State Deputy's Message

My Brothers,

This past month we held our State Council's Mid-Year meeting in Casa Grande, courtesy of Fr. Patrick J. Murphy Council 3136 and St. Anthony of Padua Parish. Thank you, brothers, for hosting a great weekend. Our special thanks go out to the Ladies of the local Catholic Daughters of America who served us a couple of great meals. The meeting was well attended by District Deputies, District Wardens, Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries and council officers from every corner of the state.

This meeting is literally one for the history books. We held the first combined Charity, Unity, and Fraternity (CUF) degree exemplification. For the first time since the founding of our order, have we lifted the vail of secrecy from our initiation degrees. Now, under the new format, our new brothers with their family and friends observing the conferring of Knighthood, can share this wonderful experience with them. During this history-making event 12 brothers received the honors of all three degrees and 12 first degree brothers received their second and third degrees. My thanks to our worthy State Ceremonials Chairman and Conferring Officer Skip Hopler for overseeing this exemplification.

Since the Mid-Year meeting, eight more CUF exemplifications have been held. The first Spanish CUF degree was held a few days ago at Our Lady of Fatima Parish in Tucson where three candidates received full Knighthood during the ceremony. To-date, 61 candidates have been exemplified, including 31 new knights and 30 first degree knights. This is a turning point for the order brothers. Now, we can recruit and have our candidates fully initiated into the order faster than ever before. One of many positive comments we received about the CUF degree from our District Deputies said that the degree was, "Surprisingly well put together. I was not sure what to expect, but it was something that I could see drawing more men to the Order."

Going back to the Mid-Year in Casa Grande, the Knights present participated in the community's March for Life. We joined a couple hundred of the local pro-life warriors in their peaceful march through the streets of Casa Grande. This was a great opportunity to witness our defense of the sanctity of life and our commitment to preserve life at all stages from conception to natural death. Knights of Columbus also participated in the pro-life marches held in Phoenix and Tucson where thousands of pro-life supporters gathered, marched, and celebrated life. In Tucson, Mass was celebrated at the Cathedral by Bishop Weisenburger before the march to Holy Hope Cemetery. In Phoenix Bishop Olmsted addressed the assembled pro-lifers. We were happy to get to meet Abby Johnson, the former Planned Parenthood center director turned avid pro-life leader. Her story has been featured in a book and in the movie Unplanned. I encourage all brother Knights to continue to support life every day and be a firm witness to the sanctity of life.

The State Officers surveyed the District Deputies in attendance on how well we did with this year's meeting. The results were very pleasing to see. The Supreme Knight's remarks received the highest average score of 9.7 points out of 10. This was followed closely by the new CUF degree that was rated an average of 9.4 points. Saturday night's dinner rated 9.34 points. Rounding out the events of the four rated events of the meeting was the March for Life with 9.3 average points.

Brothers, it's February. That means it's time to make your preparations for the annual State Convention. Visit the convention website at azkofcstateconvention.org for registration and hotel reservations. This is the time that we issue a call for resolutions from our Councils for changes to State or Supreme by-laws or to show support for brothers interested in running for state office. Additionally, each council must choose its two delegates and submit their names to the State Council. Further communication will be released soon. If a council needs help, please do not delay in contacting the respective District Deputy or Assigned State Officer.

Congratulations on your efforts to-date in growing our numbers by 458 new brother Knights. We can't stop now. Our membership growth is not what it should be. Currently our state is 24th in the order, at 48% of our goal. Is your Council proactively searching out men and asking them to join the order? I suggest you organize and conduct more membership drives or hold an Insurance Benefits night as a recruitment tool. Then, by using the CUF degree, we should be able to initiate hundreds of candidates by the end of June. I know we can do this.



Brother Knights,

I write this letter at the end of January on the 75th Anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. One could look at the calendar and see that one week before was the day that we recognize the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and all he did to advance the civil rights movement. I look at these as reminders not simply of all that has been done to eradicate racism and hatred, but more importantly as a clarion call that there is still more work to do.

