Vista Loop & Tower Loop Hikes

Mt. Broadhead, Railroad Grade, Wingard, Hopper House Hollow, Cross and Susquehannock Trails

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Vista Loop Trail

Mt. Broadhead, Railroad Grade and Susquehannock Trails

Loop Hike

- Start at the Water Tank Vista parking area (-A-) and proceed south (downhill) on the Mt Broadhead Trail. Take care crossing the guide rail and on the steep downhill immediately after leaving the road.
- Follow the Mt Broadhead Trail to the intersection with the STS (-B-)
- At (-B-) trun right onto the STS
- Follow the STS to the intersection with the Railroad Grade Trail (-C-)
- At (-C-) turn right onto the Railroad Grade Trail (RGT)
- Follow the RGT back to the parking lot (-A-) along Rt 44



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Tower Loop Trail

Mt. Broadhead, Railroad Grade and Susquehannock Trails

- Start at the Fire Tower (-D-)
- Parking is available around the tower (don't block access to the cabin) and at the vista a short distance north on Rt 44
- Cross Rt 44 and follow the STS to the intersection with West Branch Rd (-G-)
- Turn left and follow West Branch Rd to the intersection with Hopper Trail (-H-)
- Follow Hopper Trail to the intersection with Rt 44 (-K-)
- Follow Rt 44 back to the parking area and the start of the loop.

Notes:

- There are also parking areas on West Branch Road (-G-) \$ (-H-) and on Rt 44 (-K-) allowing for alternate start/stop locations.
- There are 3 connecting trails,
 Wingard, Cross, and Burrous which allow for shortening the loop, or extending the loop if desired.
- The Burrous Trail and Cross Trail east of the STS, from "E" to "F" provide another alternative loop.
- The new Cherry Springs Shelter, constructed in July of 2024 is located 0.3 mles from RT 44 on the STS.
