State Deputy's Message

Brothers Knights,

On September 29, 2019, I had the honor to lead a delegation from the Arizona State Council to Yuma to receive the Silver Rose from a group of Knights from California. Our delegation included: Worthy State Membership Director Bobby Nielsen; Worthy District Deputy #18 Larry Lickfelt; Worthy State Silver Rose Chairman Robert Julien, and myself. At St. John Neumann Catholic Church in Yuma, we met Worthy California State Silver Rose Chairman Jeff Fong, Worthy Past San Diego Chapter President Frank Contreras and Worthy District Deputy Gary Hayes from El Centro, California.

Since the day the Silver Rose arrived in Arizona it has made several stops at various councils and parishes around Arizona. Since the first days of the initiative, the Rose of the Knights of Columbus has become a shining beacon of hope within the pro-life efforts of the Knights. The largest gatherings during the Silver Rose's trek through Arizona was at Tucson and Phoenix for the Arizona Rosary Celebration. In Tucson, the rose was viewed and venerated by about 1,500 attendees to the event at St. Augustine's Cathedral. The following day nearly 6,000 Catholics venerated the rose at the Phoenix Convention Center. It is always a wonderful moment when the Silver Rose comes to Arizona on its way from Canada to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico. Brother Knights,

We just finished our celebration of October and with it a month dedicated to Respect Life. In many parishes we probably heard or even prayed for 'the respect of life from conception until natural death.' We need to ask ourselves if we really mean that. We as Knights are proponents of supporting causes that respect life, and our actions speak to that; however, at times our words and actions can also speak against that as well.

When we say natural death do we realize that term means that we are against capital punishment? Do we realize that Pope Francis has changed the catechism of the church to state that as Catholics we do not support the taking of any human life? Do we remember that earlier this year the Attorney General of the United States directed the federal government to reinstate the death penalty? Have we spoken out against this as Knights? If not, will we start doing something about it?

The key word in the paraphrased prayer I shared in the opening paragraph is not conception and it is not natural death, but it is the word UNTIL. War, poverty, gang violence, hunger, immigration, climate change (the list could go on and on) all work against a respect for life. We need to step up as Knights to respect life each and every month in all its forms from conception UNTIL natural death. If we only focus on one particular issue then are we really living up to our mission as Knights of Columbus? Even more importantly are we living up to our call to be Catholic, seeing the presence of God in every life?

I know we have done good things, but there is still much for us to do in the struggle to create a culture of life. Do we advocate or accept (whether publically or privately) any issue that brings about death to any part of God's beloved creation? We need to seriously reflect on who we are as Knights, but more importantly as Disciples of Christ. I will never know what your heart feels on some of the issues I put forth, and neither will the Worthy State Deputy, or even your own Grand Knight, but we can never hide the true intentions of our hearts from God. Thus, let us step up and truly be Knights who support, nurture, care for, and respect all life that God has given as a gift to this world in whatever stage of life it is in. Vivat Jesus.



DECEMBER 29, 2019- Feast of the Holy Family

Each council is required to participate in a Consecration to the Holy Family in order to qualify for the Columbian Award. Sunday December 29, 2018 is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph and is a perfect day for such a Consecration. To help families live out the joy of Christ, Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori has composed a prayer through which families will come together to consecrate themselves under the protection of the Holy Family. In



Preparing for the Consecration to the Holy Family

Four suggested steps before Praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.

Each member of your family is strongly encouraged to go to the Sacrament of Confession.

As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. As our physical bodies are drawn to things of the world, it is strongly encouraged that you fast from something that you would normally do or consume. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.

Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. You have chosen a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through His Church.

this prayer, we ask for the aid or intercession of the perfect son Jesus Christ, Mary the perfect mother, and Joseph who is a model for every father. Councils will guide their parishes and community to understand and offer this important and impactful prayer. Preparing for the Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. It is choosing a way of life for your family. Through this consecration, each participant is consciously choosing to be a beacon of God's love through his Church.

Action Steps

Working with your pastor, obtain his permission and recommendations on conducting a Consecration to the Holy Family in your parish.

Order a good quantity of Consecration to the Holy Family Prayer Cards (#10371) through Supplies Online, the supply ordering portal available on Officers Online.

Set a date for the consecration and announce it to your parish a month before the official day.

Distribute Consecration to the Holy Family Prayer Cards (#10371) at Masses the week before the consecration. Also place a good supply of prayer cards in your church and council hall.

Although the formal consecration will occur at all Masses on a chosen Sunday, serious and mindful preparation for at least a week prior is a major aspect of this program. To ensure that all members of your parish are fully participating and readying themselves for the consecration, your council should consider:

Asking your pastor to make an announcement at all Sunday Masses the week before the consecration. Ask him to explain what a consecration is, why it is being undertaken, and how to properly prepare.