The feast for Dr. King reminds us that there is still racism in our world. It tells us that his dream is not closer to being realized and in some ways in the decades since his assassination we are even further to making that dream a reality. People are still shouting out that there is a supreme race and they want to create a pure race. They still believe that they must do what they can to eliminate people of other races, cultures, ethnicities and relgions. These thoughts are the poison that is being circulated through this country and many other countries in the world. If we ever hear such thoughts, we as Knights should be on the front lines to stop such lies from propagating. We must remember these moments from history and the figures that were prominent in bringing in front of our eyes the atrocities that humans do to one another, and we must step up. We must stand together and say, never again. We must believe together and have a dream. A dream where all God's children do not care about the color of one's skin, but of the content of their character.

Many of us have heard the quote attributed to George Santayana that states: "those who do not learn history are doomed to repeat it." We must take time this coming month dedicated to Black History and learn. While we are busy in our lives, we should never be too busy to read. We cannot base decisions, thoughts or judgments on 10-second sound bites. We need to enter into a subject and see the world from a different perspective. Let us spend time and Google Dr. King's 'I Have a Dream' speech or his 'Letter from a Birmingham Jail.' Short reads that allow us to see history from a different vantage point. Let us not stop there, let us take time to pray for an end to all the –isms that seek to breed a culture of death. We are Knights who strive to bring forth a culture of life by our words and deeds. Let us learn history as our children and grandchildren should never have to repeat the tragedies of the past, and they will not if we stand together and live out the love of Jesus Christ.

Brother Knights,

We are rapidly approaching Lent Is your Council on track for the Columbian Award? There are four required programs that each Council must complete to qualify. This month we are featuring a program perfect for the season Novena for Life:



Overview

The protection of life is a sustained prayer intention of the Church, and in particular of the Knights of Columbus. Knights remain firmly committed to defending the right to life of every human being – from the moment of conception to natural death. To commemorate and bolster this important cause, councils will promote a novena, nine days of sustained prayer, to build up a culture of life in our parishes, homes and wider community.

Action Steps

Working with your pastor, obtain his recommendations on conducting a Novena for Life. Consider using novenas provided by the USCCB, such as the 9 Days for Life Novena in January.

Set a date for the novena. Consider incorporating it as part of the council's participation in a 40 Days for Life campaign or schedule it to precede a major feast day or pro-life event.

Plan the schedule, events, and activities for the novena. Visit www.kofc.org/novena to explore resources for potential intentions, reflections, events and more. Requirements for the nine days are broad and should be molded to suit your parish and community. Keep the following recommendations in mind when planning your Novena for Life:

Anchor the beginning and end of the nine days with public church services like a Mass or rosary.

Consider organizing a social activity during the novena for the parish to come together and celebrate life

Involve members of many parish organizations, especially the parish school and religious education leaders, in promoting and participating in the novena and services

Invite members of local culture of life groups to join in your novena and services

Order Prayer for Life Prayer Cards (#4665) through Supplies Online, the supply ordering portal available on Officers Online, and distribute them to members of the parish. Have these prayer cards available the week prior to the start of the novena, at the opening church service and at all associated activities. Also place a good supply of prayer cards in your church and council hall.

Prior the start of the novena, use the sample press release as a model to create and distribute a tailored release to local media.

Build public interest for the event! Promote the Novena for Life in your parish and larger community through a variety of efforts:

Prominently display promotional posters (which can be ordered through Supplies Online)

Bulletin announcements

Pulpit announcements

Posting on your council and parish website / social media pages.

Good Friday Family Program

Brothers Now is the Time to plan for the Good Friday Family Program:

A Higher Purpose

Bring families into more robust practice and better understanding of the Catholic faith and the Easter services. In an effort to increase attendance and involvement, Knights of Columbus councils will conduct a promotional campaign to educate their parishes on the vital importance of Good Friday.

