During the Saturday meeting we will adjourn at 10:20 A. M. so that Knights and family members can join in Casa Grande's Pro-life March and Rally. This coincides with the Tucson Diocese Pro-Life March and Rally in Tucson. Bring your council banners to process with during the March. Also, don't forget your walking shoes and Rosary beads for a short stroll down the street while praying to end abortion.

Many of you have already heard that the Supreme Council is introducing a new degree format that will provide a new Knight candidate an opportunity to receive all three degrees, Admissions, Formation, and Knighthood, in one exemplification ceremony. Attendees will have an opportunity to learn more about the new degree and observe the ceremony up close and personal during the Mid-Year meeting. Councils are encouraged to bring candidates with them to be some of the first to be exemplified during this new ceremony.

January is also the month in which we remember the 1973 Supreme Court decision that gave way to the legalized murder of nearly 61 million babies through abortion. On or about the anniversary date of the decision, rallies and marches are held to publicly pray that this horrible decision is overturned, that abortion ends, and that workers in the abortion industry experience a conversion of heart and refuse to lift another hand against the unborn.

The March in Tucson will take place January 11, 2020 at 10:30 A. M. starting at St. Augustine Cathedral, 192 S Stone Ave. Following a 9:00 A. M. Mass at the church, marchers will gather in the parking lot and then March 4.2 miles to Holy Hope Cemetery, 3535 N. Oracle Road. Upon arrival at the cemetery, about noon, a Pro-Life rally will be held and is open to the public, including marchers and those who could not march. The march will take place rain or shine. Bishop Weisenburger will be participating and presiding.

On January 18, 2020, in Phoenix, people will gather for the bi-annual Pro-Life March and Rally at 10:30 A. M. on Washington Street, adjacent to Cesar Chavez Memorial Plaza, 201 W. Washington. After a brief address, the march will begin at about 11:30 A. M. The march will proceed West about one mile to Wesley Bolin Plaza at the State Capitol, 17th Avenue and Washington/Adams. The Pro-Life Rally, with guest speaker Abbey Johnson, former Planned Parenthood Clinic Director and best-selling author of the movie Unplanned, will begin at 12:30 P. M. The rally will conclude at 2:00 P. M. If you can't march, attend the rally. Support the sanctity of life!

Coming up on February 1st is the Phoenix Catholic Men's Conference. The conference will be held at Xavier College Prep Performing Arts Center, 4710 North Fifth Street, Phoenix. The theme this year is "Catholic Men Linked as Brothers." What a perfect theme for the event this year as our own Supreme Knight Carl Anderson will be a principal guest speaker. I strongly urge every Knight to attend this event designed to spiritually nourish, energize, and uplift. Registration is now open, so do not delay, sign up today as seating is limited. The event website is www.cmfp.org.

Our fraternal year is not over yet, we're just beginning. Get everyone aboard the bus, put it in high gear, and head to the finish line. Let's make it a strong finish! Yes, that means that we need to start preparations for the State Convention in May, begin composing any resolutions to present, start thinking about State Awards submissions, elect your council delegates, sell State Charitable Raffle tickets, and hold elections for your council officers. Also, you have ample time to complete required service programs for Columbian and Star Council eligibility. Speaking of the Star Council Award reminds me to mention membership and insurance.

Seriously brothers, **do not deny** a Catholic man the honor of becoming your brother *by not asking* him to join the Knights of Columbus. For that man's sake, for the sake of his family, for the sake of his parish, for the salvation of his soul, please ask him to join us. 

Brother Knights,

We are halfway through the Fraternal year. Is you Council on track for the Columbian Award? There are four required programs that each Council must complete to qualify. Over the next four months I will be featuring one of these programs. This month is Spiritual Reflection:

Many Catholic young people can attest that religious retreats are radically rejuvenating spiritual events that often leave a lasting impact on participants' relationship to their faith. Yet, so often, retreats seem only to be offered to students and youth. Working with their pastors, Knights of Columbus councils can hold low-cost retreats of their own. These events might be held for council members or men of the parish – or may be open to entire families. If councils



are unable to organize these events themselves, they could go as a group and attend a retreat in their area to satisfy the requirement

Guidelines for the Spiritual Reflection Program

The definition of a "reflection" is broad but should be a day-long event at minimum and could possibly encompass an entire weekend.

Councils can attend religious retreats and days of reflection organized by other groups. However, if they are attending a reflection and not planning it themselves, council attendance should be significant with at least 10 percent of the council or a minimum of

members participating. Perhaps your Council could attend the Phoenix Men's Conference on February 1, 2020. Info about the conference cam be found at: http://www.cmfp.org/2020conference

Reflections and retreats can be held at the council level but councils could also collaborate with other councils in the area to host a Spiritual Reflection.

If planning a retreat for the council, consider holding it on church property and have volunteers pack lunch or provide their own meals to defer costs.

Be creative! Make a pilgrimage to a nearby basilica, monastery or convent. Celebrate Mass with the religious or your chaplain/pastor.

It is strongly encouraged that councils incorporate Mass within their program, celebrating the liturgy with your chaplain/pastor. Also, incorporate opportunities for other sacramental and liturgical activities such confession, Eucharistic adoration, a rosary or all of these.

