Making memories from the '30s to the '90s

Located in downtown Logan, in the heart of the Hocking Hills, the theater building was built in 1925 as a Masonic Lodge Temple and known as the Knights of Pythias Building. The theater's opening night was November 1, 1926 to a capacity crowd who watched "Jolly Tars" and "The Campus Flirt." Despite changing hands in 1934, a fraternal lodge continued to meet in the building, and a dance studio operated on the second floor for more than 12 years.

Phil Chakeres leased the building in 1936, upgraded it, and later purchased it in 1948 to be operated along with a chain of 37 other Chakeres theaters in Ohio and Kentucky.

In its heyday, the theater presented Vaudeville performances, singers, cowboy entertainers, famous live performers, and movies. Sammy Davis, Jr. performed on stage when he was a child.

Chakeres decided to close the theater in Logan, but there was one last short lived attempt at keeping the movie theater open. Unfortunately this did not prove successful and the last movie to be shown in the building was "Unforgiven" in 1992.

TODAY

In 2018, Logan Town Center, with a generous individual contribution and support from Citizens Bank of Logan (now Merchant's National Bank) purchased the building with the vision of restoring the building to a vital part of the community as a Theater and Community Center. From this the non-profit organization of Logan Theater, Inc. was born.

The Logan-Hocking Local School District is very excited about partnering with Logan Theater, Inc. for use of the 2nd and 3rd floors. The School District plans to use the 2nd floor for summer reading and intervention programs, along with evening activities and advanced coursework in the arts. This will provide a safe place for students to gather after school hours. Additional plans are to house a student created art gallery to display artwork for our community.

HOCKING COUNTY CHILDREN'S CHORUS

Providing an intimate performance stage area for the Children's Chorus on the 3rd floor is a dream coming true for this organization. The 3rd floor will provide a nurturing space for rehersals and performances along with space for administration and storage.

RENOVATION PLANS

SECOND & THIRD FLOORS

Along with providing space for the school district's students and Children's Chorus the areas will also be available for other performing and arts groups and organizations of the community.

BASEMENT - Renovations are planned for restrooms along with community meeting and activity rooms.

ELEVATOR - The elevator will be installed for service to all floors.

THEATER - Plans are to renovate the theater for the community and visitors to enjoy movies and live performances. Our goal is to maintain the heritage and nostalgia of the building along with updating the technology for such systems as sound, lighting, and environmental control.

IT'S SHOWTIME! The board members of Logan Theater, Inc. are dedicated to seeing this vision through. Renovation costs are estimated at approximately \$2.8 million. Funds from our Community Partnerships, grants and state funds are actively being pursued. These funds are not expected to cover the total cost. Individual and company donations are also needed.
