300 Missiles, 3 Suspects, One 3rd Party

On December, 12, 3 cities were attacked by missiles designed and launched by an advanced artificial intelligence system. The attacks happened in Oslo, Vancouver, and Moscow. It would be normal for one party to claim responsibility for the attacks or for the attackers to remain anonymous, however, neither of these occurred. But rather, three nations claimed the attacks as their own, those countries being America, South Korea, and North Korea. Three days after the missiles detonated the United Nations held a meeting to discuss what actions should be taken. Early on in the discussion China said that they had closed their borders.

Germany proposed that legislation should be passed requiring all AI weaponry to be in a registry to increase trust on the international scale. While Japan and Spain argued that there is no place for AI in any military force. China and India argued for an investigation into the AI to find who's responsible and find the original code of the AI. Nigeria, China, Brazil, the UK, and Japan emphasised humanitarian aid as the biggest priority. Russia said that the primary goal of the global community should be bringing those responsible to justice. All countries that previously stressed the importance of humanitarian aid strongly disagreed. Jamaica entered the conversation for the first time using the most casual language of the meeting so far saying that a "feeling" had "come over him". A feeling that said until we know who is responsible, no action should be taken.

The South Korean president then claimed that they were not responsible, which added confusion to the already confused representatives. Investigations led by China and aided by countries like Russia and Norway discovered a blank boat floating in the Pacific that was holding up to 300 of the missiles previously used. All countries currently involved in the investigation, as well as Canada, launched military responses to the boat. At this time the people truly responsible for the attack remain unknown. Military efforts to apprehend the boat remained unsuccessful, and whatever was going to happen next remained a mystery to all but presumably those truly behind the attacks.

As if the world had not experienced enough terror during the conference, one missile hit Seoul, South Korea and three missiles hit Washington DC in the USA. This seemed to be a statement from a third party that those who claimed responsibility were lying, and this suspicion turned out to be correct. A cult that worshipped an AI called Gilbert was responsible for the attacks. Their motives are not exactly clear, but one could reasonably assume that the cult is in support of AI having greater control over humanity. This raises the question of what role AI should have in society, the government, and the military.
