

State Deputy Mario Vassallo's Message



My dear Brothers,

Happy Easter! Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior has Risen!

As I write this message the Church celebrates the Feast of Saint Catherine of Siena. A lay member of the Dominican Order, she is a

Doctor of the Church and patroness against fire and illness. She is considered a mystic, activist, and author who influenced Italian literature and the Catholic Church. She is credited with persuading Pope Gregory XI to move the seat of the papacy to Rome from Avignon, France. She was canonized in 1461. She was born during a time of a great plague that stuck the region of Siena, Italy in 1347. Let us pray for St. Catherine's intercession for an end to this pandemic that is gripping the world.

Please remember Elizabeth Crino, mother of our former State Chaplain and friend, Father Patrick Crino. She passed away April 11, 2020. Fr. Crino said this regarding her death, "As she goes before us, we thank God for her. My cousin Cathy said it well, 'Easter is a lovely day to spend in Heaven.'" Our prayers and condolences go out to Fr. Pat and his family as they celebrate the life of Betty, who "will be remembered most for her selfless devotion to her family, the community, her faith, as well as her wonderful laugh!"

On Thursday April 16, 2020, the Supreme Council organized an online Charity, Unity, and Fraternity (CUF) degree exemplification for all states in the US and provinces in Canada. This was the first of its kind in the history of the order. Over 2,100 new brother knights were exemplified, and thousands of other current brother knights moved up to full knighthood. Arizona had 28 new brother knights exemplified and 125 brothers earned the honors of full knighthood.

State Deputy Mario Vassallo's Message (continued)

The first ever virtual Biennial Meeting of the Fourth Degree Arizona District was held April 18, 2020. In my address to the "assembled" brothers, I spoke of how the Coronavirus epidemic and the seclusion we are going through has forced us to develop new ways of how to conduct the business of the Order. The Order-wide CUF exemplification, held this past month sets the stage for many more similar exemplifications that the State plans to provide. Our Worthy State Ceremonials Chairman Skip Hopler and Worthy State Membership Director Bobby Nielsen have been working hard in laying the groundwork to make this happen.

In order for each jurisdiction to hold its mandatory annual state convention, the Supreme Council has established rules on how these meetings need to be conducted. A phone-based platform has been made available for all jurisdictions to use. Supreme has set a schedule for all the State Conventions, allowing a maximum time of 90 minutes for each convention. Subsequently, our Arizona State Convention will be held on Saturday May 16 from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 pm. The agenda will be very brief and will include the election of State Officers, election of delegates and alternates to the Supreme Convention, the approval of Resolutions, and approval of our State Council budget. Due to the cost per participant and technical limitations, I will only be inviting delegates, State Officers and Past State Deputies to attend the Convention. A recording of the Convention and a report will be made available a day or two after the Convention is over. The drawing of the State Raffle will take place after the end of the Convention. This will be shown using live video streamed on our State Council Facebook page. Award announcements will be postponed until the State Organizational Meeting, currently scheduled to take place June 26 to 28 at the Tucson Marriott University Park.

During the Biennial Meeting, the delegates proposed four brothers for consideration to become the next Master of the Arizona District. The new Master will take over from Worthy Master Bryant Sayers on September 1st. My thanks to Worthy Master and Past State Deputy Bryant Sayers for his outstanding, distinguished, and well-appreciated service these past four years. I look forward to continuing the great success of the Fourth Degree in Arizona under his leadership and that of the next District Master.

During the past weeks I began sending out Corona Virus updates consisting of information on how we can continue our works in charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism, while complying with federal and state mandates for social distancing and self-quarantine. - Supreme Per Capita has been waived for all councils for the second six-month period of this calendar year.
- State Per Capita will not be waived as this is the only source of operating revenue for the State Council.
- In the absence of Masses at our Churches you should watch Masses on TV or the internet.

- Recite the prayer for the Protection in Time of Pandemic found on the state website: www.kofc-az.org.
- Recite the Rosary each day.
- Recite the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel.
- MAGNIFICAT is temporarily making their online version available to everyone for free: English at https://us.magnificat.net/free, o por en Español at https:// latina.magnificat.net/gratis
- In the absence of in-person council meetings, councils can hold online meetings instead. In the alternative, voting can be handled through e-mail.
- The State Council has set up an Emergency Fund to be used to send donations to organizations in dire need of funds during this crisis and to purchase and deliver vital food items to brother nights suffering from financial hardships. Donations may be sent to State Secretary Luigi Baratta with checks made payable to Arizona Knights of Columbus with Emergency Fund in the memo section.
- Participate in the Leave No Neighbor Behind program just launched by the Supreme Council.
- Stay in touch with your Council brothers through email, text or better still an old-fashioned phone call. Find out how each is doing and whether they need any help.
- Partner with the St. Vincent De Paul Chapter in your parish to continue to help those in dire need.

