We'll wrap up with an EFF / COR message from Deacon Bruce and Father Arthur.



My Brothers,

Every November the Church prays especially ardently for the departed. My family called them "poor souls" (which has now become the term for Cardinals fans).

A few priests and I were recently reflecting on the many funerals we've been having in our parishes. Partly this is because of the size of our parishes in Arizona (i.e. much bigger than "back east"). Partly this is because of how important a funeral Mass remains to a grieving family and the recently deceased.

I'll be very frank: so many funerals can wear on us priests - not because they are morbid or sad - quite the contrary! We try our best to accompany a grieving family and community. We try very hard to treat each funeral for what it is: the unique celebration and memorial of an earthly life and prayer for entry into eternal life. As any family who has lost a spouse, parent or child knows far too well it is perhaps the most painful time of one's earthly life. Even with deep and firm faith in the Resurrection and Eternal Life there is heartbreaking sorrow in not having your loved one here physically anymore. It is also poignant and full of emotional rollercoasters. There is a joy in reunion of family and friends, laughter at funny pictures, videos and stories. There is also the attendant surge of sorrow remembering your loved one won't be physically present at this year's Thanksgiving Dinner or birthday party.

I speak from some experience this year. I continue to be so grateful to my brother Knights for your prayers for me, my mom, and sisters after Dad's passing in February. Although I have performed many funerals over 10 years as a priest, this was very different for me. Yet I recognize that each funeral is for a particular family's dad or mom or daughter or son or spouse or best friend. It is so important that we gather together in these moments to grieve, to remember - hopefully laugh a little - and to pray.

From time to time I will hear someone say they don't want to "cause a fuss" for their family and friends after they die: "Just move on and get on with life" they may say. I think I understand the sentiment and the desire to ease what will surely be a difficult moment. Yet, I try to remind them that funerals are also a







blessing to those who remain on earth. If someone has followed Jesus on earth we believe she or he will enter paradise after death. In that case, it's we the living (who still endure 120° Arizona summers) who merit tears.

But in all seriousness, it is cathartic and a work of mercy to attend to our grief by gathering in a sacred place at a sacred time. For similar reasons we remember these departed ones all November. In every rosary we say that we believe in "the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting." It's the Truth: tears are natural and important, as is the hope we bear that "God will gather us together again in the joy of his kingdom."

May all fallen Knights and their deceased loved ones rest in peace.



Happy November Brothers

I recently had the honor and the privilege to accompany the relics of the Mexican Martyrs to various stops in the state. What was most edifying to me was the sheer volume of people that came out to venerate the relics.

We had the relics at both the Tucson and Phoenix Rosary celebrations and from there they traveled with our St Chaplin, Fr David Halm, to his parish St John Vianney in Goodyear. They were there and were in the church for the students from the parish school and for two nights at holy hours. Both nights there was a line from the narthex to the Altar until almost 9:00 PM.

From there they traveled to St Mary Basha Catholic School in Chandler, where they were presented at the morning assembly by a student from Deacon Bruce Bennett's class to 400 students, parents, and staff. Later that day it was venerated at morning masses at both St Mary and Juan Diego Catholic Churches, and the evening Spanish Mass and Holy Hour at St Mary, again due to the demand lasting beyond 9:00 PM.

The relics then traveled to St John the Evangelist in Tucson, which held a mass for the students, a procession through the neighborhood followed by another well attend Mass and Holy Hour.

The Relics were then handed off to DD Larry Swanson who took them to St Ann's in Tubac, and later that day to Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish in Nogales for another Mass and Holy Hour lasting late into the evening.

The relics then traveled with DD Tom Felix to St. Patrick Church in Bisbee, St Andrew the Apostle in Sierra Vista, St. Bernard Catholic Church, Pirtleville.







The relics ended their Arizona journey in Douglas with a stop at Immaculate Conception and Ending with a Holy Hour and Mass at St Luke Catholic church attend by a large contingent of students from St Lorreta's.

Because of your tremendous efforts, we continue to add new members to our Order almost every day! While we did not set a record for members recruited in October, we did recruit the 2nd highest total ever recorded for October. Year to date, we have added over 500 men in the State of Arizona and are well ahead of our numbers for the same time last year. Keep up the great work!!!

One area we can improve upon as a State continues to be getting our new Prospects through a live C-U-F Ceremony so they can be transferred into your councils. Since July 1st, we have almost 200 men that have joined the Knights of Columbus in AZ that HAVE NOT attended a C-U-F Ceremony. Does your council have prospects that need to attend a C-U-F? Why not host one in the month of November and get those men added to your council roster? Also, please do not offer your prospects the link to the online C-U-F. That link should only be used for extreme situations. Every council should work to establish their own C-U-F Ceremony team and host regularly scheduled Ceremonies. The councils around the state that are doing so are also the councils that keep exceeding their membership goals year after year. A great way to achieve success is to emulate those that are already successful!

We are now 33% through the Fraternal Year. If your council still has not added any members this year, now is the time to act!! Work with your Pastor to schedule a Church Drive. We continue to have great success when councils host Church Drives, many times resulting in enough new members to reach your Supreme goal! Please post your Church Drives on the AZ State Calendar, so that the State Membership Team can assist your council in their efforts. Plan a live C-U-F within 2 weeks of your drive, to bring those new men into your councils! (Post C-U-Fs on the calendar too!) I highly recommend planning a Church Drive for now through December 14. Hopefully you can add a few members to assist with all of your council's Christmas Programs!







We'd like to see more church drives scheduled and placed on the state calendar in the Tucson Area. Click <u>HERE</u> to update the calendar online. If we know about your plans, we can help you.

Let's keep the momentum going! Our goal is to have 650 New Members by December 31st. I know we can do it!!!! Let me know how the State Team can help you reach your goals!!!

Submit your Forms 185/365 designating Brothers to serve in the required roles and ask them to complete the required training (and background checks where applicable) within 30 days of receiving the email. CONGRATULATIONS – September and **October** Program Incentive Winners

Council 1200, *Tucson Mother Ship*, is the winner of a \$250 Coats for Kids Donation for their participation in the Soccer Challenge.

They along with 6 other councils held their council Soccer Challenge. They organized with their parish school during PE and had a successful turnout.

In September, a total of 284 forms were submitted in September. (118 Faith, 90 Community, 56 Family, and 20 Life)

Council 7626, St. Joseph the Worker, Williams, AZ is the winner of a \$200 RSVP Donation for presenting the Silver Rose at 24 hour adoration at their parish. Council 7626 also participated in Coats for Kids and distributed coats at St. Joseph's in Williams, St. Ann's in Ashfork, and St. Francis in Seligman.

In October, a total of 360 forms, **A NEW RECORD!** were submitted. (149 Faith, 103 Community, 58 Life and 50 Family)

Much recognition to Council 4339 who distributed two cases of Coats to children on the Navajo Reservation, Council 17036, who teamed with their district and purchased 3000 Coats. WOW! And last to Council 13272, who purchased 336 Coats for Drexel Elementary, Roadrunner Elementary and the AZ School for the Deaf and Blind. 
Through District partnerships, councils can also purchase a large container of 110 to 280 wheelchairs for their own donation sites.

With Rejoicing Hearts - The Design


The Arizona Knights of Columbus State Pin has a copper background reminding us of the rich natural resources of our State.
