The UNHCR gathered together to discuss solutions to this very challenging problem. Columbia wanted to help Germany by sending the military to the borders to make sure the borders were safer but Germany said that they could train their citizens to become police. Haiti wanted to gather information from refugees themself to report the problems they dealt with. Japan contributed \$10 million to border defense and is the 4th top donator to the UNHCR.
