

State Deputy Mario Vassallo's Message



My dear Brothers,

In a few short days we will be celebrating Easter, the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. On Palm Sunday we remember the beginning of Christ's Passion as he entered Jerusalem to the praises of people shouting Hosanna and waving palm fronds to honor the entry of the Messiah. By

the end of the week Jesus will have been betrayed by one of his disciples, arrested, scourged, beaten, condemned to death by many of the same people who praised Him just mere days before. Then he would be dragged out of the Holy City carrying a cross on his back to the place of the Skull, and there to be crucified. In just one week, Jesus went from victorious King, prophet, and savior, to a condemned man hung on a cross between two criminals. That's not the end. You know there's more to the story.

All this **HAD** to happen in order for us to be free from our sins, to be given the Holy priesthood with Saint Peter at the lead of the Universal Church, to receive the gift of the Bread of Life in the Holy Eucharist, for Jesus Christ to be resurrected from the dead, and for the promise that we too may enjoy eternal life with Him, God the Father and the Holy Spirit.

This year, Easter is different for us. Palm fronds blessed by our priest on Palm Sunday may not be distributed. Gathering at our church on Holy Thursday to commemorate the Last Supper won't take place. We won't be physically able together to pray on Good Friday to recall Christ's death. Saturday evening, we won't crowd around the fire pit as the Paschal Candle is lit and the light of the world enters the darkened church. Many catechumens and candidates will not receive their sacraments that night. Our Easter

A new Council was instituted at St. Stephen Byzantine Cathedral Parish in Phoenix

Brothers, it's official, we have instituted a new council at the Holy Protection of Mary Byzantine Catholic eparchy of Phoenix. Saint Stephen's Council #17463 was officially instituted this past month. The Most Rev. John Pazak, bishop of the Byzantine Eparchy, expressed his great joy at the institution of the first Knights of Columbus council in his eparchy. Currently, Holy Protection of Mary Eparchy has 19 parishes and one mission under its canonical territorial jurisdiction across thirteen Western States. State Convention Not Held As Planned

The State Council was faced with a difficult decision as we work through these trying times. Even though many of us are quarantined in our homes and we cannot gather physically, we should not slow down our recruitment efforts. Progress toward our state membership goal has slowed its momentum. Currently, we are at about 64% of our goal with three months remaining. In spite of the pandemic, there are still many great opportunities, even in this trying time, for you to recruit new members and put us over the top by the end of June.

Look at what Saint Anne Council #10540 in Gilbert did. Recently, they started an outreach program to check on the welfare of elder brother knights of the council. State Chaplain Father Gary Regula's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

As you read this we are still journeying through Lent, and what a different Lent this has been for everyone. No one in their wildest dreams would have imagined that we, Catholics, would not have been able to come to church to pray a rosary or the Stations of the Cross. More so, it would have almost been incomprehensible to suggest that we could not have daily mass and even our Sunday Mass either. However, we are people of hope and as we have journeyed thus far we will go onward.

Holy Week begins with the Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. There will be no singing out Hosanna to the one who comes in the name of the Lord at our churches. We will not be waving palms and bringing them into our homes to remind us all year of the holiest of all weeks. Instead of thinking of what we may be missing, let us instead reflect on how this void will inspire us to be better when the churches open again. If we only moved our lips or didn't even sing before maybe the fact that we can't will spur us to sing loudly with all of our sisters and brothers when we gather again in praise to our Lord that gave us our voices. Maybe when we receive palms next year we will not relegate them to the same place we always put them, but display them proudly for all to see and if people ask about them we are willing and ready to teach one and all about our faith in Christ the Lord.

On Holy Thursday we will not receive blessed and consecrated oils from the Bishop as in years past (as the Chrism mass has been postponed). There will be no foot washing as a sign of us to take up the mandatum of Christ to go and wash one another's feet. However, when we participate in baptisms and confirmations in the coming year may the sweet smell of the Chrism Oil fill the church and our hearts with the call to live out our baptism daily and bear fruit of the Holy Spirit of God. When we see the homeless in our midst or the migrants who journey from one place to another, may we not judge but think of the honor it would be for us to stoop down and wash their feet as Christ has washed ours.

Good Friday, the day we remember the death of our Lord, will be different as it always is, but this year we will not be able to come forward and kiss the cross upon which hung our salvation. In our homes we should gather around our crucifix and look at the figure of Christ and remember that before he gave up his last breath, he forgave those who were persecuting him. May we kiss Christ himself by offering others the mercy he so graciously gives to us time and time again.

Supreme Board of Directors – Pilgrimage to Rome 2020

From February 7 - 15, 2020 the Supreme Board of Directors gathered for a Pilgrimage to Rome in celebration of 100 years of our Order's presence in the Eternal City and to conduct Board meetings.

At the end of WWI, the Knights of Columbus had the opportunity to meet with Pope Benedict XV. The Pope acknowledged the Knights efforts in Europe by operating the Hospitality Huts where Everyone Welcome, Everything Free was the motto.

