

It is so gratifying to see the ranks of our Order grow. Growth in our numbers means also growth in the number of councils in our state necessary to serve all our brother Knights. Such is the case in the formation and charter of San Judas Tadeo Council 17370 in San Luis. Efforts to establish this council in this small border community, south of Yuma, have been on-going at the Parish for about 10 years. Congratulations to District Deputy 18 Larry Lickfelt and others for all their efforts to make this a reality.

Continuing the theme of growth in our order, October is one of two major months for Membership Recruitment. District Deputies and Grand Knights, I am expecting a great effort from you to organize Church Delta Drives to bring new members into our Order. My special thanks to St. Pope John XXIII 7159 in Paradise Valley and St. Philip the Apostle Council 9995 in Payson for achieving 157% and 125%, respectively, of their new member goals already. Great job gentlemen!

This past month, one of our own, was appointed to serve on this state's highest court. Sir Knight Bill Montgomery, a member of St. Mary Magdalene Council 13779 and a member of Vincent Paul Curcio Assembly 3327, of Gilbert, was appointed by Governor Doug Ducey to fill a vacancy on the Arizona Supreme Court. Brother Bill served as Maricopa County Attorney for the nation's fourth-largest county for eight years. He is a West Point graduate and decorated Gulf War veteran. We offer our congratulations and prayers to Brother Bill as he begins this new chapter of his public career upholding the ideals of justice on which our country is founded.

Sir Knight Jack Winger is a 25-year member of the Order. Congratulations to brother Knight Cadet Winger and to his father Sir Knight Jack and mother Kathy. We pray for the Lord to watch over and protect brother John in his service to our country.

In closing, I want to remind you that 40 Days for Life recently began its fall campaign. During the campaign, they schedule, as best can be done, around-the-clock praying in front of abortion clinics. I ask that every council participate in this campaign. In other pro-life news, 10 years ago the Knights of Columbus set out to place 1,000 ultrasound machines in prolife pregnancy centers around the country. The supreme Knight recently announced that the Order has surpassed the goals of the program. Arizona Knights have raised funds to place several ultrasounds in pregnancy centers around the state. I am proud to announce that in the last three weeks Supreme has approved two new ultrasound machines that will be donated to the Carenet Pregnancy Center in Sierra Vista and the Choices Pregnancy Center in Tempe. I am very thankful for the hard work of our State Ultrasound Chairman Joe Kramer and State Program Director Larry Powers in making this happen. There is still much work to be done, though, to create more victories for life. This initiative, funded by local councils with matching grants from the Supreme Council's Culture of Life Fund, cannot continue without the generous contributions from people like you. 





Prayer for Vocations

Canonization of Blessed John Henry Newman – October 13, 2019

Pope Francis Wednesday approved the canonization of Bl. John Henry Newman, a Roman Catholic cardinal, scholar, and founder of the Oratory of St. Philip Neri in England.

Following a Feb. 12 meeting with Cardinal Angelo Becciu, the head of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, the pope signed off on a second miracle attributed to the intercession of Newman, who was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in Birmingham, England on Sept. 19, 2010.


The first miracle attributed to Newman's intercession involved the complete and inexplicable healing of a deacon from a disabling spinal condition. His second miracle concerned the healing of a pregnant American woman. The woman prayed for the intercession of Cardinal Newman at the time of a life-threatening diagnosis, and her doctors have been unable to explain how or why she was able to suddenly recover.

Bl. John Henry Newman was a 19th century theologian, poet, Catholic priest and cardinal. Originally an Anglican priest, he converted to Catholicism in 1845 and his writings are considered among some of the most important Church-writings in recent centuries.

Ordained a Catholic priest in 1847, he was made a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879, although he was not a bishop. Newman was also particularly dedicated to education and founded two schools for boys.









State Chaplain – Fr. Gary Regula

Dear Brother Knights,

On August 14, 2019, the German Bishops' Conference held a Mass at the site of the Auschwitz concentration camp honoring the legacy of St. Maximilian Kolbe and marking the 80th anniversary of the German invasion of Poland (September 1, 1939). The life story of this saint is an inspiration to all, and I would invite you to please look it up and spend a little time getting to know this man who offered his life so another may live.

For this little note instead of focusing on the history of this saint of the Church, I would rather focus on some things that Archbishop Ludwig Schick of Bamberg, Bavaria shared during his homily. He stated that through Kolbe's life and writings that God, "gives to all people, races and nations equal dignity and equal rights. He is the fatherly God of all."

Such a belief that Kolbe "would not recognize Hitler as an all-powerful leader and instead proclaimed that God is the master and ruler of all people, races and all nations" made Kolbe a "thorn in the eye of the Nazis." Shouldn't we all, as Knights, be a thorn in the eye of anyone that does not respect the equal dignity in everyone as a child of God.

There is so much hatred in our world today and as Knights, we are called to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to life in our families, our councils, our assemblies and everywhere we are called to go. Sadly, sometimes even in those groups I mentioned our Brother Knights do not show a respect for the dignity of others and their words and actions add to the hatred, mistrust and even prejudice against others.

