The Supreme Board of Directors elected to replace Supreme Knight Anderson, Patrick Kelly. Supreme Knight Kelly is the 14th Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus. Starting March 1, 2021, he will serve as chief executive officer and chairman of the board of the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization. His election as Supreme Knight follows a distinguished career in the Knights of Columbus, the military and public service. For more than 25 years, he has served Church and country, which will serve him well in advancing the Knights' mission of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.

One of the newly elected Supreme Knight's, and my own priorities, is to continue to grow the order. We need more Knights because there is much to be done. I ask you to make membership your top priority starting today. As you return to having in-person meetings, start making plans for Church drives and Faith In Action activities. Let's make a big push from now until the end of June to meet our membership goals for the year. Recruit, invite, sign, and exemplify our principles, is all it takes. Remember that Supreme has forgiven this fraternal year's council per capita. I know you can make it happen.

At the start of my message, I mentioned the word gatherings, as in face-to-face meeting. In May we are planning to hold our State Convention in-person. The 114th annual Arizona Knights of Columbus Convention will be held May 21-22, 2021 at the Embassy Suites by Hilton in Scottsdale. The convention website can be found at https://www.azkofcstateconvention.org. Logon now, register and make your reservations. As with any convention, now is the time to select delegates, prepare resolutions, and submit state award nominations. Mary Ann and I look forward to seeing you in person.

With the beatification of Blessed McGivney, the Supreme Council has launched a new Faith in Action program. Every Council is asked to plan and conduct a Holy Hour of Prayer in your parish or Council. Spread devotion and spiritually grow closer to Blessed Michael McGivney by praying the rosary with readings and reflections based on his life and mission. The Blessed Michael McGivney Prayer Hour is an opportunity to invite Knights, their families, and the entire parish to follow the example of Blessed Michael McGivney. More information is being sent out to Grand Knights and program directors. Resources can be found on the Supreme website.

March 29 is a special day in the Knights of Columbus. It is the day we celebrate as Founder's Day. It is the birthday of the order. What better way to say Happy Birthday to our order than to hold a birthday party? Each council is asked to hold a special Founder's Day activity and invite your whole parish (within physical distancing boundaries of course). Combine it with the Blessed McGivney Holy Hour of Prayer. This could be done virtually too. Say a special thank you to our founder.

Another important day to remember this month is March 19. This is the Feast of St. Joseph. Our Holy Father has declared this year as the year of St. Joseph. As Knights we should take the lead in our parish communities by working with our pastors to commemorate this important feast in some special way. These are both great programs and can also be a great way to recruit new members.

We find ourselves in Lent. It is a time to turn away from sin and return to the Gospel. It is a time to distance ourselves from worldly distractions and focus on the cross. What should we be doing as Catholics and Knights of Columbus? While Lenten soup nights are not on the menu in most parishes this year, it does not mean that we can't hold drive up soup nights, or even deliver soup to the homebound. I noticed that several councils are taking their Friday fish fries curbside. Great ideas. Knights can always lead physical or virtual Stations of the Cross. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are our Lenten watchwords.

In reading Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians, I am drawn to Chapter 4 that very much reminds me of why we are Knights and how we are to go about and do our Father's business. In talking about the diversity of gifts Christ gives us, he wrote, "And he gave some as apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers, to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ (Ephesians 4:11-12)." We are the apostles, prophets, and evangelists, pastors and teachers. He has equipped us to build up the body of Christ. Saint Paul tells us that Jesus Christ gave us several rules for our new life in Him. He wrote,

"Therefore, putting away falsehood, speak the truth, each one to his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun set on your anger, and do not leave room for the devil. The thief must no longer steal, but rather labor, doing honest work with his [own] hands, so that he may have something to share with one in need. No foul language should come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for needed edification, that it may impart grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. [And] be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ (Ephesians 4:25-32)."

Have a happy Lent.

Dear Brother Knights,

As we journey deeper into the beautiful season of Lent, I would like to share with you the words of a prayer that I had seen quite a number of years ago. These words seem especially appropriate as so many people think that the forty days of Lent are so long to have to abstain and fast. Many people at times give up at some point in the Lenten season as they feel they cannot give up something, not even for another day. These words were written by Ted Loder, a retired United Methodist minister. I feel they ring true no matter what faith one professes, but they are a means to draw us closer to Jesus during this graced season.

"Sometimes, Lord, it just seems to be too much:

too much violence, too much fear; too much of demands and problems;

too much of broken dreams and broken lives; too much of war and slums and dying;

too much of greed and the sounds of people devouring each other and the earth;

too much of stale routines and quarrels; unpaid bills and dead ends;

too much of words lobbed in to explode and leaving shredded hearts and lacerated souls; too much of turned away backs and yellow silence, red rage and the bitter taste of ashes in my mouth.

Sometimes the very air seems scorched by threats and rejection and decay until there is nothing but to inhale pain and exhale confusion.

Too much of darkness, Lord, too much cruelty and selfishness and indifference...

Too much, Lord, too much, too bloody, bruising, brain washing much.

Or is it too little, too little of compassion, too little of courage, of daring, of persistence, of sacrifice; too little of music and laughter and celebration?

O God, make of me some nourishment for these starved times, some food for my brothers and sisters who are hungry for gladness and hope, that, being bread for them, I may also be fed and be full."

The season of Lent is for us a time to grow closer to Christ, but if we fill it up with our complaints and the declaration of 'look at me, and how much I am sacrificing' we are missing the point. We need to make time and take time to be closer to Christ as He is the only answer for any of our questions, pains or doubts. Jesus is the one that will help us to treat one another better, to bestow mercy upon them as we have received and to love as we have been loved in the cross of our Savior. May this Lent which is only forty days provide all of us the time to reflect, the time to pray and fast, the time to give of ourselves in service to others. May this graced season point out the ways we have been 'too little' of a blessing in people's lives and inspire and challenge us to bring Christ to them and be Christ to all others. We may cry out too much because we have not entrusted our hearts and lives to Christ, but if we do we will feel that in Him we live and move and have our being. May you and your families have a blessed season of Lent by commending yourself to Christ, so he can use you to serve all children of God.