Past State Deputy and Arizona Rosary Celebration Director, Larry Costanzo, informs me that we will continue with our efforts to hold our annual Arizona Rosary Celebration this October in Tucson and Phoenix. Bishops Olmsted and Weisenburger agree that, God willing, we must have this much needed celebration. This year, we honor Mary under her title of Undoer of Knots. This is an apt title in these times of pandemic, quarantine, and isolation from the Blessed Sacrament. We find ourselves tied and bound up by the ravages of this disease and our inability to fully participate in the sacraments. - Communication platform: FLS Connect.
- What is FLS Connect? FLS Connect is a phone-based communication system. In order for participants to attend
 the Convention they need to have provided their email address and the phone number they plan to use to connect.

- If you are a delegate or an alternate delegate and have not done so yet make sure to submit your phone number and email address to SES Rick Garrison as soon as possible. Delegates or alternate delegates who replace delegates won't be able to participate if we don't have this information.
- Due to the cost per participant and also certain technical issues I will only be inviting council delegates, State
 Officers and Past State Deputies to attend the Convention.
- IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR DELEGATES:
 - Confirmed voting delegates will be called through the number they provided, a few minutes before the Convention starts.
 - The State Deputy's designees may contact them to confirm their status as a delegate, and anyone who is not an official delegate will be removed from the call.
 - O It is important that they wait for the call, and not try to call in. That will cause problems. If the call is not received by a designated number of minutes after a designated time, delegates can call a phone line provided by the State Council to join the meeting and they will be screened as an official delegate and allowed to participate. The phone number to call will be provided later.
 - It is important that delegates wait for the call and not call in unless absolutely
 necessary. Also, they must call from the telephone number that was previously
 provided. If a delegate tries to call in using a different number, he will probably not be able to participate. This is comparable to a delegate losing his pass or credential at an in-person meeting.
 - Recognition to Speak. To seek recognition to speak, a delegate shall press *3 on his phone. He may be contacted by the State Deputy's designee(s) to verify the intent to speak. The delegate shall not mute his phone. If he needs to address the meeting, he will be put through. This is similar to a radio program where callers are screened and then permitted to speak to listeners.
 - Method of Voting. The voting will be conducted through secret electronic balloting by pressing numbers or symbols on delegates' telephones as instructed by the State Deputy unless, due to technological problems, another voting method is directed by the State Deputy.

- A recording of the Convention and a report will be made available a day or two after the Convention is over.
- We will be conducting the drawing of the State Raffle soon after the end of the Convention. This will be shown using live video streamed on our State Council Facebook page.
- Awards normally announced and given during the State Convention will be postponed till the State Organizational Meeting towards the end of June. We are hoping and keeping our fingers crossed that this meeting will take place in a normal fashion. The meeting is currently scheduled to take place at the Tucson Marriott University Park from June 26 till the 28.
- We are planning to replace the State Deputy breakfast with a number of future lunches at our halls in Tucson,
 Chandler and Glendale and a convenient location in Yuma. More information will be forthcoming.

Dear Brother Knights,

Happy Easter! Peace be with you!







My Brother Knights,

When Covid-19 changed our lives in March, many people thought recruiting new members into the Order would be difficult if not impossible. How would councils vote new members in? How would the exemplification be done? Where would we find men that want to join? After a short time of adjustment, Knights did what Knights do! Councils contacted men on their Prospect Lists, we asked relatives, friends and neighbors to join and we reached out to fellow parishioners. Men were brought into the Order through eMembership and quickly became involved in their local council online meetings.

The next hurdle was holding exemplifications. St. Anne Council 10540 took control of their situation under the guidance of District Deputy Jim Walsh, and a live online CUF Degree was held. With candidates, their families and many Knights watching, the Degree Team did a fantastic job. The ceremony was professionally done and the true message of Charity, Unity and Fraternity was presented to all.

Supreme Council also offered online exemplifications for the United States and Canada. The goal was to bring 1000 new members into the Order. The final numbers far exceeded the goal. At the April 16th exemplification, over 2100 men became Knights, 7000 Knights advanced to the 3rd Degree and 300 eMembers transferred to local councils. Thousands of Knights also attended as observers. Arizona brought 28 new members into the Order and 125 Knights advance to the 3rd Degree. After this overwhelming response, Supreme Council scheduled additional exemplifications for May 7th, 2020. Grand Knights and financial secretaries can invite eligible candidates for admission and advancement to participate by forwarding this downloadable PDF invitation to them.

