- Safe Environment Training Compliance Has the Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director, and Community Director completed the training?
- Fraternal Benefits Night The requirement is to host or attend 2 Fraternal Benefits Nights with either 10 or 14. The parish should be invited to these events! Work with your Field Agent to schedule in the month of May
- Form 1728 We have a few councils that are either at membership quota or close to membership quota that have not filled out the 1728. Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries, work together to get this done as soon as possible
- SP-7 Be sure to file this as soon as possible. File as early as possible in order that Supreme can review it in case there are issues and return back to you. Contact our Program Director Ben Jimenez (<u>programs@kofc-az.org</u>) if you need assistance.
- Membership You may be wondering why I am prioritizing Membership last. It's
 because this is what we should be doing every day. This is not a one time filing
 or event, this is something should be engrained in our DNA as Knights of
 Columbus. However, that is just one part of membership. The other part is to
 make sure to get them through a C-U-F Degree!

Thank you for all that you are doing to invite men into the Knights of Columbus, get them closer in their faith with Cor, and all the programs that you do modeling what Jesus has taught us. Together, we will have our Faith Transform the Culture!

Brothers all,

Every Friday morning we priests and deacons (and most religious brothers and sisters) pray Psalm 51 as part of the Divine Office, also called the Breviary. I won't take up the State Deputy's whole newsletter with the entire psalm, but a few lines are particularly apt to us Knights this Lent:

Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offense. O wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin. Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervor sustain me...

I encourage you to read Psalm 51 in your private prayer and maybe even in your next Council meeting or Cor activity. It is attributed to King David, written after his murder of Uriah and adultery with Bathsheba, in atonement and prayer for God's forgiveness. I'm quite confident no Arizona Knight is praying for forgiveness for similar crimes... but all of us have need of conversion and humble prayer before God. We have completed the first four weeks of Lent and in the coming month will complete this sacred season and observe Holy Week and rejoice at the Resurrection of Our Savior.

So, the psalm's prayer that God would "wash me more and more from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin" is deeply meaningful to us. As Knights we desire to be clean, pure, holy men. Importantly, King David includes here his prayer that joy would come back to him - we are not called to wallow in our shame or guilt, and the Lord doesn't seem to want to "rub our noses" in it. Rather, He came to give us life, and that more abundantly (Jn 10:10). I highlight the next line because I cannot think of a better passage for Knights of Columbus - who besides being holy men are fervent men! We have a spirit of fervor in all our prayer, charity, fraternity and the many activities we do. This fervor sustains us, keeping us united and drawing us deeper into the Chrisitan mystery.

Worthy Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries,

State and Supreme Assessments

It's important that councils pay all valid assessments. I have mentioned Arizona assessments a few times in this space. There are still Councils that have not paid their second half bill.

- State Per Capita is how the State Council's work is funded. The assessment is \$5.50 per billable member per half. Inactive members are \$2.25 per half. Honorary Life and Disabled members are not charged. Disabled members must be registered through Form 1831 with Supreme. Billing is based on the Supreme record of Council Membership as of January 1, 2025.
- Voluntary donations to the Navarrete Vocations Fund and to St. Joesph Youth Camp are also accepted.
- If you did not pay your First Half Per Capita, that balance will be included in the Second Half statement.
- Remember, Delegates from Councils that are not current on their Per Capita will not be seated at the State Convention.

In addition to State Assessments, each council also receives a bill from the Supreme Council. Failure to pay Supreme Assessments can result in a Council being suspended by Supreme. Financial Secretaries and Grand Knights, please review your Council Billing Statement in the Officers Online Reports Tab. If your Statement shows your Council is not current, please pay it right away to keep your Council in good standing.

Payments of State and Supreme Assessments are mandatory and do not require a council vote to authorize payment.

Brothers,

As we enter the 4th Quarter of the Fraternal Year, we need to continue offering the **gift** of membership to every Catholic man we meet. Many councils have already reached their Supreme Membership Goal, and are closing in on Double, Triple, and Quadruple Stars! We also have a large number of councils that are only 1 or 2 new members away from reaching their goal. Unfortunately, some councils are struggling to reach their goal.

We have good news for all of you!!! The State Team has formulated some plans to help all councils add more members in the 4th Quarter, giving everyone the opportunity to shine like a Star!!!

