

State Deputy's Message



My dear Brothers,

Recently, there has been a surge of interest in finding out if there are any plans to return to our pre-pandemic ways of conducting business. It is good that you are hopeful. I

certainly am. It has been observed that our Bishops are beginning to allow limited openings of parishes based on a designated safe allowable percentage of the building's capacity and ability to maintain optimum safe physical distancing for Masses. This is a promising first step. Since March, when meetings and events in-person were disallowed, many councils adapted very nicely to the use of web-based video conferencing tools to hold meetings, installation of officers and prayer events such as Rosary recitals. Unfortunately, many other councils have not for one reason or another. We have councils that are currently stagnant, have not had any meetings, haven't had election of officers and have not recruited. This situation is of major concern to me and I am studying the positive and negative impact of relaxing our current policy. Please watch for a memo that I intend to send out on this issue in the next week or two.

This year's Supreme Convention was held virtually. This was sad for many who did not get to travel to our nation's capital Washington, D.C. this year. But, as a side-effect of the pandemic, so many Brother Knights, who would not normally get to attend this or any Supreme Convention, were afforded opportunities to experience this great annual event virtually. Several watch parties of small groups (following physical distance guidelines) met for part of the convention activities. Many watched as Arizona received two Supreme Awards, one for New Council Development and one for entry into the Circle of Honor for exceeding our membership quota for last year. Thank you, brothers, for your hard work in recruiting new members into the order and retaining existing members. These are your awards. You earned them.

Congratulations to all the councils who received Supreme Awards such as the Columbian for programs, McGivney for membership quota, Founders' for insurance quota, and Star for all three. We ended last year with 84 of our councils (more than 60% of all active councils) receiving an award. This is great! Of those councils getting awards, 33 received Star Council. I am so incredibly pleased to announce to you

that two councils happen to be overachievers. In Phoenix, Pope John XXIII, Council 7159, is an Eight-Star Council and St. Philip Council 9995 in Payson is a Six-Star Council. Wow! We also had three Triple-star councils, and seven Double-star councils. On the district level, five of our districts received distinction as Star Districts. Congratulations to all for your efforts and achievements. Thank you.

The date has been set for the Beatification ceremony of Father McGivney. It will be held at the Cathedral of Saint Joseph in Hartford Connecticut on October 31, 2020. The exact time and program details have not been released but should be soon. I strongly encourage councils to plan an event to coincide with the Beatification, such as a special mass, Holy Hour, or other prayer function, in their parishes to commemorate this extremely memorable event. This is a great time to honor our founder, to publicize our Order, and to potentially recruit new members. More information will be posted on the state website and Facebook page as they become available.

On the subject of membership, it appears as if we will end the second month of this fraternal year with just over 110 new members. While this is a very good number, unfortunately this effort has come from a minority of councils and districts. Far too many councils have not yet recruited one new member, even with the free membership offer. Brothers, we need to step up our efforts. Yes, it has been a very hot summer and even with some parishes opening their doors to a limited number of Sunday Mass attendees, people just don't stick around very long after the service. I understand. We don't have coffee and doughnuts, or pancake breakfasts. I understand. Remember to wear your Council shirts and name badges. Be creative. Help with post-Mass sanitizing, or pre-Mass seating. Be visible. Be creative. Father and your parish need you. if you need help or recruiting ideas contact our State Membership Director Bobby Nielsen. Pick up the pace!

The Arizona Rosary Celebration is just seven weeks away. The pieces for the Arizona Rosary Celebration 2020 are falling into place. This is a new experience for all of us as we must adapt to different formats, different locations, and different media presentations. Before the pandemic struck, the Executive Committee, with guidance from the Bishops, selected the title under which we would honor Mary this year. *Our Lady Undoer of Knots* was chosen. Little did anyone know what we would face during the year to come. This is certainly a year of knots. We need to have confidence that Mary will undo the knots so that this event will take place. Even though the program will be conducted virtually, there are still exceptional costs that must be met. There will be a program book. It will be made available from the website and advertising space is being sold. Since it is not being printed, the book is in color this year. 

