Greetings, Brothers All!

It's hard to believe that we are already a month into the new fraternal year! I have a few reminders for you:

- You will receive your First Half State Per Capita Mid-August. It will be emailed to the Financial Secretary of record with Supreme and to the Grand Knight. If you are the former holder of these roles, and receive the email, please forward it to your successor. State Per capita is how the State Council's work is funded. Please pay this bill promptly. You get a rebate credit if you pay the bill within a month of the billing date. The assessment is \$5.50 per billable member per half. Inactive members are \$2.25 per half. Honorary Life and Disabled members are not charged. Disabled members must be defined through Form 1831 with Supreme. Billing is based on Council Membership as of July 1. Thank you!
- One of the delays we have is with the billing is waiting for the State Directory to be filled out. If you have not done so, you can fill out here:

- Per Capita payments do not require a council vote.
- If you have not done so, make sure you deposit your council Per Diem check from the State Convention. Checks older than 6 months will be voided.
- Also, please make sure you have given your Charity Raffle Checks to your chosen Charities. Encourage them to deposit them as soon as possible and remind them that checks older than 6 months will be voided. Each year a few checks are never cashed. Let's make sure our Charities get the funds they deserve.

We're all looking forward to a successful fraternal year and are eager to get to work. I'm sure we're excited to show Arizona that our Faith can truly Transform our Culture.

Brothers,

Knights of Columbus Supreme Council requires every Council to be in compliance with their Save Environment Program. The first step in this process is the completion of Forms 185 and 365. Has your council completed the required these forms?

Typically, when I ask this question of a Grand Knight the answer is "yes". Unfortunately, Supreme records don't always agree. Councils that have not submitted a Form 185 (Officers Chosen for Current Fraternal Year) are 1189, 3395, 3510, 5313, 5542, 6858, 7114, 9995, 11858, 12078, 15376, 16061, 17370, 17491, 17493, 17502, 17715 and 17855.

Council that has not submitted a Form 365 (Program Personal Form) are 1189, 1882, 2493, 3121, 3395, 3510, 4260, 5195, 5313, 5542, 6933, 7114, 7904, 8091, 8813, 8854, 9467, 9482, 9678, 9995, 11858, 12313, 13272, 13719, 13836, 13895, 14139, 14357, 16061, 16856, 17005, 17370, 17491, 17493, 17715, 17855 and 18065.

If your Council number is listed above and you believe your council has submitted the required forms, you call 203 752-4210 and ask what the problem is. Your District Deputy is also available to assist.

If you have not submitted the forms what needs to be done?

Officers Chosen Form 185

- The Financial Secretary should use Officer Online –
 Member Management Council Administration Council
 Officers
- Every position on this form does not need to be filled.
- A GK is required, other than that send in what you have and send in an update when additional positions are filled.







Service Program Personnel Form 365

- The Financial Secretary should use Officer Online –
 Member Management Council Administration Service
 Program Personnel
- Every position on this form does not need to be filled.
- The Grand Knight,
 Program, Community, and Family Directors are required to do online training.
- Community and Family Directors must also do background.
- The Grand Knight may fill one of the other three positions if necessary

Safe Environment Compliance

- Training should be completed no later than September 1, 2024.
- O Supreme Safe Environment Training **and** Diocese Safe Environment Training are separate trainings. Also, all 3 dioceses have different trainings. Completing one does not fulfill any of the requirements for another.
- O Council Knights in key leadership roles are required to complete Supreme Safe Environment Training through Praesidium Academy. This includes GK, FN, Program, Family, and Community Directors.
- The Supreme Safe Environment Training is initiated when Forms 185 and 365 are submitted to Supreme. The GK, Program, Community, and Family Directors will receive an email with instructions on how to complete the Praesidium Academy training.
- O You will receive an email from donotreply@praesidiuminc.com. Please check your Spam/Junk folders if you have not received after filling out the Form 365.







- Once the instruction email is sent, the link will expire if not completed in 45 days. If that happens a new 365 needs to be sent to start the process over again.
- Any knight that may have contact on **diocese** property with children or vulnerable adults must complete **diocese** training.
- O Do *not* assign a man to a position that requires training that he is not willing to complete. The GK should have this conversation before sending the 185 or 365.
- Contact Worthy State Advocate Bobby Nielsen if you are having issues with a man reluctant to complete training.

There <u>Is</u> a Cure For The Summertime Blues: Hold A Church Membership Drive!!!!

Brothers,

The summer months in many parts of Arizona can be brutally hot. I've heard of many councils "closing up shop" during the summer months and resuming activities in late September/early October when the weather becomes more agreeable. Unfortunately, by that time, 25% of the Fraternal Year has gone by and councils now have to scramble over the remaining 9 months to reach Membership, Program, and Insurance goals to qualify for Star Council Awards. But it doesn't have to be like that!!!

Here are some tips to help councils "Beat the Heat" and run successful Church Membership Drives during the summer, getting you off to a fast start in reaching your goals:

- 1) Advertise Your Upcoming Drive in the Bulletin. Let men know you are going to be there, even in the heat, to bring men closer to God.
- 2) Hand out bottles of water to parishioners as they enter Church before Mass.
- 3) Arrange to have a room inside the Church/School/Campus where interested men can talk to our recruiters out of the sun and the heat.
- 4) Have Knights stationed at all exit doors, handing out more water as parishioners leave, as well as guiding/taking interested men and their wives to the team of "Closers" indoors.
- 5) Follow Up with all Prospects/Candidates and hold a C-U-F Ceremony that week.

Remember, you never know when the Holy Spirit will inspire a man to join the Order. God does not take summers off. Why should we??

The State Team is here to assist you and your councils in any way possible in inviting new members this year. We have developed some exciting incentives as our way of saying "Thank You" for all you do to grow the Order in Arizona

Church Membership Drive Playbook

2-3 Weeks Prior

- Post dates of church drive on state calendar
- Run ads in church bulletin every week
- Organize teams of 6-8 brother knights for each mass
- Invite the Field Agent to help out
- Ask pastor/priests to promote the knights and encourage men to join

Day Of Event

- Greet parishioners before each mass
- Hand out K of C info to men and prayers cards to the ladies & children
- With Pastor's permission, give a 2-3 minute pulpit speech (note: have your best speaker do it, not always the GK)
- Conclude pulpit announcement by reciting prayer on prayer card handed out (members distribute more during speech)
- Cover all exits after mass. Greet everyone but identify men that might be interested
- Funnel prospects to the "closers" on your team. Have agent code and team membership numbers available.
- Assist candidates with completing on-line membership <u>and</u> have candidate confirm while standing there
- Congratulate and welcome your new brother knight (and his family) with a smile and firm handshake!!

The Following Sunday

- Host A C-U-F Degree Ceremony immediately after the last mass of the day
- Have The Ceremony in the church, of possible
- ➤ Host a luncheon/desserts & coffee/social event immediately after ceremony ends. This will give you a chance to meet and learn about the new member and allow him to meet and greet his new brother knights!
- Ask new brothers to introduce themselves and their families before eating
- Have FinSec hand out membership cards before new members depart

We are finding that by following this playbook (with modifications unique to each council), we are having more success at not only getting members to join, but also getting them engaged early, providing the council with an influx of active members looking for programs to participate in.

Faith Transforms Culture - The Design

The baby feet are white to signify the pure innocence lost with every abortion that occurs. We will continue to support Life from Conception to Natural Death.