Low Hanging Fruit

As a state, we have over **600 prospects** that have signed up as Knights but not completed the C-U-F! We are asking all councils to do the following between now and June 1st, in order to maximize your chances of converting prospects into council members:

- 1) Schedule a C-U-F Ceremony at your council, preferably on Sunday in the Church. If that is not possible, many councils are hosting a C-U-F right before their monthly business meeting.
- 2) Contact EVERY (all 18) prospect on your list and invite them and their families to attend the C-U-F. Here's the most effective way we have found to contact them:
 - a) Phone Call
 - b) Email them 2 days later
 - c) Text them 2 days after the email

If you do not get a response after the 3 attempts, click the "Reject" button and select "Does Not Want To Transfer". In doing so, the member will be added to the State Council roster and come off of your prospect list. They can transfer into your council in the future if they decide to move forward, once they have attended a C-U-F.

My suggestion is you only reject the prospects from before July 1st of 2024. Keep the most recent prospects a little while longer, as they are more likely to join the council. Hopefully, this will assist your council in reaching your goal. If you need







a hand in hosting a C-U-F, or holding a church drive, please let me know. I will be glad to help in any way I can.

Quest for 20,000

We continue to have an amazingly strong year when it comes to recruiting. We continue to be well ahead of last year's pace, and we had one of the biggest months in our history for the month of March! We need every council's help to finish the year strong! As we start April, the State of Arizona needs only 200 more men to hit the 20,000 member mark. If each council recruits just 2 new members in the next 3 months, we can eclipse that mark before the end of the Fraternal Year. The key will be to get as many new recruits and existing prospects through a C-U-F Degree. Our goal is to have every prospect transferred into a council before June 20th. This will insure that your councils get the correct membership credit before the books close for the Fraternal Year on Monday June 30th. If you need assistance with a C-U-F, let me know. We can make it happen!

Church Drive Two-For-One

Church Drives continue to be our most successful way to recruit new members in a short amount of time. In recent weeks, we have seen councils that have not recruited members in several years hold church drives, and after just one day, they recruited enough members to qualify for Star Council! Is your council short on programs as well? If so, we have a way you can both recruit and get program credit at the same time.

Book a church drive between now and June 22nd. When posting it on the State Calendar, request one of the Pilgrim Icons to be at your event. Here's how the program works: As parishioners enter church for Mass, members of the council hand out the Prayer Cards that correspond to the Icon. During your recruiting pulpit speech, invite everyone to come to the Icon after Mass is over to pray together at the Icon. Once the prayer service is over, you'll have a group of people there that you can talk to about joining the Knights. We have tried this out with great success already, and it's a great way to demonstrate how the Knights of Columbus put our







Faith into Action!! After doing the prayer services, you can list the Pilgrim Icon Program on your SP-7 for your Columbian Award!

- Schedule a Church Drive and Post It on the State Calendar www.kofc-az.org/events-calendar
- ➤ Host an In-Person C-U-F Degree Within a Week of the Church Drive
- Contact All Prospects For Your Council and Get Them To Attend the C-U-F
 - > Transfer All New Members Via Officers On-Line That Day

Church Membership Drive Playbook

2-3 Weeks Prior

- Post dates of church drive on state calendar
- Run ads in church bulletin every week
- Organize teams of 6-8 brother knights for each mass
- Invite the Field Agent to help out
- Ask pastor/priests to promote the knights and encourage men to join

Day Of Event

- Greet parishioners before each mass
- Hand out K of C info to men and prayers cards to the ladies & children
- With Pastor's permission, give a 2-3 minute pulpit speech (note: have your best speaker do it, not always the GK)
- Conclude pulpit announcement by reciting prayer on prayer card handed out (members distribute more during speech)
- Cover all exits after mass. Greet everyone but identify men that might be interested
- Funnel prospects to the "closers" on your team. Have agent code and team membership numbers available.
- Assist candidates with completing on-line membership <u>and</u> have candidate confirm while standing there
- Congratulate and welcome your new brother knight (and his family) with a smile and firm handshake!!

The Following Sunday

- Host A C-U-F Degree Ceremony immediately after the last mass of the day
- Have The Ceremony in the church, of possible
- Host a luncheon/desserts & coffee/social event immediately after ceremony ends.

This will give you a chance to meet and learn about the new member and allow him to meet and greet his new brother knights!

- Ask new brothers to introduce themselves and their families before eating
- Have FinSec hand out membership cards before new members depart

We are finding that by following this playbook (with modifications unique to each council), we are having more success at not only getting members to join, but also getting them engaged early, providing the council with an influx of active members looking for programs to participate in.

Faith Transforms Culture - The Design

Each knight has to do each of the activities to keep that flywheel going: Recruitment, Engagement, Motivation, Evangelization, and Retention. The areas of focus for each of those activities are around Membership, Programs, Cor, and Insurance.
