This week my wife and I took a drive up to Phoenix for lunch. Actually, we ferried a suit up to my son who needed it for an interview this week and sitting down to lunch with him was a bonus. During the course of conversation, he mentioned that he recently saw "Twelve Angry Men". For those of us that have seen it, visions of Henry Fonda and Jack Klugman together on screen quickly come to mind.

But have you ever thought about how we came to settle on twelve jurors? One theory is the number twelve was settled upon Henry II who took the number from the practice of having twelve men to investigate crimes and then determine if they agree with the innocence of the accused. Another belief is that twelve jurors was decided by a Welsh King in 725 A.D. who linked it to the twelve apostles.

Including the references to the disciples, the bible mentions the number twelve, onehundred and eighty-seven times. There were the twelve tribes of Israel. Ishmael, first born of Abraham had twelve sons as did Jacob. New Jerusalem has twelve gates and is 12,000 furlongs per side. There are twelve names in the bible that have only two letters, and Jesus' first words, as documented in the scriptures, occurred when he was twelve-years old.

For the Weber Assembly the number twelve is also significant. It is the number of people needed for a quorum. Without twelve people in attendance the Assembly cannot conduct Assembly business. Items such as electing officers, paying bills, voting on which charities to support and how to give all gets pushed to the next meeting.
