

RE: Statewide California Poll on Recalling California Governor

59% OF CALIFORNIA VOTERS WOULD CONSIDER RECALLING GOVERNOR GAVIN NEWSOM

Recent polling was conducted in California of likely voters for a possible 2025 Recall Election by David Wolfson, a national Pollster and Faculty Lecturer at Columbia University's Political Analytics Graduate Program. The April 1st & 2nd survey of California voters applied the previous 2021 Recall Election turnout and demographic factors post-stratified by Age, Gender, Race, Education, Party and DMA:


Q: Presently there are recall petitions circulating in California. Do you think Governor Gavin Newsom should be recalled from office?







Partisan Turnout from past 2021 Recall Election applied to April 2025 CA Poll:



"Californians are just fed up with their cost of living always going up, while their quality of life in California just continues to go down," said Randy Economy, Chairman of Saving California.

"Soaring crime rates, widespread homelessness, high taxes and gas prices, compounded by the wildfires mismanagement just keep hurting California," he added. "This poll shows people have real voter fatigue with the performance of Gavin Newsom as their Governor," he added.

"Moreover, we expect potential turnout for a possible recall election to look a lot different now for 2025." he concluded. "Unlike in 2021, Covid is not devastating our country, we are now under the Trump Administration, and the political environment in California is very, very different."

The survey polling mode was via SMS/Text to Web with a 95% Confidence Level, 4% standard margin of error, and n=657 completed responses. Due to weighting and rounded calculations, not all responses may total exactly n657. The polling was sponsored by <u>Saving California</u>, the campaign committee authorized by the Calif. Sec. of State to oversee the official Recall Campaign of California Governor Gavin Newsom.