As we journey towards this year's rosary celebrations may we ask Our Blessed Mother (St. Maximilian had a deep devotion for Mary) for her intercession so that all we say and do may bring about the unity that Christ prayed we may have the night before he died for us. May we ask for the grace of God to let go of any thoughts, words or actions that judge, demean or hurt our sisters and brothers. Archbishop Schick concluded as he shared that Kolbe's bravery showed his deep belief in the sovereignty of God and the brotherhood of all peoples. This message is extremely relevant today because when people do not love God present in our sister or brother we can see, they have forgotten or in reality they are denying God. Let us not merely say Vivat Jesus, but let Jesus, his message of love and his calling all his sisters and brothers be the cry we say every moment of our lives.

Class Honoree – Formation and Knighthood Degrees Sunday, September 14, 2019 - Phoenix Father Gary Regula, State Chaplain, Pastor at St. Jerome's Catholic Church

Father Gary Regula was born on August 29, 1964 in Chicago and was raised on the Southwest side. While growing up he attended a neighborhood parish and church and was inspired by his parents who were active to help out as well. He thought that priests were funny, filled with joy and were a good inspiration to him.

Father Gary attended school at one of the diocesan high school seminaries; however, after graduation he didn't think that God was calling him to the priesthood.

For 8 years he worked as a machinist, earning the rank of Journeyman Machinist. He then applied to the Archdiocese of Chicago and went to earn his degree at Loyola University of Chicago. Later he attended the University of St. Mary of the Lake for 3 years and before the last year he stepped away again because he felt that there were others that were more holy and prayerful that God would call and needed to serve as priests.


He served for two years as a lead counselor at Boys Hope Girls Hope after which he applied to the Diocese of Phoenix. After studying at St. Meinrad Seminary for one year he came back and served as a deacon at San Francisco de Asis Parish. He was then ordained and served in Flagstaff as an associate pastor until he was called to serve Santa Teresita in El Mirage as Pastor. He then was assigned to be the pastor at St. Benedict Parish. In 2013 Father Gary was appointed pastor at St. Jerome.

Father Gary became a Knight of Columbus on December 4, 1991. He is a Fourth Degree Knight. He was appointed Arizona State Chaplain in June of this year.

Father Gary has two siblings, a sister and brother. His mother died in 1987 while his father passed away in 2015. Father Gary has lived in Arizona for more than 20 years but still cherishes his upbringing in Chicago and still call it home.

Cadet John Delaney Winger, US Military Academy Class of 2022, recently underwent the honors of the Second Degree of our Order at an exemplification at West Point. JD is a member of Council 10762 at St Pius X Catholic Community in Tucson, AZ.

JD joined the Order at the age of eighteen, prior to reporting to the Academy. Since then, he has been active with the Knights at West Point although he remains a member of Council 10762.

JD is in his second year at West Point. He is studying Chemical Engineering and has his sights set on becoming an Artillery or Aviation officer upon graduation. JD is the son of Kathy and Jack Winger of Tucson. Jack has been a member of the Order for over 25 years and is a Fourth Degree Knight. JD is an Eagle Scout and was Captain of his High School Football team.

The United States Military Academy is located at West Point, New York approximately 50 miles north of New York City on the Hudson River. Established in 1802 by President Thomas Jefferson, the Academy is a four-year college which prepares Cadets to become Army Officers. After graduation, Cadets are commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the US Army. The Academy has a long and distinguished list of graduates to include Ulysses S. Grant, Dwight D Eisenhower, Douglas MacArthur, George Patton, Buzz Aldrin, Norman Schwarzkopf, and Alexander Haig. In order to receive an appointment to West Point, candidates must receive a nomination from an elected US Official, must be accepted into the Academy based on their academic performance, and must meet the medical and physical fitness standards of the US Army. Approximately 1200 candidates receive appointments out of 50,000 applications in a given year.


Jack and Kathy Winger

Msgr. O'Keefe Council #8250 was founded 7 November 1982 through the efforts of West Point Cadets & Officers. Our council is named after Msgr. Cornelius George O'Keefe. He was a priest in the Archdiocese of New York and pastor of Most Holy Trinity Parish. During his time as Pastor the current Catholic Chapel was built in 1900. Msgr. O'Keefe died on 23 May 1918, and is buried in the West Point Cemetery.

The West Point Knights Council works closely with the Catholic Chapel of the Most Holy Trinity Parish at the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY, providing manpower for various projects and the members are active participants in their parish.



State Membership Director – Bobby Nielsen


My Brother Knights,

Gary Regula, our State Chaplain. We also had a good number of members attending. It is vital that we show support for our candidates by attending these ceremonials.

