
- 4. Row 3: Knit 2 together at the start of every row until 1 stitch remains.
- 5. Repeat this **5 times** for 5 points of the star.
- 6. Sew points together and stuff lightly if desired.

CROCHET PATTERN FOR A SIMPLE STAR

- 1. Make a magic ring.
- 2. **Round 1:** 10 sc into ring. Join with slip stitch.
- 3. Round 2: (Ch 3, 1 sc in next stitch) repeat around to form 5 points.
- 4. Fasten off and weave in ends.

ADDITIONAL TIPS

- Experiment with fabric, yarn, felt, paper, wood, or recycled materials.
- Add glitter, sequins, or buttons for extra sparkle.
- Ensure stars are durable enough to handle gently when handed out.

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
