Passing of Past Supreme Knight Virgil C. Dechant

We mourn the passing of Virgil C. Dechant, PSK, who died in his



sleep at age 89 on February 15, 2020, in his hometown of Leawood, Kansas. He was the longest-serving Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, having held the office from 1977 to 2000.

PSK Dechant was a great man, with substan-

tially more influence on the Church than his resume and honors bestowed suggest.

"God has called home a good man and one of the Knights' great leaders," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, who succeeded Dechant in the top post. "Virgil Dechant used to say that his goal was to leave the Knights better than he found it, and in myriad

ways, he accomplished that."

Dechant, "leaves a lasting legacy and an excellent example of what it means to be a Knight and a fraternalist," added Anderson in a statement on February 17.

Passing of Reverend Raul Valencia, Pastor of Santa Monica Parish in Tucson

Reverend Raul Valencia, pastor at Santa Monica parish, a south-side Catholic church, died Friday, February 8, 2020 in a crash near Sahuarita, south of Tucson. Father Valencia was on his way to Nogales to visit family, according to the Diocese of Tucson.

Valencia, 60, was born in Nogales, Sonora, and had been the pastor of St. Monica, located near West Valencia Road and South 12th Avenue, since 2011. Over the course of many years, Fr. Valencia, a Knight himself, has worked with the State Council to establish a council in his parish. His wish was to have a Spanish Council in his parish. I am very pleased to report that on February 25, District Deputy Frank Islas instituted Padre Raul A. Valencia Council 17491 in the Parish of St. Monica. O Lord, eternal rest grant unto him, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace.

Another new Council was instituted at St. Stephen Byzantine Cathedral Parish in Phoenix

Over the past couple of years, we have worked with the bishop of the Holy Protection of Mary Byzantine Catholic eparchy of Phoenix and pastor at St. Stephen's Byzantine Catholic Cathedral in North Phoenix to establish a Council at the Cathedral. Worthy District Deputy Frank Atherton reported that ten new members entered into full Knighthood through a Charity, Unity, and Fraternity degree exemplification on February 16, 2020. These new members helped getting the necessary number of members required to start a council. It has been decided to name the new council Saint Stephen's. We are waiting on Supreme to assign a Council number. This is the third new council instituted this fraternal year in Arizona.

Bishop Pazak, leader of the eparchy, states that this is the first Knights of Columbus council in his entire eparchy. Currently, Holy Protection of Mary Eparchy has 19 parishes and one mission under its canonical territorial jurisdiction across thirteen Western States. Congratulations to our Byzantine Catholic brother Knights!

This year's convention will be held May 15 - 16, 2020 at the El Conquistador Tucson located at 10000 North Oracle Road, Tucson, AZ 85704. Hotel reservations can only be made once you register with the host council. In order to reserve a room, go the state website, www.azkofcstateconvention.org and click on Registration. Once you register, a link will be provided to you to make your hotel reservation. Room rates, starting at \$125 per couple, are guaranteed through April 25, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. and are applicable three days before and three days after the convention based on availability. Reservations made after this date will be accepted on a space-available basis at a non-discounted rate. Additionally, Councils need to submit a delegate list as instructed under prior communication sent out. Also, Grand Knights and District Deputies must submit award nominations by April 15, 2020. Mary Ann and I look forward to seeing you at the convention. In the meantime, let's grow the order through our recruiting efforts.



Dear Brother Knights,

As children we were taught to give up something during these forty days. Probably for many of us it was a hard decision, as our parents would not allow us to give up vegetables or doing our chores. Rather we were instructed we should give something up that we enjoyed and liked. Thus, chocolate and candy and soda sales fell during the Lenten season as many Catholics gave up and still do give up such items.

However, as we say that we are Men for Christ, we should embrace this season as an adult. We should not give up those childish things like the items mentioned above (and yes coffee should be included in that list). If we want to be examples for our families, our church communities and the world around us we should give up that, which will truly, bring us closer to Christ.

If we want to really "get" Easter, we need Good Friday. Our kids need it. Our neighbors need it. The world needs it. As Archbishop Fulton Sheen put it, "Unless there is a Good Friday in your life, there can be no Easter Sunday." As we enter the Lenten season, every single Knight of Columbus should plan to attend his parish's liturgy on Good Friday, April 10th. Knights who are married, bring your wives and kids of all ages, and welcome them to bring their friends.



