State Deputy's Message

Brothers,

Welcome to the 2019-2020 Fraternal Year. This past weekend, we held the State Organizational Meeting. Much was discussed. Plans were made, information exchanged, and lessons learned shared. My thanks to Father Gary Regula, Pastor of St. Jerome's Catholic Church in Phoenix, for accepting an appointment as our State Chaplain. Father Gary will provide the State Council with spiritual guidance and support. I am grateful that Fr. Regula said yes to Our Lord and became a priest, that he said yes to the



Knights of Columbus, and that he said yes to me to be our new State Chaplain.

Our world is hurting. There is a cancer that is dark, malignant, and growing within. The prognosis may seem bleak, even critical, maybe terminal. The symptoms include crimes by people against people: murders, assaults, robberies, thefts, drug and alcohol related car crashes, child and elder abuse, abortions, and restrictions to religious freedoms. Society no longer trusts and respects law enforcement, firefighters and first responders. Political parties no longer advocate for their constituents, instead they answer to party platforms and to their financial backers who make their money killing babies.

Who can stop the growth of this darkness that seems to be consuming us? Our priests and bishops are doing all they can to evangelize for life. Can they cure these ills by themselves? No. Who, then, should they turn to for help? Our bishops and priests turn to the Knights of Columbus, because they know the Knights will fight to the last man to turn the culture of death into one of life. That is who we are – this is what we do. We are the Knights of Columbus. We serve God. We serve the community.

As Knights, we take the long view in all that we do. The battle will not be won in a day, or a year, but it will be won. It will take all of us working together. We will support pro-life organizations in our Dioceses. We will gather at abortion centers to pray. We will work with our pastors to evangelize for life in our parishes. We will raise funds for ultrasound machines. We will participate in annual pro-life marches in our communities. We will erect monuments to the unborn. At the ballot box, we will vote for life. That is who we are – this is what we do.

During the Saturday night banquet, I was overwhelmed by the hard work and generosity of one Tucson Council. Grand Knight Dave Chohon of the Roy Champeau Council #8077 presented the State Council with a check for \$19,000 to go toward the purchase of an ultrasound machine for a crisis pregnancy center in Arizona. Not only did the members of this council, at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish in

Tucson, conduct a highly successful fund raiser, they did it with the help of every parish organization, the complete support of their pastor, and Diocese of Tucson's Bishop Weisenburger.

They specifically chose Mother's Day to hold a special dinner. Mothers are life givers and a day dedicated to motherhood is quite appropriate for a fund raiser to save a baby's life. During the dinner, they held a silent auction for various items of different minimum values. The big prize was a dinner with the Bishop. The winning bid was \$1,000 for this prize. Many other donors either bid or donated to the cause at the same \$1,000 level. Even after the event the donations kept coming. They also invited several mothers to speak about their near-death experience that was prevented by an ultrasound.

Brothers, people do respect life and want to help. This is a great example of what can be done when a council and an entire parish come together for the perfect cause. The money raised will ultimately be matched by the Supreme Council dollar-for-dollar so that an ultrasound can be purchased, and lives saved from abortion. I want to see more councils do the same. This is what we do – this is who we are.

What else can we as Knight do to save our world from this cancer? As Knights, we need to serve God, grow our faith, and give all that we do for the honor and glory of God, His son Jesus Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit. We will build up our families and not allow our children to become victim to the empty promises of the secular culture. Armed with faith, we will take our programs out into the community to help those in need. We will use our faith and beliefs to defend the sanctity of life and protect marriage and family life.

The Knights of Columbus is the strong right arm of the Catholic Church. Each parish community and its pastor are the firm foundation upon which the Catholic Church is built. With faith as our foundation, everything else falls into place, and put our Faith in Action. As Knights, we serve God. As Knights we serve our community. As Knights this is what we do because it is who we are.



Every year, the State Deputy introduces a new logo and State Pin. This year's design is meant to be a visual, daily reminder, of what we stand for and the depth of our commitment to serve God, our parishes, our order, the most vulnerable, and our Blessed Mother. The element of this year's logo and pin are encircled by the principles of the Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. Within this circle, the State of Arizona is found emblazoned with the Emblem of the Order representing the Arizona State Council.

An image of Our Lady of Guadalupe represents Mary as patroness of the Order and of the Diocese of Phoenix. Through Her apparition to Juan Diego in 1531, Mary brought millions into the Church to worship her Holy Son. She embodies hope and protection from evil and persecution. The cross is included to reminded us that we are all children of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our theme, motto and pin will keep us focused in unity and fraternity to perform works of charity in service to all.

During the Organizational Meeting, Past State Deputy Larry Costanzo reported on the Arizona Rosary Celebration. This year the celebration will be held over the weekend of October 19-20, 2019 in Tucson and Phoenix. Raising funds for the event is the first and most important task. The program needs to raise \$80,000 as soon as possible to ensure the event in both venues can take place. I ask every Council and Assembly to purchase advertising right away. I ask that Knights make donations or collect funds through Booster Ads. During the event itself. I want to see each council in the blessing procession waving their banner. The deadline for Advertising is September 7, 2019. Don't delay. Public prayer is needed to help kill the cancer. Go to www.azrosary.net for more information.