Overview

Despite Good Friday's central role in the heart of Christianity, attendance at services remains low. In an effort to change this, councils will encourage participation in Good Friday services through a promotional campaign. Setting an example for their community, Knights will attend Good Friday services with their families and work with their pastors to encourage increased parishioner involvement at these liturgies. In conjunction with these efforts, councils will also work to educate their parishes about the plight of Christians in the Holy Land and other areas around the globe where Christians are persecuted for their faith.

Working with your pastor, obtain his recommendations on conducting the Good Friday Family Promotion program.

Plan a thoughtful promotional campaign to encourage parishioners and the greater community to attend church services at your parish on Good Friday. Incorporate a call to action to support Christians struggling in the Middle East today.

Promote Good Friday in your parish and larger community through a variety of efforts:

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, promote Good Friday services at Friday Fish Fries and other parish and council meetings and events throughout the Lenten season. Be sure to give plenty of reminders in the weeks leading up to Good Friday.

Ask council members to take direct action and encourage their family and friends to attend.

The Mid-Year Meeting in Casa Grande was a big success, State Officers, District Deputies, Program Directors, Committee Chairmen and Brother Knights had the opportunity to exchange ideas and form a plan for recruiting, in the second half of the fraternal year. There was a true excitement at the end of the weekend, knowing Arizona is growing our membership and our Order is strong.

In the first week of January Arizona had little to no membership growth. At the Mid-Year Meeting the Charity, Unity and Fraternity Exemplification Degree changed that! Brothers from 8 councils brought 12 new Knights into the Order and 12 Brother Knights went from a 1st Degree Knight to becoming a 3rd Degree Knight. This was just the beginning. Over the last 3 weeks of the month Arizona membership has continued to grow. This growth is due to the hard work of our District Deputies, Grand Knights, Membership Chairmen and Brother Knights. This momentum needs to continue through the end of the fraternal year. If you do not have membership drives on your council calendar its not too late. With Lent beginning at the end of February and our Parish RCIA classes nearing completion, there is no better time to reach out and find those men that need our Order.

Many councils are in the middle of their dues billing cycle. For some this will start the process of retaining men that have fallen away from their council. Arizona has an experienced retention Chairman, Len Rheaume. Len is a resource that can be used in locating a Brother Knight. He uses programs that give him recent addresses and phone numbers of the men you can't find. The Membership Retention Contact Form is available on the state website. This is a form to be used when you are having trouble contacting a member. The form works as a guide, assisting you in documenting every step of the retention process. Use this form and reach out to Len if you need assistance. Remember, retention starts at recruitment. As Brother Knights we need to make every possible effort to keep our Brothers in the Order. We do not know all that they are going through. We are here to help.

Arizona has many councils that are completing the requirements for the Star Council award. For every council there is still time to focus on those requirements and have a plan. Remember, Star Council is a prestigious award for your council and it comes with a financial prize. Any council receiving the 2019-2020 Star Council Award will receive a \$4.50 credit for every billable member, towards their Supreme Per Capita bill in 2020-2021. That is a large amount of money for any council.

Degree news.

Exciting news: the new Charity, Unity and Fraternity (CUF) degree is now being performed across the State and the feedback is overwhelmingly favorable. In addition to the script in English, which we received in mid-January, we now have the script in Spanish. By the time you read this, DD Luis Leyva will have reported that Our Lady of Fatima held a live exemplification in Spanish at Our Lady of Fatima in Tucson. Thanks to Council #14121 for hosting this important milestone.

We are getting very favorable feedback from our family members who are attending the degrees of their husbands and fathers. Our family members can now more fully understand who we are as Knights and how important it is for us to have their support and for them to accompany us on the journey.

With the availability of the new scripts our teams no longer have to rely on the video but can present the lessons live using our council/district teams. Current Admissions degree teams should be practicing and using the new CUF degree from here forward. The State teams will be completing their scheduled degrees using the CUF as well. (Note: in Arizona we are no longer using the previous 2nd/3rd degree scripts.) The basilica is the most visited Catholic pilgrimage site in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site. Pope Leo XIII granted the venerated image a Canonical Coronation on October 12, 1895.

The image of Mary on the cloak is known as *Our Lady of Guadalupe* for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.