Encouraging each family to intentionally fast from something ahead of the consecration. This fast should last at least a week leading up to the consecration. It is strongly encouraged to fast from something that would normally be consumed or an activity that is regularly done. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts and moves us to be more focused on God.

Strongly encouraging each member of all parish families to go to confession before the consecration.

Hosting an event in the middle of the week prior to the Sunday consecration. One idea for this event is to invite a guest speaker to discuss the importance of consecrating oneself to the Holy Family, the model of the Holy Family, the meaning and impact of consecrations, or related themes. Be sure to set aside time at your event for prayer in community. Consider praying the rosary together and be sure to recite the consecration prayer together in preparation.

Build public interest! Promote the Consecration to the Holy Family in your parish and larger community through a variety of efforts:

- 1) Prominently display promotional posters (which can be ordered through Supplies Online)
- 2) Bulletin announcements
- 3) Pulpit announcements
- 4) Posting on your council and parish website / social media pages

On the chosen day, distribute Consecration to the Holy Family Prayer Cards (#10371) once again. Under the direction of your pastor, recite the Consecration to the Holy Family Prayer together as a parish family at all Sunday Masses. If he is willing, ask your pastor to also incorporate themes relating to the consecration and the Holy Family in his homily.

Following the consecration, host an event in the parish or council hall for all parish families to celebrate the consecration together! Have family-friendly games ready for everyone to enjoy. Remind all present that this consecration holds lasting impacts. Although the time of preparation has ended and the consecration has occurred, devotion to the Holy Family continues, and we should always strive to resemble their ideal model of a loving family.

At the celebration event, be sure to wear Knights of Columbus-branded apparel and have the council membership director set up a table with brochures and membership documents (including Prospect Cards #921A). Do not forget that this event is a recruiting opportunity!

Enlist a fellow Knight or community member to photograph the event.

Following the consecration and celebration, update the community on the success of your program by distributing an announcement to local media, along with energizing photographs from the event.

To gain credit for your program, complete the associated reporting forms and submit them to the Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Mission. Remember to retain copies for your council records.

On October 26th St. Thomas More Council #6442 in Lake Havasu City hosted the monthly Formation and Knighthood Degrees for a class of 10 lay candidates and 1 priest, Fr. Julius Kundi. Your Degree Team did a superb job teaching the lessons of the Second and Third Degrees as evidenced by the reaction of the candidates during the exemplification and their very positive feedback after the ceremony. District Deputy Jerry Czarnowski made the original arrangements and Grand Knight Bob Ketner gave candidates and the Degree Team a very warm welcome. Our honoree was the very successful Former District Deputy of the area, Wes Hawkins.

Let me share a few thoughts about bringing the Degrees to Councils outside the major metropolitan areas of Phoenix and Tucson. As you may know, the Degree Teams are funded (travel and paraphernalia costs) through the registration fees that are submitted by each candidate when he registers for the exemplification. Normally the smaller number of candidates at the outlying Councils does not cover the cost of travel to those sites. The cost is made up by the larger number of candidates we get at in the metropolitan Council venues coupled with lower travel costs. So why do we still travel to the smaller Councils knowing that the costs will exceed the revenue at that degree? The answer is that all Councils are important, and we need to provide support to every corner of the State. You will notice the strong presence of the State Officers at every Formation and Knighthood Degree, regardless of where it is being performed, to see their commitment to all our brothers across Arizona. As for the Degree Teams, having travelled extensively with them for many years, I can personally attest to their dedication, skill and love of the work that they do in bringing the lessons of the Order to new candidates. They put in many hours of practice and travel many miles but the experience of seeing the candidates receive and accept the lessons that are taught is a thrilling and satisfying reward.

Brothers,

As we bring the decade (that's right, I said DECADE) to a close I would ask that you all reflect on your role in the Order and how you might continue to bring her forward into the "Roaring 20's". My perspective is a bit different than that of a brother who is not on the Agency side of things. The reason is simple, as everything I do, all of my days work, goes into ensuring that our brother Knights and their families are aware of the protections that we provide to them and to their families. I know that many of our brothers don't understand what that means, because why would they, having never been in the shoes of us agents? First let me tell you, that the men and women in the Agency work like you can't believe to keep the promise of Fr. McGivney alive. You see, we don't just show up to a 9 to 5 job. We work long hours, and often every day of the week to protect those that we've been entrusted – you!