Brother Knights,



State Secretary – Mario Vassallo

Brothers,

One of the first tasks that a State Secretary need to work on at the start of a new Fraternal Year is to generate the first half-year Per Capita assessment of each Council in the Arizona Jurisdiction. These assessments are based on active and inactive membership information provided on the Supreme Officer Online website as of July 1.

For a six-month period, the State Council assesses a Council \$3.50 for each of its active members and \$2.25 for each of its inactive member. A rebate of \$0.10 per active member is awarded if a Council submits payment prior to a set date.

Donations to St. Joe's Youth Camp and the Navarrete Vocation fund is also recommended in the assessment. The recommended rates are \$1 per active member for St. Joe's Youth Camp and a penny per day per active member for the Navarrete Vocation fund. A Council may decide to donate the full amounts or partial amounts, depending on how much a Council can afford.

Councils should expect to receive their Per Capita assessments in early July. Copies will be sent to the Grand Knight, Financial Secretary and District Deputy.

I wish you all a very productive Fraternal Year and a great Fourth of July.







Arizona Rosary Chairman – Larry Costanzo

The 2019 AZ Rosary Celebration (ARC) is rapidly approaching when we will honor Mary under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe on the weekend of October 18 - 20, 2019. Bishop Olmsted will dedicate the diocese to the protection of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The honoring of Our Lady of Guadalupe goes back to the 16th century. Chronicles of that period tell us the story. A poor Indian named Cuauhtlatohuac was baptized and given the name Juan Diego. He was a 57-year-old widower and lived in a small village near Mexico City. On Saturday morning December 9, 1531, he was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in honor of Our Lady.

Juan was walking by a hill called Tepeyac when he heard beautiful music like the warbling of birds. A radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico, a Franciscan named Juan de Zumarraga. The bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared.

Eventually the bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. About this same time Juan's uncle became seriously ill. This led poor Juan to try to avoid the lady. Nevertheless, the lady found Juan, assured him that his uncle would recover, and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma.

On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.

Father Gonzalez is concluding studies on the Nican Mopohua and on the image of the Virgin of Guadalupe.

As you know, ARC is expensive and is only funded by advertising in our Program Book and by donations. We have formed an advisory group to help us solicit and secure the necessary funds to support the effort. Joe Shanks, DD #13 will head that committee. To help us in that endeavor to fund ARC, we ask that every council and assembly have an item in their annual budget to purchase an ad in the Program Book. The ads range from \$50.00 for a quarter page to \$400.00 for full a page. In addition, it would be helpful to the Tucson and Phoenix Committees if each council and assembly would appoint a contact for ARC. Submit the names by email: azrosary@yahoo.com.

Our Co-chairs: Karen McEwen and Al Tucker in Tucson and Danny Haywood and Greg Mattingly in Phoenix, are currently working to firm chairperson assignments and provide guidance as to actions needed. We are looking forward to another successful Rosary Celebration, but it will not happen without the support of every Knight of Columbus in the State of Arizona. Remember, Brothers, that this is an Arizona Knights of Columbus sponsored event and we need everyone's help.





Brother Knights,

2018-2019 Fraternal Year REview

Be sure to review your 2018-2019 fraternal year in June. Hold a joint-session of incoming and outgoing officers and discuss what lessons were learned this past year. What can be done better for next year? Strive to increase membership and programming activities in the new fraternal year.

2019-2020 Fraternal Year PREview

Finalize your council's calendar of events for the 2019-2020 fraternal year. Meet with your pastor and pastoral staff to set all these program dates on the parish calendar. Aim to increase membership and programming activities to attract new members. Keep asking yourself:

- Which prospects will I be inviting to our council's next activity?
- What new program(s) does our council plan to institute this year?
- Have I personally asked someone to join my council?

SWOT Analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats)

SWOT stands for: Strength, Weakness, Opportunity, Threat. A SWOT analysis guides you to identify your organization's strengths and weaknesses (S-W) as well as broader opportunities and threats (O-T). Developing a fuller awareness of the situation helps with both strategic planning and decision-making. Use this as an opportunity to assess your council and your parish to help build your fraternal year.

On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.

Mary's visit to Guadalupe is a reminder that God will remember his mercy for all people. In Mary's song of joy, the Magnificat, she praised God because he has put down the mighty, exalted the lowly, filled the hungry, and sent the rich away empty. People honor **Our Lady of Guadalupe** because they recognize her motherly concern for them.

Working under our theme of *"Knights Serving God, Serving The Community, This Is Who We Are, This Is What We Do",* the cross is included so that we are reminded that we are all children of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The cross also symbolizes the gift we received through the death of Jesus Christ – forgiveness of sin and a path to everlasting life.

Finally, included in the lower right portion of the logo are two small baby's feet. These are included to remind us that we must always fight to preserve the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death.

The Worthy State Deputy says that he hopes that the pin and logo will keep us focused on unity and fraternity as we perform works of charity in service to all.
