

Knights of Columbus Founders Day is celebrated on March 29 every year. The day is celebrated by the members of the Catholic order known as the Knights of Columbus and individuals and organizations that support or are supported by the Knights. Celebrated across the U.S., the Knights of Columbus Founders Day commemorates when the founder of the organization, Michael J. McGivney, received the charter for the organization. The State of Connecticut granted Father McGivney the charter for his new organization that consisted of him and a small group of laymen, all of whom were Catholic. The organization was founded in New Haven and today is one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world. The organization began as a mutual benefit society for Catholic immigrants in the State of Connecticut that offered financial services and other financial support to its members. Over time, the organization expanded its services into soldiers' welfare during World War I, then into occupational and educational services. The order dedicates itself to the principles that it calls Degrees. These Degrees are patriotism, charity, unity, and fraternity. Among these, charity is considered the most important, and the Knights focus on offering aid to the communities in which they are established. The majority of the charitable work undertaken by the Knights of Columbus includes refugee aid and aid in cases of natural disasters. The Knights also financially support the Catholic church's causes.

"In the present circumstances, it is quite necessary, in the area of lay activity, the united and organized form of the apostolate be strengthened. In fact, only the pooling of resources is capable of fully achieving all the aims of the modern apostolate and firmly protecting its interests. Here it is important that the apostolate encompass even the common attitudes and social conditions of those for whom it is designed. Otherwise, those engaged in the apostolate are often unable to bear up under pressure of public opinion or of social institutions" (Vatican II, Decree *Apostolicam Actuositatem*, November 18, 1965, no. 18). This kind of apostolate has been carried out since the 19th century by the Knights of Columbus, whose founder was Blessed Michael McGivney.

Michael McGivney was beatified on October 31, 2020. The example and the works of this new Blessed are a challenge for us all to evangelize the world, the need for which was recalled by the Second Vatican Council: "Modern conditions demand" an "apostolate of the laity" that "becomes more imperative in view of the fact that many areas of human life have become increasingly autonomous," which "sometimes involves a degree of departure from the ethical and religious order and a serious danger to Christian life," it underscored. "There are innumerable opportunities open to the laity for the exercise of their apostolate of evangelization and sanctification. The very testimony of their Christian life and good works done in a supernatural spirit have the power to draw men to belief and to God... However, an apostolate of this kind does not consist only in the witness of one's way of life; a true apostle looks for opportunities to announce Christ by words addressed either to non-believers with a view to leading them to faith, or to the faithful with a view of instructing, strengthening, and encouraging them to a more fervent life. "For the charity of Christ impels us' (2 Cor. 5:14)." The Lord Himself "renews His invitation to all the laity to come closer to Him every day, recognizing that what is His is also their own... He sends them into every town and place... so that they may show that they are co-workers in the various forms and modes of the apostolate of the Church, which must be constantly adapted to the new needs of our times. Ever productive as they should be in the work of the Lord, they know that their labor in Him is not in vain" (Apostolicam Actuositatem, nos. 1,6 and 33).

Let us ask Blessed Michael McGivney to guide us in the service of the Lord and of our brothers.



The Arizona Knights of Columbus announced a renewed vigor for defending life at this year's organization meeting.

In honor of the Supreme Court's overturning of Roe vs. Wade and the Knights of Columbus' firm stand for the protection and support of all life from conception to natural death, State Deputy Luigi Baratta announced the creation of a new pin which represents Knights kneeling in prayer. The knight's sword represents the rosary, his shield represents Knights in unity, the baby's feet on the shield represents life, and the white background represents the innocents which Knights will always defend.

"Last year, our state theme was Defender of the Faith," he explained. "This year it is Protector of Life. As Catholics, we must remain steadfast and do all we can to protect life from conception through natural death. We need to encourage men to join us to step into the breach, pray vigilantly, and assist our efforts to help serve our parishes and communities across the great state of Arizona."

In addition to their continued fundraising efforts to help purchase ultrasound machines, the Knights of Columbus have launched a new initiative called the Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP). This new initiative significantly enhances the Knights' support for mothers and children and is "a call to action for Knights across the United States and Canada to increase financial support to pregnancy resource centers, maternity homes and other organizations which give direct assistance to new mothers and/or babies."