"Among human beings, who knows what pertains to a person except the spirit of the person that is within? Similarly, no one knows what pertains to God except the Spirit of God. We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the things freely given us by God. And we speak about them not with words taught by human wisdom, but with words taught by the Spirit, describing spiritual realities in spiritual terms. Now the natural person does not accept what pertains to the Spirit of God, for to him it is foolishness, and he cannot understand it, because it is judged spiritually. The spiritual person, however, can judge everything but is not subject to judgment by anyone. "who has known the mind of the Lord, so as to counsel him?" But we have the mind of Christ." *1 Corinthians 2:11-16*

Saint Paul's advice is just as important for us today as it was 2000 years ago for the early divided church in Corinth. Do not lose sight that it is the mind of Christ Jesus that we have put on. It is not through the words of human wisdom that we are taught, but through the Spirit that is from God. We do not follow Facebook, nor Twitter, nor Instagram, nor this news channel, nor the other. We follow God.



Dear Brother Knights,

Last month (August 14) the church celebrated St. Maximilian Kolbe. One may love his deep devotion to our Blessed Mother. Others may be drawn to his missionary zeal going to a land that was not his own, so that he could proclaim the Gospel of Christ. For me though I am drawn to the manner of his death. Maximilian Kolbe was willing to give his life literally so that another might live. He did this while he was a prisoner at Auschwitz during World War II.

Maybe this draw to his death is because a number of years ago I had the privilege to visit the remnants of the death camp at Auschwitz and its sister camp a few kilometers away Birkenau. During the tour one could see the cell that held Maximilian Kolbe and the other atrocities perpetrated by the Nazi regime. Hearing what he and so many others had to put up with and how they were treated fill my thoughts with disgust that such a thing could happen in our world.

Sadly, there are still traces of such evil alive in our world today and even in the United States. There are people who vilify and demonize others simply because they are of a different race, culture, or religion. Some still hide in the shadows, but others blatantly come out in front of others and say such hateful things that one's stomach is turned. When we encounter people like that hopefully we do not just let them spew hatred. As Catholic Christians and Knights we should do everything to educate others and even if they are not transformed at least they will know that such words and actions will not be tolerated by us.

We must stand up and say bigotry and prejudice will not be allowed within our families, our councils, and our country. If we say we are tired of hearing about BlackLivesMatter, we should ask God to grant us the grace to work tirelessly to eliminate racism from our hearts and our world. If we are not bothered by the violence that is disproportionately heaped upon people of color then we should ask God for the eyes to imagine the world from their perspective. If we are adding to the polarization that is evident in our government at this time, then we should ask ourselves if we would have the love of Christ within us that St. Maximilian Kolbe had to be willing to extend our hands to bridge a divide instead of adding to the chasm between us.

Many have said 2020 is a year we want to get through and put it behind us. How many cried out those same words while subjected to life in a concentration camp? How many had their blood spilled saying that maybe next year we will be closer to civil rights legislation? How many still believe that there is a superior race and all others should be subjected to their rule or eliminated from the face of the earth. The answer is too many, and we should not be comfortable with that. We, as Knights, who hold up the cross of Christ should be willing to give our lives in service to Christ present in all our sisters and brothers. We should stand in front of those who are chosen to be mocked and abused and say I stand with this person and if need be I stand for this person. God-willing we will not be called to show the ultimate witness of our faith as was asked of Maximilian Kolbe and countless other martyrs. However, we should be willing to stand as a witness against hatred wherever it wages its ugly and vicious head. For Knights stand up to a challenge so that our lives may be a witness to the love of Christ that fills us to overflowing. St. Maximilian Kolbe pray for us and for our world.

Miracle Approved! – Father Michael Joseph McGivney to be Beatified!


Brother Knights,

Incredibly here we are in the month of September. As Knights, our council schedules are up in the air; many of us are not performing the programs and events we usually would be doing at this time. But now is not the time to sit on our hands and wait for things to get better... there are many programs that can be done, right now, even with the restrictions we are experiencing. This month I will just touch on the many Faith programs we can still perform. All program information can be found at:

Every program is listed, with program guides, instruction, and requirements to complete each program as well as all necessary forms.

