

- ➤ Run Ads In Church Bulletin Every Week
- Organize Teams Of 6-8 Brother Knights For Each Mass
- Ask Pastor/Priests To Promote The Knights And Encourage Men To Join

Day Of Event

- > Greet Parishioners Before Each Mass
- ➤ Hand Out K of C Info To Men And Prayers Cards To The Ladies & Children
- ➤ With Pastor's Permission, Give A 2-3 Minute Pulpit Speech (Note: Have Your Best Speaker Do It, Not Always The GK)
- Conclude Pulpit Announcement By Reciting Prayer On Prayer Card Handed Out (Members Distribute More During Speech)
- ➤ Cover All Exits After Mass. Greet Everyone But Identify Men That Might Be Interested
- Funnel Prospects To The "Closers" On Your Team. Have Agent Code And Team Membership Numbers Available.
- ➤ Assist Candidates With Completing On-Line Membership **AND** Have Candidate Confirm While Standing There
- Congratulate And Welcome Your New Brother Knight (And His Family) With A Smile And Firm Handshake!!







The Following Sunday

- Host A C-U-F Degree Ceremony Immediately After The Last Mass Of The Day
- ➤ Have The Ceremony In The Church If Possible
- ➤ Host A Luncheon/Desserts & Coffee/Social Event Immediately After Ceremony Ends
- ➤ Ask New Brothers To Introduce Themselves And Their Families Before Eating
- Have FinSec Hand Out Membership Cards Before New Members Depart

Two new programs have been added to Faith in Action.

Bright Futures

- The Bright Futures program invites councils to support students and schools in their communities. Too often, youth face significant barriers to their educational success. Councils can help by providing funding and resources to those most in need.
- Councils can contact schools, teachers, and parishioners with schoolaged children and ask what they need. The following projects are popular ways to provide support: fundraising for tuition or items, run a book drive for a youth library, or participate in beautification projects for the schools in the area.

Suggested Program Dates: Back-to-School Week, Black Friday, Boxing Day, 3 King's Day (Jan. 6), and Catholic Schools Week (last week of January).







Those councils that have schools in their parishes, please meet with your school administration now to plan ahead. The school principals can direct you as to what assistance they may need.

Celebrating Our Catholic Heritage

- The Celebrating Our Catholic Heritage program encourages councils to celebrate the cultures and traditions of their parish communities. This program aims to educate, inspire, and unite the community while celebrating the deep-rooted faith and cultural heritage of its members.
- A parish festival is a fun, family-friendly event that can draw attendees from throughout the community. These events can celebrate the cultural heritage and devotions of the members of their parish communities. Parish festivals and other events can feature the food, music, art, and Catholic devotions of the countries or cultures represented in their areas.
- Many councils and parishes are already celebrating their Catholic Heritage with the church fiestas they hold. Examples: Hispanic Independence, Las Posadas at Christmas, Cinco De Mayo, Polish Dinners, Octoberfest, Hawaiian Luau, St. Patrick Day Dinners, etc.

Coats for Kids BOGO

The Knights of Columbus has worked closely with our supplier, Knights Gear, to secure high-quality coats at an affordable price for this year's Coats for Kids program. As in previous years, the final cost of coats reflects several external factors. Due to increased costs for the programs, prices for coats have increased by \$3 per coat (\$36 per case of 12 coats) for toddler, child, youth, teen, and adult size coats. Lightweight coats have increased by \$1.50 per coat (\$36 per case of 24 coats). Please visit the Coats for Kids pages on Knights Gear.

Councils that wish to apply for the BOGO, must submit their proposals so the State Deputy can forward to Supreme by September 15. For example, find a specific group in need of coats. The last two years, the Florence council has purchased coats for school children in the Native American Indian areas of the state. In year one, the council purchased all the coats. Last year, they teamed with other councils and proposed the BOGO for Schools in San Carlos, Globe, Sacaton, Bapchule, and Window Rock. Councils, please team up with other councils or districts and take advantage of the BOGO.

- School/Church or Organization receiving the coats and their need
- Funding/Recruiting (Ex: Coats will be purchased by local councils, fundraising and promoting Coats for Kids. Utilizing pulpit announcements, fundraising at FIA program events, and after Mass. Of course, <u>always</u> mention opportunities to recruit new men to the order.
- Area Demographics (Ex. The St. Michael Mission School area consists of one out of every 3.9 residents lives under the poverty line. Low-income families living in a poverty area.)

CONGRATULATIONS - May & June Program Incentive Winners

June – **Council 8854, St. John the Evangelist,** Tucson, the winner of a \$100 St. Joseph's Youth Camp Donation for the Sacred Heart of Jesus Program Icon. They, along with 11 councils, submitted Faith and Family 10784s. A total of 235 forms were submitted in June. (105 Faith, 66 Community, 39 Family, and 25 Life)

"The Knights of Columbus in Arizona have embraced the **Cor Initiative**, a Christ-centered program designed to deepen the faith and fraternity of Catholic men. COR, Latin for "heart," focuses on prayer, formation, and brotherhood, aiming to form men into missionary disciples with the heart of a father."

