Happy New Year Brothers!

January is a time for a new beginning. I would like to suggest we see how we can support other ministries that are happening in our Church. The Christmas season has been celebrated and believe it or not, in less than 2 month we will be entering the season of Lent. Here are ways we can assist two ministries that most parishes support. The first is the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA/RCIA); The second the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SVdP). Many are you are familiar with these two ministries, what follows is a brief summary of how they work and some suggestions on how Knights can support them

The stages of the OCIA

Inquiry: the initial period before a man or women decide to enter the Catholic Church. They are asking questions and checking it out but aren't yet ready to commit. Knights and their wives can make themselves available to answer questions, invite them to attend Mass with them.

Catechumenate: those who decide to enter the Church and are being trained for a life in Christ are called catechumens, an ancient name from the early Church. In this stage, they are developing their faith and are being "catechized"—learning catechism, or the basic points about Catholic faith and life. Knights can pray for them specifically anytime they are together, provide prayer materials, invite the male catechumens to attend a Cor dialog.

Purification and preparation: The Church will help the catechumens to focus and intensify their faith as they prepare them to commit their life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter. The RCIA process has a beautiful series of Gospel-based meditations during Lent, which is the time frame of this period. This might be a good time for the Knights to give them a bible and/or a rosary

Initiation is the culmination of the whole process. The catechumens are received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where they receive the sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. The council could take the lead on providing a reception afterwards.







Mystagogy: after reception into the Church at Easter, this period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully. The knights can continue to provide support and materials for our new Brothers and Sisters.

Make sure you talk to your Pastor, and get his permission before you directly involve you council in the OCIA.

SVdP (St. Vincent DePaul)

SVdP volunteers are know as Vincentians. They meet with clients we call friends. There biggest missions is to do what they can to prevent homelessness and to assist the homeless. Cost of living increases and inflation are pushing many families over the brink. In 2023 alone, 653,000 Americans experienced homeless. Families that live paycheck to paycheck can be push into homelessness by a major car repair, accident, or illness. Knights can assist certainly by volunteering as a Vincentian. However, often they can help by providing assistance to the friends identified by SVdP. Perhaps helping a friend to move to a new apartment in town. If a Knight has mechanical skills, they may be able to make a repair to a vehicle that is unaffordable otherwise. Maybe they can help a friend by minor repairs to a home, leaking faucets or bathroom fixtures.

Church Membership Drive Playbook

2-3 Weeks Prior

- > Post dates of church drive on state calendar
- Run ads in church bulletin every week
- Organize teams of 6-8 brother knights for each mass
- Invite the Field Agent to help out
- Ask pastor/priests to promote the knights and encourage men to join

Day Of Event

- Greet parishioners before each mass
- > Hand out K of C info to men and prayers cards to the ladies & children

➢ With Pastor's permission, give a 2-3 minute pulpit speech (note: have your best speaker do it, not always the GK)

Conclude pulpit announcement by reciting prayer on prayer card handed out (members distribute more during speech)

Cover all exits after mass. Greet everyone but identify men that might be interested

➢ Funnel prospects to the "closers" on your team. Have agent code and team membership numbers available.

Assist candidates with completing on-line membership <u>and</u> have candidate confirm while standing there

Congratulate and welcome your new brother knight (and his family) with a smile and firm handshake!!

The Following Sunday

- > Host A C-U-F Degree Ceremony immediately after the last mass of the day
- Have The Ceremony in the church, of possible

Host a luncheon/desserts & coffee/social event immediately after ceremony ends. This will give you a chance to meet and learn about the new member and allow him to meet and greet his new brother knights!

- > Ask new brothers to introduce themselves and their families before eating
- > Have FinSec hand out membership cards before new members depart

We are finding that by following this playbook (with modifications unique to each council), we are having more success at not only getting members to join, but also getting them engaged early, providing the council with an influx of active members looking for programs to participate in.

One of the top Exemplification Teams in the entire order will present the degree ceremony.

The Class Honoree will be Father John Francis Friel (deceased). Fr Friel was a highly decorated Naval Chaplain, serving in Vietnam as a young priest, Senior Chaplain at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Senior Chaplain at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey and then onto Yuma MCAS to serve as Chaplain for the Marines in Arizona, retiring with the rank of Captain in 1999.

The agenda for this degree is check-in from 11:00 AM to 12:30 PM with a start time of 1:00 PM. Following the ceremony please plan to attend the 4:00 PM parish mass at St. John Neumann Catholic Church. After the Exemplification, there will be an opportunity to reenact the Knighting Ceremony with family members for photos. All Present Sir Knights with a uniform are invited to participate in a Callout Honor Guard. This will be followed by a dinner in the parish social hall. If priests and deacons in attendance want to participate in the Liturgy of the Mass, this requires advance approval by sending a request to the District Master. These requests will then be forward to the Pastor for approval to concelebrate. Faith Transforms Culture – The Design

The Eucharist is the center of the state. We need to keep Christ at the center of everything we do.

The word "Transforms" extends out from the Eucharist and wraps around the state. This transformation happens internally in each one of us so that we can transform those we encounter.

The rays coming from the Eucharist are symbolic of the colors of the State of Arizona.

- The Gold is the color of Jesus' Divinity. He is True God.
- The Red is the color of Jesus' blood: He is truly Human.

Blue is the color of Mary. We need to ask for Mary's intercession to her Son by praying the Rosary often.



The baby feet are white to signify the pure innocence lost with every abortion that occurs. We will continue to support Life from Conception to Natural Death.



The Complete Knight Flywheel

From a mechanical side, the flywheel is a very heavy wheel that is used to generate and transfer energy to other parts of a machine. Once it starts spinning, it's hard to stop.

God is the center of all that he does, his family comes second, and self third

Each knight has to do each of the activities to keep that flywheel going: Recruitment, Engagement, Motivation, Evangelization, and Retention. The areas of focus for each of those activities are around Membership, Programs, Cor, and Insurance.