BDC KIOSK

This takes no effort other than to set up the kiosk and keep it full of books. This was and is extremely popular in my home church. The council paid for the book supply, and books were free to any who wanted them. Trust me, my council finally had to pull the kiosk out for awhile because we couldn't keep it stocked.

HOLY HOUR

This can really be anything you want it to be; any type of group prayer that lasts one hour at least quarterly. This can be done virtually using your council platform! Just make it available to your fellow parishioners. Advertise it on your council and parish FB page, parish website, flocknote, etc. Set a date and pray with your brother Knights and fellow parishioners. This is a featured program.

ITB VIDEO SERIES

I went over this last month, so I won't cover it in depth. All councils should be making plans to perform this program. You do not need to wait until we can meet live; this can be performed in small groups virtually. Again, make it available to all. This is also a featured program. Please go to:

All program and reservation information is on the state website under PROGRAMS. Bryant is working on recording the many versions of prayer used with each icon to use virtually in the future, but all icons are available for in person prayer in your church.

ROSARY PROGRAM

This one is pretty simple... group prayer of the rosary at least 4 times per year. Many councils were praying the rosary before their business meetings but may have discontinued the practice. Why not pray the rosary a half hour before your virtual meetings? How about praying the rosary monthly online with your fellow parishioners? Just set a monthly date, in advance and get the information out to the parish that they are invited to join us in praying the rosary.

RSVP

As the K of C are huge supporters of our clergy, if it all possible financially, every council should be supporting at least one seminarian. If you donate \$500, your council receives \$100 back from Supreme. The donation must be to a specific seminarian; and the council is mandated to support him in other ways. Keep in contact, follow his progress through seminary, invite him to speak to your council when he is available. Please contact the diocesan vocations director if you are searching for a seminarian to support. This is a featured program.

SACRAMENTAL GIFTS

This only requires financial support from the council. Plan ahead to purchase a small sacramental gift for RE and RCIA students being baptized or receiving their first communion.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

This was a required program in the past but is not any longer. It is still a featured program. Any day long retreat or other spiritual reflection that is attended by 10% of your council or at least 10 council members will qualify. It does not need to be K of C specific; it can be any type of retreat or approved spiritual program.

These Faith programs are just a few of the programs we can continue to perform, right now. Many lend themselves to being done very easily online... we may actually have the opportunity to reach more people this way than live. The important thing is for councils to stay active, there is still plenty for us to do.

UPCOMING PROGRAMS

Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest – articles need to be completed in September

ARC – will be a much smaller live event this year but will be sent out online. Donations are still needed to put on this event. Every council should support this Arizona Knights of Columbus program. Find information on how to donate at the event website.

My Brother Knights,

Congratulations Arizona Knights of Columbus! After recruiting 130 new men in June it would have been easy to take some time off and slow down our recruiting efforts. But we are in a pandemic, our Catholic brothers and their families are in need, and our faith is being tested. So, the Knights of Columbus have stepped up and helped wherever needed, and we have recruited over 110 new men in July and August. This is a fantastic start for the new fraternal year, and with the *Dog Days of Summer* winding down, things will only get better.

When we look at the total number of men brought into the Order this fraternal year, it is impressive. But when we look at the number of councils that have not recruited anyone this year, it's alarming. We have 136 active councils in Arizona and 93 have yet to add a man to their roster. With the restrictions on meetings, councils have relied on online membership. Once the new Knight joins online it is important to transfer him into your council. This is accomplished when the online member attends a Charity, Unity and Fraternity Exemplification. This ceremony is available online through Supreme and also online through our State Degree Team. We currently have over 120 online members assigned to a council. After being voted on by the council, these men attend a CUF and are transferred to the council roster. The council then receives credit towards their intake goal. Every Grand Knight needs to look at the Prospect Tab on Officers Online and help the online members move through the process.

Arizona has an incredibly diverse population, and our Order reflects that diversity. Three of the four new councils, that were formed in Arizona last year, were Spanish speaking. Our growth in the Hispanic community has been well received by our Bishops and Priests. In the words of our Hispanic Growth Coordinator, Luis Leyva, we are just getting started! Take a look around your parish and speak to your Pastor. Is there a need for a Hispanic Round Table? Is there enough interest to form a Hispanic Council? There was a time when English and Spanish speaking Councils in the same parish presented a problem. Those days are gone. We have found that councils not only work together but build off each other in their programs and service.