Not to be outdone, Arizona Ceremonials Chairman Skip Hopler and his Degree Teams will be offering live CUF Exemplifications in May and June. Check out Skips KOCOA article for details. These are just a few examples of the great work that continues to be done.

Due to the Covid-19 virus many councils are not able to fundraise. Many of our churches, councils and families are struggling with finances. For this reason, Supreme will not be collecting Council Per Capita in July of 2020. This is a substantial savings to councils. Arizona will also offer a recruiting incentive that will pay councils \$10 for every new member added to their roster in May and June. Additional cash prizes are available to councils and district deputies that add the most members to their rosters. Consider these incentives and savings from Supreme when dealing with members that are not current on their dues. Helping a brother Knight in these tough times may be what is needed to bring that man back to the church or your council.



All Grand Knights and District Deputies have received an email with the above dates along with instructions on how to prepare candidates for these exemplifications. There is some advance paperwork to be done and all attendees (candidates, members and guests) must pre-register to gain access. Call your Grand Knight if you have candidates or just want to observe. Remember that candidates include new members, e-members and advancing members.

In addition, we are going ahead with the AZ State Council-sponsored CUF degrees on May 9th and June 14th and doing them online, so stay tuned for email notices on how to participate.

I want to thank Jim Walsh, DD #8, and his CUF degree team from Council #10540 for putting on an all-Arizona pioneer live online CUF degree for candidates from his District. The team presenters did an outstanding job and proved that local teams can successfully make this work. Jim will be facilitating the May and June online degrees also.

<u>Business Meetings Online</u>. My Council, #3855, conducted their meeting last month using the free version of WebEx. It has some limitations but was very useful for us. It has a polling/voting feature that is great for collecting and recording participants voting choices. You can truly hold a working meeting online. There are a number of other apps out there that will work but we have been asked not to use Zoom.

Refresher Notes. The following procedure is generally recognized as good form in making a motion.

- 1. A member obtains the floor through the following steps: Stands. (Except in very small or informal meetings, the grand knight should also stand.); Addresses the grand knight as "Worthy Grand Knight" and renders the salute. (Representing the tree of the Cross, the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically open hand, from top to bottom).
- 2. Grand knight recognizes the speaker by announcing his name and rendering the salute in return. (Representing the arms of the Cross, the grand knight makes a horizontal motion, with his arm and horizontally open hand, from left to right).

The speaker may not present the motion until recognized by the grand knight.

- 3. Member states the motion carefully. This is usually done by saying "I move that _____" or "I move the adoption of the following resolution." It is best to have the motion prepared in written form before the meeting.
- 4. If the motion requires a second, it must be seconded before it can be discussed. If it does not receive a second, it is lost. Any eligible member, other than the one who made the motion, may second it. Those seconding may remain seated, stating simply, "I second the motion."
- 5. The Grand Knight repeats the motion in full. Typically, this statement is along the lines of the following: "The motion has been made and seconded that______. Is there any discussion?"
- 6. The motion is then open for discussion. To participate, members must follow the aforementioned procedure (Step 1) to obtain the floor: Address the chair as "Worthy Grand Knight" and render the salute. Receive recognition by the Grand Knight, who announces the speaker's name and renders the salute in return. A good Grand Knight encourages as much discussion as possible. In this way, the facts and merits of the question are brought to light and members can vote more intelligently. Thorough discussion helps your council meetings feel more inclusive and satisfying to attendees. The person who makes the motion is usually given the opportunity to open and close the discussion.
- 7. After a motion and a second to move the previous question, the vote is taken. In the spirit of charity, full discussion should be encouraged before your council accepts a motion to move the previous question." Our Lady of Guadalupe (Spanish: Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe), also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe (**Spanish:** Virgen de Guadalupe), is a Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary associated with a venerated image enshrined within the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The basilica is the most visited Catholic pilgrimage site in the world, and the world's third most-visited sacred site. Pope Leo XIII granted the venerated image a Canonical Coronation on October 12, 1895.

The image of Mary on the cloak is known as *Our Lady of Guadalupe* for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.

Mary's visit to Guadalupe is a reminder that God will remember his mercy for all people. In Mary's song of joy, the Magnificat, she praised God because he has put down the mighty, exalted the lowly, filled the hungry, and sent the rich away empty. People honor *Our Lady of*