"At St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in Phoenix, Council #9287 has launched a monthly COR gathering, led by Deacon Matt Murphy. These meetings, held every third Thursday at 7:00 PM, provide a space for men to grow spiritually and build strong bonds of brotherhood."

"Cor dialogs are gaining momentum across the state, with councils adopting various formats to suit their communities. Some councils integrate Cor with existing programs like "That Man Is You!" or "Into the Breach," offering a flexible approach to men's ministry."

The previous quotations are from numerous sources throughout Arizona.

To close, this is what the Supreme website says about Cor: "The world needs courageous men to witness and develop a relationship with Jesus. Cor exists to form and strengthen Catholic men in faith and virtue as missionary disciples by drawing them into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through prayer, formation, and fraternity."

Life Director's Message

Greetings Brothers,

We begin a new fraternal year with the challenge to support and defend life still before us. We must stand up for life and actively show with our faith and actions the love that will change hearts to the cause. It is in living faithfully what we believe that others come to know God's love and plan for us.

I am committed to help with your council's Life Programs and make them successful. Just drop me a note and we can discuss ways you or your council can get involved in supporting Life in AZ.

There are several programs the Knights sponsor to help you, and your councils make a difference. Please make as many of these programs as part of your planning and execution for the year.

- **1. Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP):** Adopt a pregnancy center and support them. Supreme will add \$100 for every \$500 up to \$2000 per center you support. https://www.kofc.org/en/contact/asap.html.
- **2.Walking With Moms In Need (WWMIN):** This is a Diocesan program by the USCCB that you can get involved in to increase the Church's outreach and assistance to pregnant and parenting women in need. Let women know that we have a list of resources available to help them find the support they need and will walk with them through this process. Let them know that they are never alone. For more information go to https://dphx.org/walking-with-moms-in-need/ and https://www.usccb.org/prolife/walking-moms-need/.
- **3. 40 Days for Life:** This organization marches prays in front of abortion clinics to show women there is an alternative to abortion and help in their despair and fear. The next 40 day period kicks off Sept 24th with an opening mass at St Mary's Basilica. https://www.40daysforlife.com/en/phoenix. There are other locations in Tempe, Tucson, and Flagstaff on the website. There may be other opportunities to sponsor one in your area if you step up and take the initiative.
- **4. Ultrasound Initiative:** The Ultrasound Initiative saves lives by allowing women and men to see the child developing in the mother's womb. This has been a very







effective tool in helping these women and men understand what is really happening. When the mothers see their child, studies show that better than 70% carry the child to birth. Many who can't get the ultrasound seek other options. With the rise in chemical abortions, we must get to them sooner and many times the baby can still be saved.

With this program your council raises money to purchase ultrasound machines for Crisis Pregnancy Centers in AZ. Every dollar you raise is matched by Supreme. The State Council purchases annually about four machines. These machines are expensive, and your council does not need to raise all the money for a machine. Do what you can, and the State Council pools the donations to make the purchases with the approved centers. Make checks out to AZ Knights of Columbus Charity Inc. Put Ultrasound in the memo line and send them to Dominic Conn, 606 E Broadmor Dr, Tempe, AZ 85282. If you know of a pregnancy center in need of a machine, send me a note and I will contact to see what can be done to help them and then will work through the application process with them.

There are many opportunities you can take to make a difference in supporting Life in AZ. The key is to get involved, pick a program and do it. Most importantly we all must pray to Mary and Jesus to intercede for us to change the hearts and minds of first those who are so in despair that they might seek an abortion and second to those who are so callous that they would be involved in performing and supporting this evil. We must not stand by idle while the abortion industry destroys the God's gift of Life and the future of humanity, our children.



Building Our Future

St. Anthony School begins construction

St. Anthony Catholic just completed its 19th school year and has broken ground on a new 26,000 square foot Pre-K through 8th Grade school facility. The new facility will include larger classrooms, a gymnasium, stage, restrooms, administrative offices and a new soccer field.

St. Anthony School was started in 2006 and has been operating on the St. Rita Catholic Church site since 2009. The new school facility is being built on just under three acres that adjoin St. Rita's. The project will take 12 months to complete, and we are hopeful to move into our new facility by the 2026-2027 school year.

Thanks to our many friends and generous supporters over the years we have raised over \$4 million dollars in our building fund. Our original estimate in 2019 to build was \$4 million but since covid, our building costs have increased to over \$6.5 million!

If needed, we have an approved construction loan from Notre Dame Federal Credit Union to allow us to complete construction, however, our goal is to minimize our debt or if possible, remain debt free. We are asking for your help and support to help us fund the remaining 10,000 square feet of unfunded building costs.

Each tax-deductible donation of \$250 helps fund one square foot of the remaining 10,000 square feet of unfunded building space.