Three Practices to successfully Grow Your Parish and Council This Easter

Easter is a time when we welcome converts to their new home in the Church. They also have a home in the Order as well — and it's up to you to invite them in! Don't wait until Easter to mention the Knights. Personally, invite the RCIA candidates in your parish to attend and assist with your other Lenten programs. Familiarize catechumens with the K of C now and they will be excited when you invite them to join after Easter . The Sacramental Gifts program at https://www.kofc.org/en/what-we-do/faith-in-action-programs/faith/sacramental-gifts.html can be a guide to welcoming them into the Church. Offer to teach the rosary to catechumens. After you pray with the RCIA candidates, invite them to a meal served by your brother Knights and their families — there's nothing like a homemade meal to make a person feel loved and at home in their new parish community. Host a party to celebrate new parishioners.

Host a "Welcome to Family" celebration a week or two after Easter after your parish's most popular Mass. Not all parishioners are able to attend the Easter Vigil, and your celebration will allow everyone to meet and welcome the newest members of your parish family.

FOUR WAYS COUNCILS CAN PROMOTE ATTENDANCE AT GOOD FRIDAY LITURGY

- 1. Display the "By Your Holy Cross" poster (#10573) in the church vestibule and at other gathering spots around the parish. Be sure to get your pastor's permission to do this. A copy of this poster was mailed to grand knights in the U.S. and Canada. If you haven't yet received your poster, email supply@kofc.org.
- 2. Spread the word! Print out an 8.5x11 version of the poster, available at kofc.org/goodfriday. Then, insert it in your parish bulletin or hand it directly to parishioners.
- 3. Partner with the parish to help lead the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday before or after the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death. The prayers, mediations and hymns for the devotion can be found in The Way of the Cross: Traditional and Modern Meditations (#363), available online at kofc.org/cis. Copies can be ordered at knightsgear.com.
- 4. Share the booklets Jesus Christ (#105) and Christ: Lord and Savior (#358) with your council members and fellow parishioners. These booklets can be ordered by visiting kofc.org/cis, or they may be downloaded as PDFs at no cost. Jesus Christ (#105) is also available as an MP3 audio file.

On Thursday, March 29, 2020, the Knights of Columbus will celebrate Founder's Day, marking the 138th anniversary of the reception of its charter from the state of Connecticut. Knights of Columbus councils throughout the world will be joining in this commemoration of 138 years of charity, unity and fraternity.

Recruiting is a year round effort, but March brings an added incentive to our membership drives. We grow the Order to celebrate Father McGivney, whose goal was to help Catholic men remain steadfast in their faith through mutual encouragement while establishing an elementary system of insurance. This gave hope that the widows and children of members who might die would not find themselves in dire financial straits.

Arizona is doing a great job of bringing new men into the Order. In January and February we had over 130 men join the Knights of Columbus. With a new council at St. Stephen's Byzantine Cathedral in Phoenix, and new Spanish councils at St Monica Roman Parish and Our Lady of Fatima Parish in Tucson, it is an exciting time to be a Knight.

Every council should have a recruiting drive on their March calendar, with a degree scheduled soon thereafter. Remember, all of the State Officers, myself and any chairman on the Membership team are willing to help with your membership drives. If you have questions, need equipment, or paperwork or if you need manpower, all you need to do is ask. Every effort will be made to assist you.

For the last year we have asked every council to have an Online Prospect Landing Form. CUF Degree Honoree for March 2020 - Father Raul Valencia Garcia



Father Valencia Garcia, a native of Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, was born on July 28, 1959. He attended school at Colegio Fray Pedro de Gante School in Nogales, Sonora

and went on to attend the Instituto Technologico de Nogales, (Sonora) from 1976 to 1979. He then attended the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico, and studied there from 1980 to 1985. He also received his Doctor of Dental Surgery, (DDS) from the Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara and operated his own general dentistry practice for 11 years in Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, from 1986 to 1997.

From September 1997 to July 1998 he attended the Seminario Juan Navarrete y Guerrero, also referred to as the Seminario de Hermosillo. In 1998, he began attending Assumption Seminary in the Archdiocese of San Antonio, Texas, and completed his studies there in 2002. He served an internship through Assumption and the Oblate School of Theology and under the supervision of the Diocese of Tucson Vocations Office.

Father Valencia Garcia was ordained to the priesthood for ministry in the Diocese of Tucson on June 7, 2003. Then Bishop Gerald F. Kicanas appointed Father Valencia as liaison with the Encuentros Matrimoniales for a three-year term beginning in April 2007.

Father Valencia Garcia became a Knight of Columbus on January 23, 2006. He was a fourth-degree knight. He had been pastor at St. Monica Parish since July 1, 2011. It was his second assignment to the parish. St. Monica's had been his first assignment as a newly-ordained priest in July 2003. That lasted until Oct. 14, 2004 when he was assigned to St. Jude Thaddeus in San Luis, Arizona. He ministered at St. Jude from November 2004 until he was assigned to St. Monica Parish in 2011.

Father Valencia Garcia was killed in a tragic accident on February 7, 2020.

On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.
