Brothers,

It is my great pleasure to announce the appointment of the new Worthy Associate State Chaplain, Reverend Gary Regula. Fr. Gary is the Pastor of St. Jerome Catholic Church in Phoenix. Father will work closely with the Worthy State Chaplain, Reverend Patrick Crino, to provide the State Council with spiritual guidance and support. You will find the press release about his appointment elsewhere in this edition of the KOCO A. My thanks to Fr. Regula for saying yes to Our Lord to become a priest, for saying yes to the Knights of Columbus, and for saying yes to me to be our Associate State Chaplain.

In my message to you last month we were just beginning our Advent Journey. A month has gone by and we have just witnessed the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. There are several supporting themes that are found in the Christmas season. First and foremost is the birth of Christ. But before Jesus could be born, Mary had to say YES and accept a gift from the Holy Spirit so that God could become man. While Jesus was still in Mary's womb her sister Elizabeth gave birth to John the Baptist who would go before Christ and baptize in His name.

Our society likes to think of Christmas as the Season for giving. No, I do not speak of the commercialization of Christmas that tells society that they must buy stuff so they can feel good about giving things away to friends and family. That's nice and it partially right,

but not totally. First, Mary gave freely of Herself as a gift to God. God, in turn, gave her a gift, a son who was destined to save humanity. Joseph said yes to God so that Jesus would have a proper family. God gave to Mary's sister Elizabeth a son so that he could prepare the way for the coming of the Christ. \$185.6 million and 75.6 million hours of service worldwide. Our organization takes to heart that overriding commandment to love without hesitation, without limit, without string, and to give to others who are in need.

At our recent mid-year training session in Sierra Vista we touched on many of these same points. Without good solid programs we cannot attract new members and without new members we cannot expand programs that help those in need, nor to protect life.

There are three things we need to do in order to continue our good works: support the Altar, provide Programs and grow Membership. This is the essence of the AMP Philosophy: Altar Support + Solid Programs = Membership Growth. Supporting our priests and parishes is the first and vital step in the growth of our ranks. By wholeheartedly supporting the Domestic Church we gain the support and assistance of the pastor. Next, we must have good quality programs that support our faith, families, the community, and protect life at all stages. When we follow the AMP philosophy we will attract more men to our ranks.

At the mid-year meeting we distributed tickets and posters so that you can promote the State Charitable Raffle. Through the sale of raffle tickets, you raise funds for the State and local councils to support everything from Special Olympics to vocations. This is

one of the most important programs that deserves your generous support.

Once we help men to join the Order we must keep them. Our goal is to retain members, not lose them. Yes, follow the membership dues protocol, but also work with each member to identify what they need to stay a Knight. Some of the tools that can be used to grow membership include: increased communication such as the State website www.kofc-az.org, the KOCOA, @KofCMembership at Twitter, State Directory, Facebook, and of course, increased DD participation. I highly recommend that each District should build a membership team. Promote e-Membership.

Let's look at the Supreme Council's goals for Arizona and where we are currently: goal of 950 new members, we have 391; goal of 26 Star Councils, we have 1 Qualifier (#17036 at 325% Membership & 100% Insurance); goal of 2 new councils, we have 2; goal of 3 reactivations, we have 1. All these goals are easily attainable. All we need is you. Why are there are over 60 councils not having recorded any membership growth so far? All we ask is that is you Always Be Recruiting-ABR.

There are programs and subjects that also need your immediate attention. First is the Arizona Rosary Celebration. This program needs financial support NOW for next year's program to succeed. Councils, Assemblies, and parishes need to purchase ads today.

Every Council officer and member who is in a position involving contact with youth must comply with the Supreme Guidelines or will be relieved of their responsibility until they comply. Additionally, every Knight should comply with their diocesan safe environment or call to protect guidelines and training requirements. These are not options, but mandatory to keep our children safe.

Finally, the Knights of Columbus must comply with the respective IRS revenue laws for registering and receiving a Tax Identification Number or Employer Identification Number and submitting the appropriate IRS Form 990.

At our Formation and Knighthood Degree this past month in Carefree, I was pleased to name our Worthy State Executive Secretary, SK Rick Garrison, as the Class Honoree for the exemplification of these degrees. Without Rick, the State Council could not function. My thanks to Rick for all his help and patience. You can read more farther on in this newsletter.

Knights of Columbus Marian Prayer Program

Our Lady of Help of Persecuted Christians

Every couple of years, the Knights of Columbus introduces a new Marian Prayer Program. The new Marian image then makes a pilgrimage through each state or jurisdiction, with councils hosting a prayer service at their parish or other venues. The 2018-2019 Marian Prayer Program presents the 18th Marian image sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, this time of Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians. Since its inception in 1979, the Knights of Columbus' Marian Prayer Program has held more than 166,900 local council and parish prayer services with some 20 million participants. This year, the prayer service is intended to raise awareness of the plight of Christians persecuted for their faith and to stand in prayerful solidarity with them.

