



Patricia (Fuller) LaBair was born March 5, 1938, to Lloyd and Katherine Fuller, one of three daughters. Pat—as she is known by, graduated from Capac High School in 1956 where she was active in Band, Basketball, Drama, and Future Nursing.

Pat married Duane LaBair on December 29, 1956. She attended Flint Junior College and graduated in 1969 with an Associate Degree in Nursing. Pat and Duane have four children – Mitchell – '76, Edward – '77, Lori – '79 (Bellor) and Gail – '90 (Crompton). Five grandchildren also attended Mayville Schools – Kendra 2007, Chelsea 2009, Conner 2014, Amanda 2008 and Allison 2011.

In 1974 Pat was hired by Superintendent Jerome Thienes, as the Mayville School nurse- a position she held for 32 years before retiring in 2006. While working as the School Nurse, Pat was instrumental in bringing the focus on health to the students. She also organized a Community Health Fair, arranged for the local Ambulance to visit the school for the students to tour and see the medical equipment firsthand, and she visited the classrooms from Kindergarten thru 12th grade discussing health issues. Pat also attended school board meetings and talked about health issues and concerns with the board members.

Pat's time as school nurse at Mayville spanned three decades and she recalls many fond memories of her time as nurse. How friendly the staff was, the teacher Margaret Isler showing her what a "nit" looked like during the outbreak of head lice, Bob Tallman and doing blood draws, as well as numerous visits to the classrooms.

Pat has been a very active part of the community; 4-H, Eastern Star, Fine Arts Council, Sno-Goers, Tuscola County Fair, Relay for Life Cancer Walk, and the Mayville Area Share Shop. Other activities included the scouts, band boosters, the Mayville Community Ambulance Service and she even was responsible for starting the Mayville Sunshine Nursery. It is no surprise that in 2000, Pat was honored at the Sunflower Festival as "Citizen of The Year." In her spare time Pat finds time for gardening, quilting, board games, water aerobics and of course her grandchildren.

Behind the Camera

On January 11, 2020, Robert McLane—known as "Bob" —from the Class of 1977, ran the Half Marathon at Disney World and although it wasn't smooth sailing and his pace was not what it once had been, he finished the race and crossed the finish line. Even two falls and a bloody nose couldn't stop him. He did not run for fame or for glory, or even for a Championship Title - but he ran to raise funds for Hope Water International - to provide access to clean water for children and families worldwide.

Some would say that for Bob, running a marathon wasn't extraordinary, after all, he ran the Boston Marathon in 2015 and he set a Cross Country

home course record with a time of 6:23 back in '75/76 during his Junior year in High School. Bob was also a member of the Cross Country Team that earned the first ever state championship for Mayville High School.

What did make Bob's recent marathon run at Disney exceptional was that on December 26, 2016 Bob was in a severe car accident on I-75 near Flint. A serious neck injury left him laying in a hospital bed with an uncertain future. With much hard work, determination, and more than 2 1/2 years of therapy, he was able to get back on his feet and back to running. There were bumps and bruises along the way, good days, bad days and in between days, as well as a surgery to repair his vocal cords and make breathing easier, but even that did not keep him down for very long.

It may have been a long road to recovery, but Bob kept on running and just recently began a new adventure on the road with his four-legged traveling companion Taz. They are driving across the United States, visiting friends and family along the way and exploring the sites and sounds of the country, that sometimes finds them leaving the roads and taking the trails. The Alumni Association is hoping that one of those trials will lead Bob back to the All-School Reunion and Alumni Dinner in June 2021.

Almost 45 years ago, the 1975-76 Mayville Cross Country Team won the first ever State Championship for Mayville Schools in any sport. The Cross Country Team had a perfect 9-0 dual meet season, with victories at the State meet, Regional, Conference, Thumb Championship, Delta Invitational, Vassar Invitational and Mar-



lette Super Saturday meets, along with a Third Place finish at the Eisenhower meet. The 1975/76 championship Cross Country team was coached by the late Robert "Bob" Weaver—(1928-2018) who earned the title of State Cross Country Coach in the fall of 1975. Coach Weaver attended Bowling Green State University on a Cross Country scholarship until being drafted into the US Air Force during the Korean War.

Doug Graham recognized for dedicated service to Mayville students, school

A famous sports figure once declared, "Nice guys finish last." Well, he obviously never met long-time Mayville educator Douglas M. Graham.

Graham, who dedicated his professional life to teaching a wide range of subjects, finished first in the hearts and minds of hundreds of students at Mayville Schools.

Though he retired from teaching in 1997 after a 33-year career, the beloved and respected Ag-teacher is now finishing first once again. The Mayville Alumni Association is honoring him at this year's annual Alumni Banquet for his long and dedicated service.

Perhaps known best for his role as school advisor for the Future Farmers of America during his entire teaching career, his pupils fondly recall him as a student's teacher – the kind of educator who took an interest in and cared about the personal lives of those he instructed.

When asked about their recollections of Graham, several former students posted on Facebook that he was a teacher who cared about his students inside and outside the classroom.