Council recruiting often becomes the responsibility of the Grand Knight or another officer. The Council Membership Director is a resource that is often underutilized. This director has one job; to grow the Council. Make sure your council has a man in this position that enjoys talking to our Catholic brothers and isn't afraid to ask, "Are you a Knight of Columbus?"

We all hope that we are able to fill our parish pews soon, but until that happens make sure your parish's electronic bulletin has information about our Order. This and other recruiting tools are available for you to use at <u>https://kofc-az.org/</u> in the Membership/Recruiting area.

Brother Knights,

September is the end of our first quarter. There is so much to do to get your council plans in place for the second quarter. Labor Day 2020 will occur on Monday, September 7. Labor Day pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers and is traditionally observed on the first Monday in September. It was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. Labor Day weekend also symbolizes the end of summer for many Americans, and we should say a prayer:

"Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ in his earthly life shared our toil and hallowed our labor: Be present with your people where they work..."

"The family that prays together stays together." Pope St. John Paul II repeated this phrase in his encyclical on the Rosary: "As a prayer for peace, the Rosary is also, and always has been, a prayer of and for the family. At one time this prayer was particularly dear to Christian families, and it certainly brought them closer together. It is important not to lose this precious inheritance. We need to return to the practice of family prayer and prayer for families, continuing to use the Rosary... The family that prays together stays together. The Holy Rosary, by age-old tradition, has shown itself particularly effective as a prayer which brings the family to look one another in the eye, to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to see their covenant of love renewed in the Spirit of God." (Rosarium Virginis Mariae, February 2, 2002, No. 41)

In light of attacks against the family, life, and true love, we must return to this prayer, as Saint John Paul II asked us to do: "A prayer so easy and yet so rich truly deserves to be rediscovered by the Christian community... I look to all of you, brothers and sisters of every state of life, to you, Christian families, to you, the sick and elderly, and to you, young people: confidently take up the Rosary once again. Rediscover the Rosary in the light of Scripture, in harmony with the Liturgy, and in the context of your daily lives. May this appeal of mine not go unheard!" (*Ibid.,* No. 43).

'The Christian family is the first place of education in prayer. Based on the Sacraments of marriage, the family is the 'domestic Church' where God's children learn to pray 'as the Church', and to persevere in prayer. For young children in particular, daily family prayer is the first witness of the Church's living memory as awakened patiently by the Holy Spirit' (CCC 2685).

Family prayer is important because it encourages expressions of faith in the parish and in the community. Children growing up in a home where there is regular prayer are often spurred to express their Catholic beliefs and values outside the home by becoming an altar server, by volunteering in charity drives at school or in the neighborhood, and by engaging in other activities inspired by the Gospel. Also, family prayer provides spiritual support to those young people who are considering a vocation to the priesthood or religious life.

The pieces for the Arizona Rosary Celebration 2020 are falling into place. This is new experience for all of us as we must adapt to different formats, different locations, different media presentations. The Executive Committee is working to make this Celebration to honor Our Lady, Undoer of Knots one to remember. It is challenging in view of the current restriction as far as meetings, social distancing, masks, hand sanitizers etc. We need to have confidence that Mary will undo the knots so that this event will take place.

With the help of the Parish Representatives to disseminate information, we will be able to have a successful Rosary celebration. Continue to check our web site for the latest information.

Our committee meetings in both Tucson and Phoenix will be held in a virtual mode until it is safe to meet in groups. The co-chairs in Tucson and Phoenix will post information on the web site, email, or other media.

In the midst of the changes that we are anticipating, we do have a number of events that we know will take place, so keep these points in mind.

