

Annie's Strawberries Table Runner

Annie's Strawberries Table Runner is a fun and happy table runner that would be right at home in your kitchen from Easter to early fall. This table runner is made using Annie McHug's Reverse Applique tools (Dresden Plate and Heart). With an assortment of pinks and reds on a white background it would have been at home on your grandmother's kitchen table. This project allows you to explore some applique techniques you might otherwise find daunting.

Supplies Needed for Class:

- Annie's Strawberries Table Runner Pattern
- Annie McHug's Dresden Tool
- Annie McHug's Heart Tool
- 1 1/4 yards of background fabric
- Assorted greens totaling 1/4 yard for strawberry caps
- 12 – 5" squares of Reds and Pinks for Dresden plate center
- 50 – 2 1/2" squares of Reds and Pinks for the Large Strawberries
- 96 – 1 1/2" squares of Red and Pinks for the Small Strawberries
- 12 – 16 – 1 1/2" X WOF strips in Reds and Pinks
- 8" square (fabric of choice) for center of the Dresden plate
- 1 1/2 yards of Pellon SF101 (there is a little extra in this amount to allow for mistakes)
- 1/2 yard of fusible (12" wide) [preferred fusible Hot Fix]
- Applique Pressing Sheet or parchment paper
- Glue stick, Glue Pen, or Roxann's Glue Baste
- 80 – 100 weight cottonized-polyester thread for applique in a color that matches the applique pieces
- 40 – 5- weight thread for accenting strawberries and caps. Variegated red and variegated green recommended.
- Basic Sewing Supplies (straight pins and pin cushion, scissors, seam ripper, fabric marking pen or pencil, small cutting mat (no larger than 12x18), and a rotary cutter)