We are now 2 weeks into our Lenten season. Things are beginning to loosen up, just a little. Our WSD is allowing live meetings and gatherings beginning March 1; hopefully this will bring our councils that have been pretty dormant, back to life the remaining months of the fraternal year.

A few weeks ago Supreme gave us a new Remote Programming Supplement. This supplement gives multiple suggestions on performing all of the suggested FIA programs either remotely or safely in small groups. This information was emailed to all GKs and DDs; it also can be found on the state website under programs. Grand Knights and council Program Directors need to study this supplement to see how it may help your council stay active, right now. It WILL help those councils that have been active but are maybe running out of new ideas; as well as be helpful to those councils that have not been active at all... there is something for everyone in this guide.

Our WST Tom Kato put together a list of programs that councils have been performing the first half of the year. As you can see, many councils have found a way to volunteer and help out even under the pandemic restrictions. Please check it out and hopefully it may give you a few ideas for your council programming going forward.

McGIVNEY HOLY HOUR

Our Worthy Supreme Knight elect has designed a holy hour of prayer dedicated to our founder, Blessed Michael McGivney. Although the Order is much bigger today, and the insurance benefits reach far beyond one parish, recruiting hasn't changed. The Order is grown one man at a time. Has your council grown this year?

Arizona has 137 councils and 57 have not increased their size this fraternal year. March is a great opportunity for every council in Arizona to grow. One man, that's all that is needed. If every council recruited one new member, we would have one of the best recruiting months ever. Take a moment to decide who in your council should take on this challenge. What man will look around at a Mass and start a conversation? The answer is simple. It is the responsibility of every Knight to grow the Order. You are the man to accept this challenge and give the gift of the Order to a Brother Catholic.

As of March 1^{st,} Worthy State Deputy Mario Vassallo is allowing in person meetings and events. This is the first time in many months that in person recruiting is allowed by the State Deputy. We are doing this until Palm Sunday, March 28th in five cities: Flagstaff, Phoenix, Glendale, Tempe and Tucson.


St. Joseph's Day, also known as the Feast of Saint Joseph, is the feast day for St. Joseph – which falls on March 19th each year. Saint Joseph is believed by Christians to have been the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the step-father of Jesus Christ. In Poland and Canada, it is a Patronal Feast Day and is Father's Day in some Catholic countries such as Italy and Spain. In Switzerland, it is a public holiday.

On some Western calendars, St. Joseph's Day was clearly marked on March 19th by the 10th century. By the late 15th century, the custom was adopted by Rome. In 1570, Pope St. Pius V extended its use to the entire Roman Rite. From the late 19th century through the middle of the 20th century, a feast day had been established to honor St. Joseph as the spouse of the Virgin Mary. It was originally celebrated on the 3rd Sunday after Easter but was eventually moved to the Wednesday before and retitled The Solemnity of Saint Joseph. However, this celebration was abolished by Pope Pius XII in 1955.

As you have seen in his latest letter, the State Deputy has relaxed restrictions and is now allowing in-person degrees (and other meetings/social events) as long as we comply with parish and pastor guidelines. With the widespread delivery of vaccinations we are trying to turn the corner on the spread of the Corona virus and return to some semblance of what use to be called "normal". I sense that the old normal is not the new normal and we have to adjust our programs to conform to the new normal. What is the new normal? Here are a few of the thoughts that I have.

- 1. Resume in person ceremonials (degrees and meetings). Our CUF Degrees can resume inperson presentations, but we are going to have to respect and adhere to social norms such as wearing masks, social distancing, scrupulous cleanliness in our gatherings. This will take some leadership action, but I am sure our GKs and DDs understand the importance of these precautions and will enforce them. Let's get back to in person meetings and share our fraternal presence. Note that the new Supreme guidelines emphasize the importance of the social aspect after our formal meetings. Check out the new guidelines on the Supreme website.
- 2. **Augment with online options.** Our exemplifications should consider that there are some brothers and families who cannot attend the ceremonials in person and we want to accommodate them as much as possible. Therefore, we want to try to put on degrees (and other ceremonials like Business and Officer meetings) in a hybrid format where we have an in person audience but we also make provisions for members to join virtually. Your Council must decide what constitutes a quorum for voting purposes and whether virtual attendance can be counted in the calculation of the quorum. Remember that voting on Council issues can only be done at general membership meetings. Officer meetings are meant to frame issues and present them at general membership meetings for a vote.
- 3. Teach others the science of online participation. The virtual option for meetings will be with us for the foreseeable future and as leaders we owe it to our membership to help them learn to use the electronic tools at our disposal. Don't let the excuse "I am too old to learn that new stuff" or "I don't have a good enough computer" be an excuse for not participating. Most everyone has a cell phone these days and can participate virtually using that tool. As a last resort almost all our virtual meetings allow telephone access without a computer. Let's bring our isolated brothers into our programs.
- 4. Form or renew your "home -grown" teams. I encourage all Grand Knights and District Deputies to revive their Council Degree Teams now and prepare them to put on CUF Degrees at the Council level. Don't just take the back-up route and use the Supreme video as the first exemplification option. Candidates benefit much more from degrees exemplified by brothers that they will see next month and at Knights social functions. How many of you remember the brothers who presented the degree to you for the first time? Wasn't it more memorable when it was the local team who exemplified you? Let's do the same for our future members.