As Knights we pride ourselves on our support of our priests and bishops. One of the most effective ways to do this is to be able to explain and defend our faith when challenged with questions from non-Catholics and even other Catholics. Not everyone who questions us on our faith is being confrontational. Many are just truly curious and want to increase their knowledge of what it is to be a Catholic. We should be ready to explain what we believe as part of our role to join in the evangelization effort of the Church. When we joined the Knights of Columbus we received a booklet called "These Men They Call Knights". At our recent Degree in Phoenix our State Deputy, Mario Vassallo, reminded us that this booklet is a very handy source of many basic tenets of our faith and should be reviewed periodically to maintain our knowledge and restoring our confidence in our ability to correctly respond to questions from others including our own children. Another excellent source of information is the access on the Supreme website to the Catechism of the Catholic Church and other faith-based information sources. Let's resolve to take the time to be informed.

Turning to our Ceremonials, our Degrees are lessons that teach us about the Knights of Columbus principles and are meant to be completed through the Fourth degree. To stop, for example, after the Admission (First) Degree is to learn only 25% of what the Knights are all about. We must encourage all our members to experience all the lessons after the Admission Degree: Formation, Knighthood and Patriotic Degrees. Yes, a member needs to complete at least through the Knighthood Degree to be able to hold Council Offices, but the more important reason is to learn what is expected of a Knight of Columbus so that he can live up to its principles.

Attending degrees in your Council or District is important for two reasons. First, it refreshes your knowledge of our principles and second, it shows our sincere commitment to all new members and encourages them to follow our example. It also makes it easier to answer questions from prospective members and so increase our effectiveness in recruiting. Look at the State website for the full schedule of all four degrees and make a commitment to attend those that are in your area.

Finally, the quality of our degree programs depends on maintaining a strong degree team cadre for all four degrees. Councils need Admission Degree teams that have depth and quality. This is the first formal look a new candidate gets of what it means to be Knight of Columbus. Ask your Grand Knight how you can help and get involved. If your Council doesn't have a team, ask your District Deputy if he has other Councils who need team members. If you would like to join the Formation Degree Team, ask your District Deputy to help you get in contact with one of those Teams. If you like, you can call me directly (info below) and I will help you. You will find a great level of camaraderie and sense of accomplishment as a team member while you help teach the lessons of the Order to our members. This can be your contribution to recruiting and retention.





Brother Knights,

Operation Restoring Veteran Hope Retreat

Worthy State Deputy, State Officers, District Master, District Deputies, GKs and FNs,

The Patriotic Degree of the Knights of Columbus in conjunction with St. Josephs Youth Camp and Operation Restoring Veteran Hope, will be hosting a free event for our Veterans at St Joseph's Youth Camp on October 4th, 5th, and 6th 2019. St. Joseph's Youth Camp is located by Mormon Lake just south of Flagstaff. Flyer will be available soon.

The Operation Restoring Veteran Hope Retreat will enable veterans that have struggled or are currently struggling, to focus on their well-being, as well as connect with other veterans. Last year a group of 73 veterans rode with a 16-motorcycle escort Sept. 14, embarking on Operation Restoring Veteran Hope, a new retreat designed to provide veterans with an opportunity for healing and a chance to share their stories. Veterans of Vietnam, Desert Storm, Afghanistan and Iraq, ranging in age from 29 to 72, attended.

This year we are hoping to have 120-150 veterans and 15 support staff personnel who will provide counselling sessions as well various activities.

Last year we raised a little over \$14,000 and the average cost per veteran was \$195.00. With the expansion of the program to include up to 40 plus veterans we are anticipating our cost to be approximately \$20,000.

At the start of every fraternal year, it has become a long-standing custom in Arizona that the State Deputy introduces a new State Pin and logo design. During the recent organizational meeting, State Deputy Tom Kalisz told the attendees, "This year's pin design is meant to be a visual, daily reminder, of what we stand for and the depth of our commitment to serve God, our parishes, and our neighbors."

Around the outer edge of the pin and logo design we find the guiding principles of the Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. They remind us of who we are as Knights of Columbus and what we do.

Within the circle, an image of the State of Arizona is found at the center, emblazoned with the Emblem of the Order. This represents the Arizona State Council and its jurisdictional responsibility for all of the State of Arizona.

This year, the Worthy State Deputy has dedicated his administration to Our Lady of Guadalupe. The image of Mary on the cloak is known as *Our Lady of Guadalupe* for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.

Mary's visit to Guadalupe is a reminder that God will remember his mercy for all people. In Mary's song of joy, the Magnificat, she praised God because he has put down the mighty, exalted the lowly, filled the hungry, and sent the rich away empty. People honor **Our Lady of Guadalupe** because they recognize her motherly concern for them.

Working under our theme of *"Knights Serving God, Serving The Community, This Is Who We Are, This Is What We Do",* the cross is included so that we are reminded that we are all children of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The cross also symbolizes the gift we received through the death of Jesus Christ – forgiveness of sin and a path to everlasting life.

Finally, included in the lower right portion of the logo are two small baby's feet. These are included to remind us that we must always fight to preserve the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death.

The Worthy State Deputy says that he hopes that the pin and logo will keep us focused on unity and fraternity as we perform works of charity in service to all.
