### Faithful Friar's Message

He had cured many and, as a result, those who had diseases were pressing upon him to touch him." (Mk 3:10)

My Brother Knights, just last week we celebrated the Feast Day of St. Francis De Sales (Jan 24<sup>th</sup>), Bishop of Geneva, Switzerland and doctor of the Church. Francis lived in the late 16<sup>th</sup> and early 17<sup>th</sup> centuries. During his time, many people believed that the only way to live a life of holiness was by a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. Few, if any, believed that holiness could be achieved by being a lay person. Furthermore, it was believed that only contemplatives, people who withdrew from active participation in the world, could really achieve holiness.

Francis preached that every Christian was called to holiness and sanctity, regardless of their vocation. Each person could reach sainthood in the time and place they lived. This included married and single men and women. In holding to that belief, he laid the groundwork for what the Second Vatican Council now calls the "universal call to holiness." It reaffirms the teaching of Jesus and the early Church Fathers that every baptized Christian is called to sanctity, no matter what their career or state in life is. In every career and state in life, Christians can become more and more like Jesus Christ.

In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus walking among the sick and poor. So many people flock to see Him and to be in His presence. They came from all over Galilee and Judea. The Gospel says "those who had diseases were pressing upon him to touch him." I can imagine that some of the people who were

trying to get near Him had diseases that were difficult to be around - they probably looked, smelled, and sounded sickly. Yet Jesus did not avoid them. He was not afraid to be around them or to let them come near Him. He mingles with them, allowing them to touch Him and be healed. In this way, He makes Himself accessible to others so that others can experience the power of God's love for them.

We live in a culture that tends to dismiss the sick and the poor. We are told to avoid the sick because they can spread germs. We are taught to avoid helping the poor because they have some addiction or because they just want something from us. Society encourages us to make ourselves inaccessible to them.

As Christians, we are called to bring God to others and to share the transformative power of God's love for them, especially the poor and sick. Jesus, by His example, encourages us to be more accessible so that we can make God more accessible to everyone.

So let us heed the words of St. Francis De Sales, by pursuing holiness right where we are at, in the time we are living, as brother Knights of Columbus. And let us do this by following Jesus' example of making ourselves available to the needy, the vulnerable, and the sick among us.