<u>Tucson</u>: The Rosary celebration will be live-streamed (You Tube) on Saturday, October 17, 2020 with Bishop Weisenburger as the presider and a recorded homily by guest speaker Auxiliary Bishop Rodriguez of the Archdiocese of Denver. The program will be centered on the guest speaker presentation, recitation of the rosary followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Phoenix: the celebration will be live-streamed (You Tube) on Sunday, October 18, 2020 with Bishop Olmsted presiding and will include the recorded message from Bishop Rodriguez. The venue is changed to St. Juan Diego Church in Chandler. As in Tucson, the event will be centered on the presentation by the guest speaker, recitation of the rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Both programs will be shorter due to the absence of the blessing processions, and overall participation at the churches will be limited to the minimum number of participants required to perform the Liturgy. Strict COVID-19 precautions will be exercised. However, this is an opportunity to greatly expand the participation of Catholics throughout Arizona via the convenience of personal media resources. Many of our Church's faithful will be able to participate from afar when they could not participate in the past except by viewing recordings after the fact. We need to advertise this great opportunity to pray the rosary publicly for our nation and our world in this period of great tribulation. There are over 3 million Catholics in Arizona and we have the chance to unite them all under our Mother's protection on that October weekend. So even if your ministry participation has been cut short by the restrictions this year, we still need you to help us bring the word to others. We will not let COVID-19 keep us from celebrating our 45th year of praying the rosary together.

Through the Silver Rose program, we ask the Blessed Mother to guide us as we step into the breach and fight against the culture of death that grips our society.





Degree news.

Roll on 2020!! I find myself focusing so much on all the bad aspects of the COVID-19 restrictions that I forget to keep in mind that I need to do my part to help us recover. That means re-focusing on getting back to as close to normal as possible (whatever that will turn out to be) while protecting each other from as much risk as possible. That further means to me that we need to continue to have degrees, installations, business meetings and officer meetings but innovatively use our electronic resources to accomplish these online. We are still under Supreme and State guidance to avoid <u>in-person</u> KofC business and social meetings. This link <u>https://kofc-az.org/exemplification-schedules</u> will take you to the State website which has the schedule of degrees and a downloadable letter on other type of ceremonials to include "On Demand" CUF degrees and scripts for virtual installations. Call or e-mail me if you want some help or just want to discuss/share your ideas or get ideas from other Councils.

We have now formed four Regional teams (and growing) to present CUF Degrees online on every 2nd and 4th Saturday morning for any Council in the state to access and exemplify new or advancing members. I know you are working hard to recruit under the "new normal" and using innovative ways to reach new prospects. Remember that recruiting doesn't end until the candidate has taken his degrees and joins a Council. As Supreme winds down its program of weekly online CUF degrees, replacing it with the "On Demand" degree, the AZ teams are stepping up to continue the more enriching experience of exemplifying new members live (online), with presenters that the candidates will recognize as AZ Knights. The candidates also get to meet our State leaders. For the near future at least, this is the "new normal" for ceremonials. Let's make it work to our advantage.

Members, please continue to check with your Grand Knight to offer your help in forming a CUF degree team in your Council. Our long-term goal is still to have a team in every Council able to provide an exemplification "On Demand" in their own Council.

Grand Knights, please continue to conduct your Council business meetings online until we get further guidance from our State Deputy. Work to start a Council CUF team or offer to help your District Deputy start a District team. If you want or need help in starting a team reach out to me and I will put you in touch with a Regional Team Captain who will be glad to assist and get your team going. We will teach your team about presenting the degree and provide tips on how best to run the electronic meeting software. This constrictive atmosphere we are struggling with will ease eventually and when we are able to gather in person once more, your team will be ready to go fully live. So, forming the teams now is both a short and long term solution. Keep in mind that Grand Knights can put on a CUF Degree with their own Council team, online for now, anytime they need one.

District Deputies, I encourage you to get your Councils forming their own teams or form a District team. Select a team captain to recruit team members then have him contact me for help. That way you can oversee the formation of the team but still leave the details of execution to the team captain. Remember to contact me for help if you need it.

The District Master has adapted the live presentation for online exemplification and this will be the first virtual Fourth degree in AZ. Charity, Unity and Fraternity (CUF) Degree – Honoree for September 2020 Most Reverend Thomas J. Olmsted Bishop of Phoenix

There is no greater supporter of the Knights of Columbus than the Most Reverend Thomas J. Olmsted, Bishop of Phoenix.