When asked what else the Knights could do, Pope Benedict XV proposed a problem the youth of Rome faced. The youth had no place to go for recreation. In response the Knights established five playgrounds. These became sports complexes and still exist. The Board was able to visit all five of these sports facilities. Many of the events held at these fields are still offered free to the youth of Rome. As part of the visit to Campo Sportivo Pio XI, the Board joined the Filipino Community of Rome for the Dedication of a new Mosaic of St. Michael the Archangel.

In addition to some secular tours of Rome, the Board and guests celebrated Mass daily, beginning on Saturday at the Papal Basilica of St. Paul outside the Wall. The Mass was celebrated by H.E. James Cardinal Harvey, Archpriest of the Basilica, who then gave us a tour of the excavation of the area just outside the Basilica that is being supported by a grant from the Knights of Columbus. We also visited a city park, Largo Cavalieri di Colombo, that the City of Rome named after and dedicated to the Knights of Columbus.

Sunday Mass was celebrated in the Borghese Chapel before the Marian Icon **Salus Populi Romani** at the Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major. Vatican Museum tour guides accompanied our group and provided small group tours of all the pilgrimage sites we visited. Many of the cites we visited during the pilgrimage included areas where the Knights have provided support for renovation or preservation.

Monday was dedicated to our first of two visits to the Vatican and St. Peters. The tour of St. Peters began with the group taken to the many statutes, Mosaics, Frescos and other artwork that the Knights of Columbus has sponsored the restoration efforts over several decades. A morning Rosary was recited at the Gregorian Alter before the **Madonna del Soccorso** in St. Peters. Joining us was Angelo Cardinal Comastri, Archpriest of the Papal Basilica of St. Peter. The Board held a business meeting at a room inside the Vatican.

At midday on Monday we had the honor of a private group audience with His Holiness Pope Francis. Although he was slightly behind schedule, meeting with Bishops from the Southwest United States, he took the time to personally great everyone in our group. We then celebrated Mass at the Madonna della Guardia Alter in the Vatican Gardens. This is the same location that the Knights celebrated Mass with Pope Benedict XV in 1920. Our group joined the staff of the Knights office in Rome for a reception. Monday evening, we were able to visit the Sistine Chapel and the Vatican Museum.

Our pilgrimage continued Tuesday with a visit to the Papal Basilica of St. John Lateran and Mass at St. Sebastian at the Catacombs. On Tuesday evening the Board and wives attended a reception hosted by The Hon. Calista Gingrich, U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See and her husband Speaker Newt Gingrich at the Ambassador's residence.

Wednesday was the last official day of the Board Pilgrimage. We had the rare and extreme honor of attending Mass in the Pauline Chapel (Conclave Chapel) in the Apostolic Palace in the Vatican. At the end of the Mass we were asked to stay seated by Supreme Chaplin Archbishop William Lori. Pope Francis joined us to again thank the Knights for all our efforts, not only in Rome, but worldwide. He mentioned our efforts in relief on natural disasters, and especially pointed out our efforts is support of persecuted Christians in the middle east. He asked us to continue these programs, commenting that if the Knights were not there to help, there might be no one helping these brothers and sisters in Christ. He concluded this visit by leading us in prayer, letting us know he would pray for the Knights of Columbus, and asked that we all remember him in our prayers, saying "this is not an easy job".

Brenda and I would like to thank all our Brothers in Arizona for your support. We are humbled and honored to represent Arizona Knights on the Board of Directors.



Remember how they spent their youth and old age, their entire lives serving and giving all to Jesus.


Mary, bless them and keep a special place for them in your heart.

Worthy Grand Knights,

With the guidance from Supreme and our Worthy State Deputy, you still have the ability to host a virtual meeting online. There are a few tools you can use to help.

Decide on a meeting tool. There are a few out there such as Webex. In order to do this, there may be a cost associated with it. Figure out how many members may potentially attend the meeting virtually. WebEx will allow for online polling along with 100 participants. (https://www.webex.com/pricing/index.html)

NOTE: We are asking that you refrain from using Zoom for meetings as they are supporters of Abortion

Email from Supreme's site of the meeting notice – Don't post on your Facebook site or Website the meeting notice. Remember that meetings are still ceremonials. Remember to invite your DD and Field Agent!!! (DD's – Invite your ASO!!!)

Encourage members to attend! This may be good for some of the members to get back into the swing of things!

Follow the meeting guidelines. Of course, there are some things that you have to take into account, such as checking membership cards, etc. However, the structure of the meeting should remain the same.

Ask people to mute unless addressing the Grand Knight! Online discussions are difficult because people can be talking over each other. Everyone should remain on mute unless addressing the Grand Knight or council.

When doing a prayer, the leader should be the only one who is speaking with others on mute. There is an inherent delay that occurs.

Use polling for online votes. You still need to follow Roberts Rules: Address GK, Make the motion, Seconded, Acknowledged and repeated by the GK, Discussion, Vote. The polling feature can be used to conduct the vote.

Keep the meeting on topic! Much like regular meetings, keep it on topic and don't drag on. Practice the meeting with your officers!

