SCRIPTURE INTRODUCTION & READINGS

(Bill)

Introduction to Scriptures: The apostle Paul wrote both 1 and 2 Corinthians. In 1 Corinthians 12 today, Paul speaks to the earliest congregations following his establishing the church in Corinth. The Christian congregation at Corinth is lifted up as a prime example of the remarkable diversity that could be found in the early church. Worshiping together were Greeks and Jews, slaves and free people, men and women, rich and poor, united only by their shared confession of Jesus as Lord. That first church is striking in its similarity to churches today, especially as spiritual gifts are named and explored. In John 2, we join Mary, the mother of Jesus, at a wedding to which Jesus and the disciples have also been invited. The Israelites always expect an excited joy underlying their weddings, and wine flows liberally. Mary learns that there is not enough wine for the occasion, but she has full confidence that Jesus will have an answer to the dilemma of running low on wine which would inhibit the success of the joyful festivities. Jesus does not disappoint either the guests, his mother, or God. The passage reveals much about the way Jesus will go about his next three years of healing and teaching.

1 Corinthians 12: 1-11 (NRSV)

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

John 2:1-11 (NRSV)

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk.

But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

May God bless the reading, hearing and understanding of these – His holy words. Amen!