Born and raised in rural Kansas, the future Bishop Olmsted attended a single-room grade school and a small rural high school. He attended St. Thomas Seminary College in in Denver, Colorado from which he graduated in 1969 with a degree in philosophy. Ordained to the priesthood on July 2, 1973, he served as Associate Pastor at the Cathedral of the Risen Christ in Lincoln, Nebraska until 1976. He was called to Rome to complete his Doctoral studies in Canon law then was assigned as an Assistant at the Secretariat of State of the Holy See and Assistant Spiritual Director at Pontifical North American College. In 1989, Bishop Olmsted returned to Nebraska as the Pastor of St. Vincent DePaul Parish. From 1993 to 1999 he served at the Pontifical College Josephinum and became its Rector/President. In 1999, he was consecrated a Bishop and served as the Coadjutor for the Diocese of Wichita, Kansas and in 2001 was appointed Bishop for that Diocese. On December 20, 2003 Bishop Olmsted became the fourth Bishop of Phoenix.

Bishop Olmsted has been a member of the Jesus Caritas fraternity of priests since 1974. As a Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus he has supported our work for the Church and encouraged Catholic men to join our Order to help them strengthen their faith and commitment to our Church. His published exhortation "Into the Breach" was adopted by the Supreme Council and inspired the series of internationally available videos that encourage men to follow Bishop Olmsted's call to action in defense of manhood and their role in the Church, family and community. He is a true shepherd boldly defending our Catholic faith in the public square. It is our distinct privilege to honor him as our CUF Degree Honoree for the month of September 2020.





Brothers Knights,

As Knights, we have the opportunity to give students the chance to define the role of a Catholic citizen, and to strengthen the bond between the Knights of Columbus and local schools. Our goal is to give students the opportunity to share this role in many different scenarios.

This year's theme, as given by Supreme is "Living Our Faith Through Service and Charitable Deeds."

In an essay of 500-750 words, the student should write how trusting in God during a difficult time has helped them, or someone they know, find the strength and hope to endure. They should especially consider those times when it was a challenge to understand why something was happening. Considering also, any lessons about faith and hope learned from this experience.

I encourage Councils to use the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest Kit and Guidebook found on the Supreme web page under Faith in Action / Community. This kit contains everything your Council will need to run a successful program. This contest is open to grades 8-12 and is for public, private and home school students.

Each Council should identify an Essay Director to administer the program with assistants to help run the contest. The Council may award a gift card to the winner of each grade, if they so desire, in addition to the winner's certificates provided in the kit.

The timetable for this contest is follows:

- August: Council identifies a director and orders the kit from Supreme. Contact schools and teachers about the program. Put information in the Parish bulletin about the program.
- September: Distribute the kits and have students write their essays.
- October: Council judges review essays, winners are selected, and certificates/gift cards are distributed.
- November: Council winners advance to District level judging. The District level winner is announced and advances to State level.
- December: Statewide judging is conducted, awards distributed, and the State winners advance to Supreme level.
- January: Essays are due to Supreme by January 31, 2021 for international judging.
- March: International Essay winners announced.









2020-2021 Arizona State Pin and Theme



Arizona Knight of Columbus "LIVING OUR FAITH THROUGH SERVICE AND CHARITABLE DEEDS"

At the start of every fraternal year, it has become customary in Arizona that the State Deputy introduces a new State Pin and theme. While introducing the 2020-2021 State Pin, State Deputy Mario Vassallo said, "The State Pin this year depicts part of the religious heritage that I brought with me from Malta, the island where I was born and raised. St. Paul is one of the patron saints of Malta. I would like St. Paul to be a role model to us brother knights in Arizona during this fraternal year."

The State Pin has the outline of the State of Arizona and shows the picture of St. Paul who is one of the greatest apostles but also was a convert, a missionary and a martyr. The pin also shows the logo of the Knights of Columbus and two small baby's feet which are included to remind us that we must always fight to preserve the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death. At the top of the pin is this year's theme *Living Our Faith Through Service and Charitable Deeds*. Our theme is an expression of what the goal of every Knight of Columbus should be. We are men of faith who demonstrate our faith by being of service to our priests, parishioners and neighbors and perform charity with those members in our community who are in need.

This is the story of how the Maltese people converted to Christianity and fell in love with the great apostle St. Paul.

