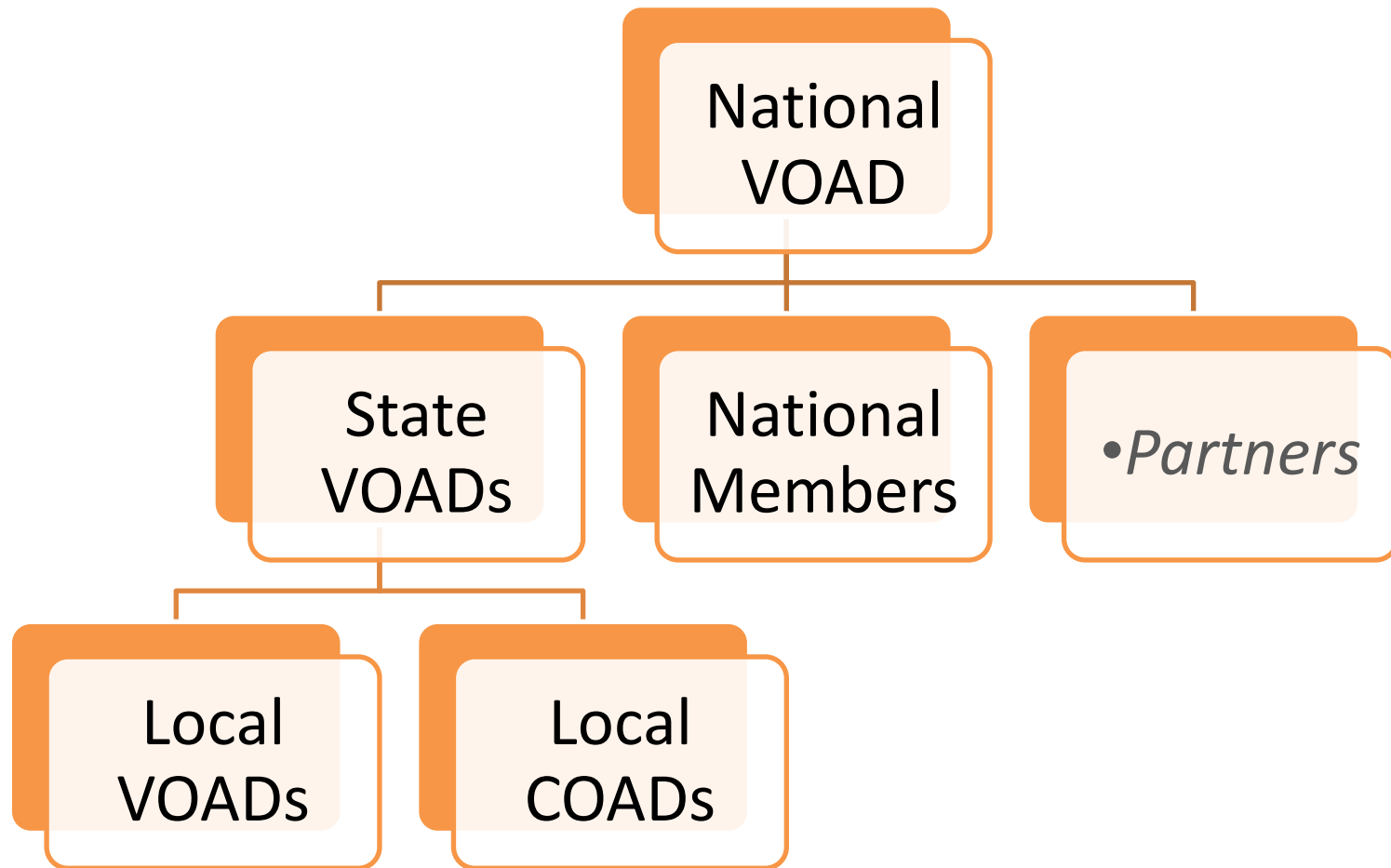
Membership Requirements:
