Reflections on the Spring Weekend

The 115th men's Cursillo in the Rockford diocese was held this spring March 27 - 30. It was an inspirational weekend, we had a great team and awesome candidates

The theme chosen for this weekend was "Here I am Lord" from Acts 9: 1-20. This was Ananias' response to the Lord after being called to bring the word of the Lord to Saul. Preparing for the weekend the team reflected on being like Ananias by answering the Lord's call to bring the Holy Spirit to the candidates. At the beginning of the weekend, the candidates were told of this theme and that they were being called by the Lord, through their sponsor, answered the call by attending the weekend. They were asked to be opened minded to hear what the Holy Spirit was telling them on the weekend.

One of my goals going into the weekend was to try and be well rested so I'd be as alert as possible the entire weekend. You might say that all these things were just a coincidence. You may also say that these were the devil trying to disrupt the weekend. On Friday, Fr. Kramer was able to help with confessions. Because of his health, we were unsure whether he'd be able to participate in the weekend. Father was also able to spend some time in the conference room, introduce himself, and share a few thoughts on the Cursillo with the candidates.

In the conference room late on Sunday things seemed to be going pretty well. We were all getting kind of tired and a little stiff from sitting all day and listening to quite a few talks. One of the candidates familiar with physical training, volunteered to lead the room on some relaxing exercises. This helped get us all back on track. This was another spontaneous activity.

"Make a friend, be a friend, and bring a friend to Christ." That must have been the reality of the Apostles, inspired by the joy of the Lord's resurrection. It revived their lukewarm faith and made them proactive in evangelization. I pray it may also prompt us to action, as it did the Apostles, to sow seeds for a fruitful harvest.

The motto of the Cursillo, "to make, be a friend, and bring a friend to Christ," was likely inspired by the testimony of the early church. Filled with the Holy Spirit, at Pentecost, they, led by Peter, sowed seeds that have endured over our two-thousandyear history, with over 1.4 billion Catholics under the new Pope, Leo XIV, as the successor of the first, Peter. The same Holy Spirit, through our Cursillo movement, invites and challenges us to join

the ranks as disciples and sow the seeds for a future harvest.

onward and beyond), the retreats help to revive the experiences of the early church with a sense of brotherhood and sisterhood that is better experienced than explained. It emphasizes the continuity of faith. It helps to strengthen our faith and connections with God and others in our parish and local communities. It creates a culture of belonging, not just to ourselves, but ultimately to God and His family—our brothers and sisters. We need to remember and share these realities and teach others about them. "The Holy Spirit... will teach...and make you remember..." John 14:26. We remember and need to share that the Cursillo weekend, followed by the Ultreya's, enlivens our faith and brings it to action. It helps us to see beyond words; directs our hearts on how to start personal invitations and lead others to Christ. Cursillo weekend encourages us to put our faith into action, strengthen our connections with our parish communities, and create a culture of belonging and prayer, "...for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit intercedes for us." Romans 8: 26.