In the year 60 A.D. St. Paul was taken prisoner and transported to Rome to be tried in court as a Roman for being a Christian. St. Luke was also on the same ship that travelled through the Mediterranean Sea. This is how St. Luke describes the shipwreck close to the island of Malta in the Acts of the Apostles (27:39 – 28:10):


³⁹ When daylight came, they did not recognize the land, but they saw a bay with a sandy beach, where they decided to run the ship aground if they could. ⁴⁰ Cutting loose the anchors, they left them in the sea and at the same time untied the ropes that held the rudders. Then they hoisted the foresail to the wind and made for the beach. ⁴¹ But the ship struck a sandbar and ran aground. The bow stuck fast and would not move, and the stern was broken to pieces by the pounding of the surf.

⁴² The soldiers planned to kill the prisoners to prevent any of them from swimming away and escaping. ⁴³ But the centurion wanted to spare Paul's life and kept them from carrying out their plan. He ordered those who could swim to jump overboard first and get to land. ⁴⁴ The rest were to get there on planks or on other pieces of the ship. In this way everyone reached land safely.

28 Once safely on shore, we found out that the island was called Malta. ² The islanders showed us unusual kindness. They built a fire and welcomed us all because it was raining and cold. ³ Paul gathered a pile of brushwood and, as he put it on the fire, a viper, driven out by the heat, fastened itself on his hand. ⁴ When the islanders saw the snake hanging from his hand, they said to each other, "This man must be a murderer; for though he escaped from the sea, the goddess Justice has not allowed him to live." ⁵ But Paul shook the snake off into the fire and suffered no ill effects. ⁶ The people expected him to swell up or suddenly fall dead; but after waiting a long time and seeing nothing unusual happen to him, they changed their minds and said he was a god.

⁷ There was an estate nearby that belonged to Publius, the chief official of the island. He welcomed us to his home and showed us generous hospitality for three days. ⁸ His father was sick in bed, suffering from fever and dysentery. Paul went in to see him and, after prayer, placed his hands on him and healed him. ⁹ When this had happened, the rest of the sick on the island came and were cured. ¹⁰ They honored us in many ways; and when we were ready to sail, they furnished us with the supplies we needed.

Al comienzo de cada año fraterno, se ha convertido una tradición en Arizona que el Diputado de Estado presente un nuevo broche de solapa y lema para el Consejo Estatal. Al presentar el broche de solapa estatal 2020-2021, el diputado estatal Mario Vassallo dijo: "El broche de solapa estatal de este año representa parte de la herencia religiosa que traje conmigo mismo desde Malta, la isla donde nací y crecí. San Pablo es uno de los santos patronos de Malta. Me gustaría que San Pablo fuera un modelo a seguir para nosotros los hermanos Caballeros en Arizona durante este año fraternal".

El broche del Estado tiene el bosquejo del Estado de Arizona y muestra la imagen de San Pablo, uno de los más grandes Apóstoles, pero también converso, misionero y mártir. El broche también muestra el logotipo de Caballeros de Colón y dos pies de bebé pequeños que se incluyen para recordarnos que siempre debemos luchar para preservar la santidad de la vida desde su concepción natural hasta la muerte natural. El lema principal de este año es **Vivir nuestra fe a través del servicio y las obras de caridad**. Nuestro lema es una expresión de cuál debería ser el objetivo de cada Caballero de Colón. Somos hombres de fe que la demostramos al servir a nuestros sacerdotes, feligreses y vecinos, y hacemos caridad con los miembros de nuestra comunidad que están en necesidad.

Esta es la historia de cómo el pueblo maltés se convirtió al cristianismo y se enamoró del gran apóstol San Pablo.

En el año 60 D.C., San Pablo fue hecho prisionero y trasladado a Roma para ser juzgado en la corte como romano por ser cristiano. San Lucas también iba en el mismo barco que viajaba por el mar Mediterráneo. Así es como San Lucas describe el naufragio cerca de la isla de Malta en los Hechos de los Apóstoles (27:39 - 28:10):

Hechos de los Apóstoles versión Biblia Latinoamericana

"27: 39-44"

39.Cuando amaneció no reconocieron la tierra, pero divisaron una bahía con su playa, y acordaron hacer lo posible por encallar en ella el barco. 40. Soltaron las anclas y las dejaron caer al mar mientras aflojaron las cuerdas de los timones; izaron al viento la vela delantera y se dejaron arrastrar hacia la playa. 41. Pero chocaron contra un banco de arena y el barco quedó encallado: la proa se clavó y quedó inmóvil, mientras la popa se iba destrozando por los golpes violentos de las olas.

