Phoenix Priest Appointed Associate State Chaplain for Arizona Knights

Reverend Gary Regula, Pastor of Saint Jerome Catholic Church to Help Provide Spiritual Support to the Arizona State Council and the State's 17,000 Knights

State Deputy Tom Kalisz, chief executive of the Arizona State Council of the Knights of Columbus, announced the appointment of Reverend Gary Regula as the Associate State Chaplain for the charitable fraternal service organization. Father Regula is the pastor of St. Jerome Catholic Church and School, located on 35th Avenue, North of Peoria Avenue in Phoenix.

The Knights in Arizona are currently served by Reverend Patrick Crino, Pastor of Ss. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Tucson, and current State Chaplain. Father Regula, as Associate Chaplain, will work with Father Crino to provide guidance and spiritual support to the leadership of the Knights and to each Knight found in every city and town in Arizona.

Father Regula, originally from Chicago, was ordained for the Diocese of Phoenix in 2000. He has served as Parochial Vicar at San Francisco de Asis Catholic Church in Flagstaff and then as Pastor at Santa Teresita in El Mirage and St. Benedict in Phoenix. In 2013 he was asked by Phoenix Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted to take over as Pastor at St. Jerome.

"I am what they would refer to as a delayed vocation, as I worked after high school as a Journeyman Machinist before doing my undergrad studies at Loyola University in Chicago," said Fr. Regula.

According to State Deputy Kalisz, he (Fr. Regula) was first noticed by Knight's leadership while he served in Flagstaff and worked with the local councils there to help them grow spiritually and increase their membership. This past Summer he was invited to speak to the Knights during their State Organization meeting.

When asked about his appointment, Fr. Regula said, "I am honored to be asked to serve the Knights of Columbus State Council in this role. The Knights I have had the privilege of working with in the various parishes are men of faith and service."

Tom Kalisz, as State Deputy said, "Arizona is such a large state to be served by one State Chaplain. Fr. Crino may not always be available to assist the State Council due to his parish obligations in the Diocese of Tucson. Father Gary is both a priest and a Knight and will make a great addition to our State Council family.