As our Worthy State Deputy has suggested, there are many things we can do as a council "virtually". Use this time to schedule some of the activities using the tools available to conduct

Programs — State Warden/State Program Director Larry Powers

On Friday March 27, 2020 President Trump signed a spending bill approved by Congress that authorized one-time payments of \$1,200 per adult, \$2,400 per couple and \$500 per child. Amounts begin phasing out at \$75,000 for individuals, \$150,000 per couple.



Many live paycheck to paycheck and suddenly are staring at an inability to pay their rent or utilities let alone pay for groceries. We have single mothers trying to feed their children and wondering how. Suddenly a pregnant mother finds herself in real fear of having the resources to support her unborn child. Spend an hour at a local food bank and you will quickly see how many hungry people are out there. In addition food banks are no longer able to get excess food from stores that have had their shelves stripped. The checks that are coming will certainly help all of these people.

I am not one of the unemployed. I am not in the service industry, and I have plenty of food. I am blessed beyond measure. An extra \$1200 certainly would allow me to buy a new TV or maybe update my laptop; things I would like but certainly do not need.

If you are in a position similar to mine, I am asking you prayerfully consider joining me in donating all or part of your stimulus payment to help others. The State Council has created an Emergency Fund to be used in dire times like this. Send your donations to our Worthy State Secretary, making your checks payable to Arizona Knights of Columbus and entering Emergency Fund in the memo. 10 of us banding together to donate \$12,000 to a food bank, homeless shelter, or crisis pregnancy center can have a real immediate positive impact on our community. Let me know if this is something you would like to join me and my wife in making a difference. We are in the process of identifying specific charities that we will be donating to.

Degree news

I am so excited to report that the new Charity, Unity and Fraternity (CUF) degree is being performed enthusiastically by our council and State teams for candidates and their families as we transition to the new degree across all of Arizona. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, and the new degree is fulfilling its promise to encourage more men to join our ranks and to open up our ceremonials to family and friends as witnesses to our candidates' pledges to become stronger Catholics and family men. Since we started using the new CUF degree at the January Mid-Year meeting in Casa Grande we have exemplified 111 new members (7 of them priests) and 140 advancing members for a total of 251 new Third degree Knights! We are now conducting the degrees in both English and Spanish and three new councils have been formed using the new CUF degree. That ensures that all new members in those councils are third degree members from the start of their Knight's journey.

Having said that, the world health problem with the COVID – 19 has seriously impacted our degree exemplification and recruiting efforts. Our first priority is always the health and welfare of our members and families, prospective members and our communities. We have, therefore, suspended all large group degree exemplifications (and other Knights' ceremonial group functions) in accordance with the guidelines issued by our various government agencies, our Church leaders and the Supreme Council. So how are we specifically going to comply with these important rules and guidelines in our ceremonials? Here are the first few steps:

- 1. Live presentations and in-person video showings: All ceremonials (degrees and business meetings) of groups of 10 or more people are suspended until further notice. Our Governor has mandated that all of us should stay at home as much as possible. He also stressed that if we do have to be around others that we must adhere to the social distancing guidelines. Our Church leaders have fully supported these official guidelines. When it is absolutely necessary to hold ceremonial meetings it will be limited to groups of less than 10 and we will adhere strictly to the rules of social separation (at least 6 feet and no hand shaking, etc.) and sanitary practices (e.g., hand washing, disinfecting meeting areas, etc.). If you are not feeling well, please do not attend. For the next 30 days, any in-person presentations of ceremonials, regardless of how few participants, using actual presenters or video, will require advance approval from the State Deputy. Grand Knights should justify this request through their District Deputies.
- 2. Revised State Deputy guidelines on conducting CUF degrees using the video for online presentations are being worked on. We are also testing a method of doing a live CUF degree online. More information will be forthcoming soon in a future memo.
- 3. We are working on solutions for holding electronic (online) meetings so that Councils can have the option of conducting Business Meetings (a ceremonial) via internet. There are some very promising options and we will be sharing those as soon as we complete our testing.

Refresher Notes

Please share these Protocol notes with our new members.

When a member wishes to speak, he does so by rising from his seat, addressing the chair by saying "Worthy Grand Knight" or "Worthy Faithful Navigator" and renders the salute. (Representing the tree of the Cross, the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically opened hand, from top to bottom). The presiding officer recognizes the speaker by announcing his name and rendering the salute in return. (Representing the arms of the Cross, the presiding officer makes a horizontal motion, with his arm and horizontally open hand, from left to right.) (*Protocol Handbook*)

One rap — instructs your assembly to come to order or be seated; a ruling on an action has been concluded. Two raps — instructs assembly officers to stand. Three raps — instructs all to stand. Four raps — instructs all to kneel in prayer. (*Method of Conducting a Meeting*)







Our Lady of Guadalupe (Spanish: Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe), also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe (**Spanish:** Virgen de Guadalupe), is a Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary associated with a venerated image enshrined within the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The basilica is the most visited Catholic pilgrimage site in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site. Pope Leo XIII granted the venerated image a Canonical Coronation on October 12, 1895.

The image of Mary on the cloak is known as *Our Lady of Guadalupe* for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.
