Keeping Peace While Stopping Russia: Is it Possible?

Fear has been sparked throughout countries in NATO due to the possibility of Russia using short-intermediate range nuclear weapons. Delegates debated a solution to uphold peace among nations. This led to more ideas being expressed, such as embargoes and sanctions, which were supported by Poland, Canada, and Montenegro. Another idea, introduced by Türkiye, was radar infrastructure to see Russia's troops and equipment. Türkiye also highlighted that it was necessary to give up something for Russia to comply. Both Montenegro and Germany agreed, while Belgium believed it was wasteful. With these contrasting views, delegates had to keep their end goal in mind and work together to find the best solution.