My Brother Knights,

The first half of our fraternal year is over and the mid-year meeting is approaching. For the last 6 months, Arizona has done a fantastic job of recruiting new men into our Order and retaining our current members. We have recruited over 390 new members. That ranks Arizona as 21st in intake percentage compared to the other 74 jurisdictions in the world. That is a great accomplishment and puts us in a good position to meet all of this fraternal years local, state and supreme goals.

The 2019 District Deputy Fast Start Incentive concluded recently. District 4 Ben Jimenez (18 new), District 18 Larry Lickfelt (25 new) and District 27 Tom White (17 new) had a minimum of 1 new member in each of their assigned councils for the 4-month period, as outlined in the incentive. They have each received \$100.00, congratulations!

The 2019 Council Fast Start Incentive has also ended. The checks were recently sent out to the councils reaching the required goals. Congratulations to the following councils for achieving the listed percentage of their yearly membership goal:

50% - Councils 10799, 16856, 8077, 7521, 12708, 12078, 9312 and 15164 received \$50.

75% - Councils 14621, 1729 and 10070 received \$75.

100% - Councils 17005, 15325, 17370 and 13895 received \$100.

125% - Councils 9995 and 7159 received \$125.

In addition to the cash prize each council will receive a Star Recruiter pin for the Grand Knigh

There is still much work to be done. We have a firm base moving into the second half of the year. We all need to remember to use the tools we have, they are effective and simple to use. Promoting our Faith in Action Programs and putting our award winning insurance program information out to every Catholic man. Using Prospect Landing Pages, giving every member of your Council the ability to start the process of a man joining the Knights, working as an online interest card. Online Membership takes things one step further and brings that man into the Order as a Knight of Columbus. Degree news. As we start the new civil calendar year we are engaged in New Year Resolutions, the start of the new personal tax year, reset of many of our other annual functions and practices. However, we should also remember that we live by other calendars as well. Our Church calendar started on the first week in December and has already brought us through Our Savior's birth. Our Knights' Fraternal calendar started in July and we are halfway through the Year. During the second half of this FY we will be introducing the new Combined degree called the Charity, Unity, Fraternity (CUF) Degree. As you may have read in last month's KO-COA, the CUF degree will be presented at the Mid-Year Meeting in Casa Grande on Saturday morning January 11, 2020 and will be open to current members and families as well as candidates for First, Second or Third degrees (and their families). Grand Knights and District Deputies will very shortly receive a Degree Announcement Letter with instructions for this exemplification and what is required to bring a candidate to the Degree. This ceremony will include a 25-minute video presentation by the Supreme Knight introducing the reasons for the new degree, followed by a 30-minute exemplification of the CUF Degree. Follow-on exemplifications of this degree will not include the Supreme Knight's address. At the end of the exemplification, the candidate is a full Third-Degree member of the Order. Since families are welcome to attend the exemplification, this will be a joyous occasion for the entire family and an open demonstration to all of the principles of the Knights of Columbus.

We will be doing all Degrees as CUF degrees in the near future (both old and new degree formats are still acceptable) and the State Deputy will announce that changeover date in the very near future. In the meantime, the State website has the dates and places for the degrees for the remainder of this fraternal year and when we change to the new CUF degree we will still stick to this schedule. However, as more local CUF teams are organized and trained, we will be seeing this new degree done more often by local Councils as it also replaces the current First degrees that the Councils currently perform.

The Council Knights provide the pallbearers for Our Lady's statue.





The night before members of Council 14583 assembled at the church and built a replica of Mount Tepeyac.

At the start of every fraternal year, it has become a long-standing custom in Arizona that the State Deputy introduces a new State Pin and logo design. During the organizational meeting last June, the Worthy State Deputy told the attendees, "This year's pin design is meant to be a visual, daily reminder, of what we stand for and the depth of our commitment to serve God, our parishes, and our neighbors."

Around the outer edge of the pin and logo design we find the guiding principles of the Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. They remind us of who we are as Knights of Columbus and what we do.

Within the circle, an image of the State of Arizona is found at the center, emblazoned with the Emblem of the Order. This represents the Arizona State Council and its jurisdictional responsibility for all of the State of Arizona.

This year, the Worthy State Deputy has dedicated his administration to Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The image of Mary on the cloak is known as *Our Lady of Guadalupe* for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.

Mary's visit to Guadalupe is a reminder that God will remember his mercy for all people. In Mary's song of joy, the Magnificat, she praised God because he has put down the mighty, exalted the lowly, filled the hungry, and sent the rich away empty. People honor *Our Lady of Guadalupe* because they recognize her motherly concern for them.

Working under our theme of "Knights Serving God, Serving The Community, This Is Who We Are, This Is What We Do", the cross is included so that we are reminded that we are all children of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The cross also symbolizes the gift we received through the death of Jesus Christ – forgiveness of sin and a path to everlasting life.

Finally, included in the lower right portion of the logo are two small baby's feet. These are included to remind us that we must always fight to preserve the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death.

The Worthy State Deputy says that he hopes that the pin and logo will keep us focused on unity and fraternity as we perform works of charity in service to all.

Our Lady of Guadalupe (Spanish: Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe), also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe (Spanish: Virgen de Guadalupe), is a Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary associated with a venerated image enshrined within the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The basilica is the most visited Catholic pilgrimage site in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site. Pope Leo XIII granted the venerated image a Canonical Coronation on October 12, 1895.

Prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe
