

Beginning knitting for crocheters

Have you ever tried to learn how to knit but just couldn't get it? If you are a crocheter and would like to give it another try, I would love to show you the secrets that I recently learned that got this crocheter over the hump! In this class we will learn how to cast on, to knit and to purl- all using the Continental Method. This style of knitting is similar to crocheting in many ways and transitions very quickly for the seasoned crocheter. No previous knowledge of knitting is required!

BEGINNER CLASS

Having a knowledge of crochet is very helpful, but not required. No knitting experience needed!

Instructional worksheet provided.

One skein/ball of extra chunky (#6) yarn. Wool works best due to its ability to stretch for the needles, but you may use acrylic if you prefer. Circular knitting needles size 15 (slightly smaller sizes will also work) with size 16 inch cable (a larger cable will also work). I prefer wooden needles for starting. Using circular knitting needles will feel a lot like a crochet hook.