Tom Kalisz, State Deputy for the Knights of Columbus in Arizona will provide one of images he has been given for this program to the Arizona Rosary Celebration. The image will be on display in both Tucson and Phoenix during the Rosary celebrations in October. Please join the Knights of Columbus in Praying for the redemption of our persecuted brothers and sisters anywhere in the world.

AZ ROSARY CELEBRATION 2019

Planning is underway for the 2019 AZ Rosary Celebration (ARC) when we will honor Mary under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe on the weekend of October 18 – 20, 2019.

We have some changes coming this time. In Tucson, the Celebration will take place at St. Augustine Cathedral starting at 9:00 A.M on October 19, 2019 instead of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church. We also welcome DD #3 Frank Islas as co-chair with Karen McEwen. Al Tucker, who has served as co-chair with Karen these past few years is taking a sabbatical. In Phoenix, the event will take place on October 20, 2019, at the Phoenix Convention Center.

We are forming an advisory group to help us solicit and secure the necessary funds to support the effort. Joe Shanks, DD #13 will head that committee. To help us in that endeavor to fund ARC, we ask that every council and assembly have an item in their annual budget to purchase an ad in the Program Book. State Program Director – Lawrence Powers

Brother Knights,

We are half way through the Fraternal year. Is your Council on track for the Columbian Award? There are four required programs that each Council must complete to qualify. Over the next four months I will be featuring one of these programs. This month is Spiritual Reflection.

Many Catholic young people can attest that religious retreats are radically rejuvenating spiritual events that often leave a lasting impact on participants' relationship to their faith. Yet, so often, retreats seem only to be offered to students and youth. Working with their pastors, Knights of Columbus councils can hold low-cost retreats of their own. These events might be held for council members or men of the parish – or may be open to entire families. If councils are unable to organize these events themselves, they could go as a group and attend a retreat in their area to satisfy the requirement.

Guidelines for the Spiritual Reflection Program

The definition of a “reflection” is broad but should be a day-long event at minimum and could possibly encompass an entire weekend.

Councils can attend religious retreats and days of reflection organized by other groups. However, if they are attending a reflection and not planning it themselves, council attendance should be significant with at least 10 percent of the council or a minimum of 10 members participating.

Reflections and retreats can be held at the council level but councils could also collaborate with other councils in the area to host a Spiritual Reflection.

If planning a retreat for the council, consider holding it on church property and have volunteers pack lunch or provide their own meals to defer costs.

Be creative! Make a pilgrimage to a nearby basilica, monastery or convent. Celebrate Mass with the religious or your chaplain/pastor.

It is strongly encouraged that councils incorporate Mass within their program, celebrating the liturgy with your chaplain/pastor. Also, incorporate opportunities for other sacramental and liturgical activities such as confession, Eucharistic adoration, a rosary or all of these.

My Brother Knights,

I am honored to once again be serving as your State Membership Director. I look forward to working with you all as we grow the Order in Arizona. Remember, our Supreme knight has told us often that we have a Moral Obligation to offer the benefits of membership in the Knights of Columbus to every eligible Catholic Gentleman. Growing the Order is our number one responsibility since nothing else we do is possible without a vibrant growing membership. Including e-Members, we are right about where we were last year, and remain 14th in the order as a percent of our membership intake goal.

I spent today representing the Knights of Columbus at the annual Diocese of Phoenix Young Men's Conference along with General Agent Nate Raso, and Field Agents Wes Casaus, and Chuck Garcia. Hundreds of young men from the Diocese gathered at St. Bernadette Parish to pray, play, and engage in a powerful and inspirational program. One of the things that struck me while speaking to several of the young men at the conference was their lack of knowledge about the Knights. While the majority of these young men were less than or just 18 years old, and I would not expect them to have a strong working knowledge of the Knights, it was a bit disappointing nonetheless. I expect that most of these young Catholic Gentlemen, who gave up a day of their Christmas Vacation to attend the conference come from Catholic families with parents including a Catholic father. Lack of knowledge about the Knights evident in these young men probably means their dads don't know the Knights either and are surely not members.

Why is it that many of these young men and probably their fathers as well don't know about the Knights? They don't know who we are, or what we do or stand for. It indicates that we need to do more to promote the Order and the fine work we do. Every parish deserves an Knights of Columbus council with visible, relevant programs and an active plan to promote those programs and membership in the Knights.

Previous Membership Director Ken White spoke often of "AMPing it up". **A** stands for Altar support, working hard to earn and obtain support from the Pastor and priests of the parish. Supporting our priests is our duty. Support from our priests is priceless. **M** stands for Membership (and I'd also include Marketing), working hard to Inform every eligible Catholic Gentleman of the benefits of membership in our Order and promoting – marketing our programs, showing how indispensable our councils are to the parish. **P** stands for Programs.

Remember, *Always Be Recruiting!*