42. Entonces los soldados pensaron en dar muerte a los presos por temor a que alguno se escapara nadando. 43. Pero el capitán, que quería salvar a Pablo, no se lo permitió. Ordenó que los que supieran nadar se tiraran los primeros al agua y se dirigieran a la playa; 44. Los demás se agarrarían a tablones o a restos de la nave. Así todos llegamos sanos y salvos a tierra."

"28:1-10" 1.Una vez a salvo, supimos que la isla se llamaba Malta. 2. Los nativos nos trataron con una cordialidad poco común, encendieron una gran hoguera y nos cuidaron a todos, ya que llovía y hacía frío. 3. Pablo había juntado una brazada de ramas secas y, al echarlas al fuego, una víbora que escapaba del calor se le enroscó en la mano. 4. Al ver los nativos a la víbora colgando de la mano de Pablo, se dijeron unos a otros: «Sin duda éste es un asesino. Aunque se haya salvado del mar, la justicia divina no lo deja vivir.» 5. Pero Pablo sacudió la víbora echándola al fuego y no sufrió daño alguno. 6. Pensaban que se iba a hinchar o caer muerto de repente, pero después de esperar largo rato, vieron que no le pasaba nada. Entonces cambiaron de parecer y decían que era un dios.

7. Los terrenos cercanos pertenecían al hombre principal de la isla, llamado Publio, quien nos recibió y hospedó amigablemente tres días. 8. Precisamente el padre de Publio estaba en cama con fiebre y disentería. Pablo entró a verlo, oró, le impuso las manos y lo sanó. 9. A consecuencia de esto todos los enfermos de la isla acudieron a él y fueron sanados; 10. luego nos colmaron de atenciones y, al marchar, nos proveyeron de todo lo necesario."

Honoring Mary Under Her Title Our Lady Undoer of Knots



Devotion to Mary, Undoer Knots began over 300 years ago. Pope Francis spoke about while he was Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Argentina, and continues to promote it during his papacy. Pope Francis said: Through Mary, "All the knots of our heart, every knot of our conscience can be undone."

The story behind this particular title of Mary comes not as an apparition, but rather as a request for intercession.

In the early 1600s there was a German Nobleman Wolfgang Langenmantel and his wife, Sophie. they were having marital problems and were considering divorce. Wolfgang, being troubled and fearful of such a drastic action, went to a Jesuit priest Fr. Jakob Rem for advice.

During their counseling sessions, they prayed to the Blessed Virgin Mary for Wolfgang's marriage. On September 28, 1615, the last time he was to meet with Fr. Rem, Wolfgang provided the priest with the ribbon used during his wedding ceremony to tie the couple together as a symbol of unity.

Fr. Rem took the ribbon, placed it on an image of Our Lady of the Snows, and asked Mary to "untie the knots" of Wolfgang's marriage. The ribbon loosened and became completely untied and became brilliantly white. The story does not end with the dissolution of their marriage. Rather, Wolfgang and Sophie reconciled after this happened. The knots that were untied by the Blessed Mother were the ones that creating the problems that were driving them apart.

Hieronymus Langenmantel, the grandson of Wolfgang and Sophie, became a priest and commissioned a painting to be done in memory of the story. The painting shows Mary untying the knots of marriage. In it, one angel gives her the knotted ribbon and another angel holds the unknotted side and presents it to the viewer.

This image also shows Mary crushing Satan's head, as in the Immaculate Conception. There is also a dove above her head symbolizing the Holy Spirit. It also depicts St. Raphael the Archangel accompanying Wolfgang towards a monastery.

The image of Mary, Undoer of Knots, was painted by Johann Melchior Georg Schmittdner about the year 1700. It is currently on display at St. Peter am Perlach-Church in Augsburg, Bavaria in Germany.