"Those that we've been entrusted." That's an interesting thing to say isn't it? Yet, it's what we live by and it's our credo. We have made a deal with Fr. McGivney to protect his family, he in turn, promises us, that his family will think of us when they are in the market to do business, for Life, Long Term Care, Retirement (401k, IRA, SEP's, Roth's – either new or rollovers) and also, for our Disability Insurance. We have to take a leap of faith that the time we spend with an elderly couple, who is not in the market to buy anything new, but just needs a hand with any multitude of things, is time well spent. Take a moment to recall a young family that lost the breadwinner too soon— was this not the soul intent of our Order to protect those of our faith? This, brothers, is how we can change our parishes for the better. All too often you hear of families who've lost their retirement, or who've been incapacitated in a nursing home leaving them in financial duress. In order for a fraternal benefit event to count, it must:

- Be organized by the council.
- Be promoted by the council both to the membership and the broader parish community (be sure there is Parish wide advertising and invitation...not just a council event).
- Draw a crowd consisting of at least 10 members who are age eligible to purchase our insurance products. Age eligible is defined by attendees (members or otherwise) that are under 80. Preferably, our insurance products are geared to 75 and below. We should always consider families that have young children as great prospects for insurance as well as membership into the Order.
- Have a Field Agent or the General Agent as the main presenter.
- Be reported to the Supreme Council by the General Agent Nate Raso.

ICSAVE TRAINING SEPTEMBER 28TH 2019

On Saturday, September 28th 2019 Knights of Columbus Eusebio Francisco Kino Council #14583 in Rio Rico Arizona hosted "Active Killer/Shooter" and "Stop the Bleed" training performed by the organization known as: ICSAVE. The training focused on effective techniques and attitudes that increase your survivability during an active killer event. This training recognizes that techniques taught in the past have proven to not be effective and even dangerous in these new tactics used by killers in the past two decades. Also taught was "Stop the Bleed" as most active killer events produce critically injured victims. If persons at the scene can apply these simple first aide steps, the number of victims that will survive is greatly increased.

Class started at 8AM with "Stop the Blead" and ran for two hours. The lesson consisted of a Power-Point showing techniques and desired equipment. It also stated statistics such as most victims with serious wounds and with profuse bleeding will bleed to death within 3 minutes. Since most rescue units take at least 5 minutes to get to the scene and it takes statistically a minimum of 10 minutes to get to the injured person, it is vital that persons at the scene can perform these procedures to save a life.

Next, the instructors conducted a three-hour lecture on the latest techniques and strategies to survive the attack of an active killer/shooter. These latest procedures have been developed after thorough investigation of such incidents over the last two decades showed that conventional wisdom was actually increasing the death and injury toll. After the lecture, the students were put through five live scenarios utilizing the techniques just taught.

The instructors have very impressive resumes in the area of law enforcement and emergency medical response. They are very enthusiastic and very much want to come to your community and conduct this training. Their contact information follows:

At the start of every fraternal year, it has become a long-standing custom in Arizona that the State Deputy introduces a new State Pin and logo design. During the organizational meeting last June, the Worthy State Deputy told the attendees, "This year's pin design is meant to be a visual, daily reminder, of what we stand for and the depth of our commitment to serve God, our parishes, and our neighbors."

Around the outer edge of the pin and logo design we find the guiding principles of the Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. They remind us of who we are as Knights of Columbus and what we do.

Within the circle, an image of the State of Arizona is found at the center, emblazoned with the Emblem of the Order. This represents the Arizona State Council and its jurisdictional responsibility for all of the State of Arizona.

This year, the Worthy State Deputy has dedicated his administration to Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The image of Mary on the cloak is known as *Our Lady of Guadalupe* for an interesting reason. On that same day, Mary appeared to Juan's uncle and cured him, giving him a message for the bishop, saying that she would "crush the serpent's head." The bishop did not understand the Indians' language. The Indian word for "crush the serpent" sounded to him like "Guadalupe," the name of Mary's shrine in Spain. Thinking that the Virgin wanted the new shrine to have the same name, the bishop called her *Our Lady of Guadalupe*.

Mary's visit to Guadalupe is a reminder that God will remember his mercy for all people. In Mary's song of joy, the Magnificat, she praised God because he has put down the mighty, exalted the lowly, filled the hungry, and sent the rich away empty. People honor *Our Lady of Guadalupe* because they recognize her motherly concern for them.

Working under our theme of "Knights Serving God, Serving The Community, This Is Who We Are, This Is What We Do", the cross is included so that we are reminded that we are all children of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The cross also symbolizes the gift we received through the death of Jesus Christ – forgiveness of sin and a path to everlasting life.

Finally, included in the lower right portion of the logo are two small baby's feet. These are included to remind us that we must always fight to preserve the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death.

The Worthy State Deputy says that he hopes that the pin and logo will keep us focused on unity and fraternity as we perform works of charity in service to all.