"I remember how you might be having a bad day, or having troubles at home, or other personal problems, and Mr. Graham understood – he'd cut you some slack and work with you," a student from the 1970s said.

Graham would not dispute those notions. During a lengthy conversation with the educator and his wife of 57 years, Barbara, in the four-seasons room of their modern farmhouse on Snover Road, he said he felt like a school counselor the whole time he taught classes.

"I came from the Brown City area, a rural farming community," he said, leaning back into his chair to reflect. "I grew up on a farm. My education started in a one-room schoolhouse - right up until ninth grade. So, I could relate to Mayville students in many different ways.

"I know a lot of the kids looked at me as a father-figure, or a big brother. I spent a considerable amount of time with them outside the classroom with farming, or FFA or 4-H projects. Naturally, their personal lives – both the joys and struggles – would come up and I'd try to help if I could. Sometimes, young people just need to know that you'll listen, that you care and that you have their best interests at heart."

That kind of dedication to young people and teaching paved the way for another first place finish for Graham. In 1984, Mayville Community Schools nominated him for Michigan Teacher of the Year and as a candidate for National Teacher of the Year.

The nomination noted his "creativity in teaching technique, ability in developing student interest, leadership and extensive knowledge of his subject matter."

The accolades are as impressive as the lengthy list of classes he taught in Mayville over the years: Vocational Agriculture, Conservation, Biology, Animal Science, Soil Science, Landscaping, Natural Resources, Physical Science, Farm Mechanics – and even Small Engine Repair, for crying out loud.

This year marks the 50-year anniversary of the Class of 1970 at Mayville High School. Like Graham, Class of '70 grads also will be recognized at this year's Alumni Banquet.

As Graham flipped through the pages of a Class of '70 yearbook, he fondly recalled the students whose youthful images stared back at him. For most of them, he had updates on the peaks and valleys of their lives. When asked if he'd ever been tempted to jump at several job opportunities – some offering substantially more pay and benefits – that came his way over the years, he was emphatic. No way.

"Well, of course, you think about the possibilities, but I never seriously considered leaving," he said, and Barbara agreed enthusiastically. "We made this our home for our family.

"I have no regrets whatsoever about teaching and living in this community. I loved the school environment, the interaction with the kids and the people here."

The Snover Road farm, located just outside Mayville, became home to the Graham family, including daughter Wendy and sons Alan and Aaron. Their children grew up in a farm atmosphere where they had regular chores and responsibilities. In the early 1970s, the children joined the Dayton Clover 4-H Club and exhibited market hogs and steers. Doug served as 4-H and FFA Livestock Superintendent for 25 years.

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Though retired, the Grahams remain active on their farm. They have many hobbies, especially gardening, setting up wildlife habitats, growing perennials and trees, and hunting in the fall with family members.

"I have four tractors now," he said, leaning back in his chair again and thinking about the future and number of machines to maintain. "Each one has its purpose, but I could probably scale back to three."


Barbara agreed with a knowing smile: "You could easily scale back to three."

15 New Athletic Hall of Fame Shines Spotlight on Wildcat Greats

Mayville Community Schools' greatest athletes, coaches, teams and boosters will no longer exist solely in memories, legend, and relative obscurity. Thanks to the efforts of local leaders, the greats are now scoring touchdowns, hitting homeruns, and running for glory in a newly established Wildcat Athletic Hall of Fame.


That's because the school district inducted its first members to the Hall of Fame during a banquet and ceremonies in the high school gymnasium last September. Five teams from 1949 to 1975, 10 individual athletes, one coach and three individual boosters were pulled out from the shadows and placed into the bright sunshine of honor for Mayville Wildcat Athletics.

Establishment of the Hall of Fame is seen by many in the community as long overdue and a great Mayville story in and of itself. But the Hall didn't just appear over night out of nowhere. Here's the story behind the story.

Two years ago, Mayville Superintendent Barry Markwart huddled with Athletic Director Mark Cooper and posed the idea of creating a Hall of Fame. Cooper jumped on the proposal like a linebacker chasing down a fleet-footed running back.

Markwart cited athletic Halls of Fame at two other school districts he'd had experience with – Ionia and Charlotte. He and Cooper also reviewed the Hall of Fame policy adopted by North Branch Community Schools. Using these districts as models, committees were formed to establish a set of guidelines for the Mayville Athletic Hall of Fame.

One of the first orders of business was forming a selection committee of retired teachers, coaches, community members, school administrators and former athletes to set the foundation for the Hall of Fame.



2019 was a very good year for donations to our Ca\$h For Cla\$\$ fund and our School Supplies fund. When the children come to school, it's bad enough that some of them have limited food and clothing at home and don't know where their next meal is coming from. They don't need to have to worry about school supplies. That is why school supply donations are so important. We should not have to witness a few privileged students with nice backpacks, full of supplies while other children are without. The supplies that we can purchase from donated funds means that **everyone** is **privileged!** What a boost to a child's self-esteem!

Again, as president of the Alumni Association I am thankful for the input from every alumni member and I am very thankful for donations large and small that enable us to have a positive impact on Mayville Students.




